# **Campus/Surrounding Area**

- Located in Irvine, California
- Public university
- Right next to the city of Newport Beach
- 1475 acres
- Known as the school with never-ending construction
- Centered around Aldrich park
- Park is filled with trees and has a lush feel of nature
- Park is a commonplace to study, hang out, engage in physical activities such as sports, etc.
- Undergraduate schools are found closer to the park
- Graduate/professional schools are found further outward
- The park is surrounded by Ring Road, a stoned pavement that creates segments for each school
- Each school has its own designated spot on Ring Road
- Buildings further away are connected through 4 bridges
- "North Campus" = The Facilities Management Department, Faculty Research Facility,
  Fleet Services, and the Air Pollution Health Effects Laboratory
- "Southern Campus" = University Research Park (office and research area for various amount of companies)
- There are 5 libraries on campus
  - Jack Langson Library
  - Science Library
  - Grunigen Medical Library
  - Libraries Gateway Study Center
  - UCI Law Library
- Campus provides a food center, study spots, and theaters
- 10 different labs across campus that serve as places to study as well
- Most labs are fairly close to Aldrich Park
- The Irvine Barclay Theater is used for many kinds of performances in the arts

- Cross-Cultural Center a place where events regarding the understanding and acceptance of different cultures are held
- Bren Events Center a place where most of UCI's sports occur
- Crawford Athletics Complex a place where UCI athletes can train, includes a baseball park, track and field area, and swimming pool
- Anteater Recreation Center a place used for campus recreation events
- California Institute for Telecommunications and Information Technology a place that uses nanotechnology and other sciences to create solutions to problems
- Administrative buildings are located furthest away from the central park
- Most housing is located in the opposite direction of administrative buildings
- Other housing is scattered around campus
- Many students bike/walk to school from dorms and surrounding areas with apartments
- Past Irvine Barclay Theater there is a pedestrian bridge that connects across the road to a shopping center known as University Town Center
  - Mini target
  - In-n-Out
  - Chick-fil-a
  - o Blaze Pizza
  - Yogurtland
  - And other various restaurants/shops
- Anteater Express allows students to travel around campus via shuttle
- Holiday Shuttle allows all students and staff free passage to John Wayne Airport and Irvine
  Train Station during holiday breaks
- Not considered a party school, intense focus on academics
- Surrounded by a suburban area
- Emergency evacuation areas located all over campus
- Campus provides examples of sustainability through bottle filling stations, LEED-certified buildings, solar panels, electric vehicle charging stations, and community gardens

#### **Academics**

- Offers over 85 majors
- 16 different schools/programs
  - Claire Trevor School of Arts
    - 4 departments: art, dance, drama, and music
    - Studios, theaters, technologically advanced classrooms, and art galleries are found on campus
  - School of Biological Sciences
    - First-year consists of ecology, cellular, molecular and evolutionary biology
    - Second-year consists of genetics, biochemistry, and molecular biology
    - third/fourth years consists of an advanced biology course of the student's choice
  - The Paul Merage School of Business
    - Several types of business degrees are offered including Business
      Administration, Business Information Management, and Business Analytics
  - School of Education
    - Several types of educational degrees are offered including Education
      Sciences, Ph.D. in Education, and Masters in Teaching
  - The Henry Samueli School of Engineering
    - 6 departments: biomedical engineering, chemical/biomolecular engineering, civil/environmental engineering, electrical engineering, mechanical/aerospace engineering, materials science, and engineering
    - All first-year engineering majors experience a similar type of coursework
  - School of Humanities
    - Over a dozen language programs
    - Programs in creative writing, journalism, global cultures, religious studies, and academic English
  - Donald Bren School of Information and Computer Sciences
    - Programs for computer science, engineering, mathematics, and social sciences
    - 3 departments: Computer Science, Informatics, and Statistics

- Interdisciplinary Studies
  - Allows students to participate in different studies
- School of Law
  - Offers degrees such as the Juris Doctor degree and Master of Law degree
- School of Medicine
  - One of the top medical research schools in the nation
  - Degrees in biomedical/translational science, genetic counseling, medical science, and medicine
- Sue and Bill Gross School of Nursing
  - Degrees in nursing practice and doctor of nursing practice
  - Ph.D. program also available
- Department of Pharmaceutical Services
  - Degrees offered for careers involved in biomedical research, pharmacy,
    medicine, and other health-related jobs
- School of Physical Sciences
  - Departments in chemistry, earth system science, mathematics, physics, and astronomy
- Program in Public Health
  - Different degrees offered such as Public Health, Global Health, Epidemiology, Biostatistics, Sociocultural Diversity & Health, and Environmental Health
- School of Social Ecology
  - 3 departments: Criminology/Law & Science, Urban Planning & Public Policy, Psychological Science
- School of Social Sciences
  - Work to understand and change in society, the economy, and humans in general
- Student to Faculty Ratio: 18:1
- Graduation Rate: 84%
- Academic Calendars divided into quarters
- Studying abroad programs available

- Classes can range from small numbers of 10-20 to large numbers of 100+
- Biology, Managerial Economics, and Social Psychology are the top 3 most popular majors
- 41% of faculty female, 59% male

#### **Dorms**

- 11 student housing areas located on the campus
- Freshmen typically dorm in Mesa Court or Middle Earth
- After Freshman year, students can live in Arroyo Vista, Mesa Court, Middle Earth, Vista del Campo, Camino de Sol, Vista de Campo Norte, Puerta del Sol, and Plaza Verde
- Mesa Court
  - o 29 halls
  - 55-90 beds in each hall
  - Same-sex suites, 6 rooms in a suite
  - 3 mixed-gender towers
  - No a/c available
  - Single, double, and triple occupancy rooms available
  - Filled with plants and other nature
- Middle Earth
  - o 24 halls
  - 48-96 beds in each hall
  - 5 to 10 rooms per suite
  - Gender-inclusive bathrooms available
  - o 2 mixed-gender towers
- Arroyo Vista
  - o 42 houses
  - 8-16 occupants per house
  - No a/c
- ACC Apartments
  - Eastside of campus
  - Furnished apartments w/ air conditioning

- Single & double rooms
- Palo Verde
  - Single, double, and triple bedrooms
  - Studios available as well
  - Houses mainly graduate students
- Verano Place
  - Single, double, and triple bedrooms
  - Studios available as well
  - Houses mainly graduate students
- Campus Village
  - 2 students per apartment
  - No a/c
  - Patio or balcony

#### Food

- 7 day meal plan + \$50 FlexDine
  - Quarterly
  - o \$2032.68
  - Can eat at Anteatery and Brandywine an unlimited amount of times
- 135 meals + \$250 FlexDine
  - Rolls over until the end of the year
  - o \$1724.97
  - About 5 meals a week
- 85 meals + \$350 FlexDine
  - o \$1278.87
  - Rolls over until the end of the year
  - About 2 meals a week
- 35 meals + \$325 FlexDine
  - o \$780.10
  - Rolls over until the end of the year
  - About two meals a week

- \$450 FlexDine
  - Same value as cash at all dining locations
- \$300 FlexDine
  - Same value as cash at all dining locations
- Freshman required to buy a meal plan
- Mesa Commons eating place is set buffet-style
- Pippin Commons is also buffet-style
- Do not have to be a resident of that residential area to go to their dining hall

    - Honors in anthropology, Chicano/Latino Studies, economics, international studies, political science, psychology, social science, sociology
