Housing at Brandeis University:

- Charles River Apartments:
 - Located at 150 Charles River Road (Coffman)
 - Has a shuttle between the main campus to Charles River
 - A large common area that includes a TV, gaming tables, and a kitchen area
 - Accommodates 7-110 students per hall
 - Undergraduate students
 - Parking available
 - Has its own laundry room in the building
 - Two, three, or five-bedroom apartments that have kitchen and bathroom facilities
 - Has an area coordinator with an advanced degree with Foster mods
 - Four residence halls: Morton May, 110 Angleside Road Max and Ann Coffman,
 150 Charles River Road, Ollie A. Cohen, 164 Charles River Road and George E.
 Lewis, 178 Charles River Road

• East Quad:

- Located: in the quiet part of the upper campus
- Houses mainly sophomores
- Contains both single and mixed dorms
- Walking there is Gosman Sports Center and Health Center along with the Intercultural Center
- Has 13 community advisors
- Has laundry machines, open lounges on each floor, a lounge with a TV, a cardio room, and a community kitchen.
- Has four residency halls: Hassenfeld-Krivof, Shapiro House,
 Pomerantz-Rubenstein, and Swig.

• Foster Mods:

- Location: South Street
- Mainly upper-class students independent living
- Split into two areas known as Upper mods and Lower mods that have 18 units each
- Houses around 180 students

- Full-time staff members as an area coordinator
- Walking distance to Gosman sports center, covered biking rack, laundry rooms,
 and student parking lot
- All mods have a kitchen, dining room, living room, and one or two bathrooms
- All mods are single occupancy

Massell Quad:

- Houses first years
- It has the Beit Midrash Jewish study and prayer room.
- Has 17 Community Advisors (CAs) that help students with their living.
- Has both single-gender and mixed-gender halls
- Four residence halls: Shapiro, Usen, Deroy, and Renfield.
- Near Anne J. Kane Reflecting Pool and the Albert Yakus Meditation Area,
- The lounge includes couches, a large-screen television, a foosball table, a ping pong table, and an open 24 hours.

North Ouad:

- Same-sex and mixed-gender floors.
- 13 Community Advisors
- The lounge includes couches, a large-screen television, a foosball table, a ping pong table, and an open 24 hours.
- Near Usdan Student Center, home to Brandeis Hospitality, Hillel, a convenience store, the campus mailroom, the Chaplaincy, Academic Services, Hiatt Career Center, and the Department of Community Living.

• Ridgewood:

- Houses 180 students yearly
- Apartment-style living for juniors and seniors
- Three Community Advisors
- Mainly 4-person apartments that can go up to 6 people
- Each apartment includes a private bathroom, kitchen, and common area. Kitchens have a stove, oven, dishwasher, full-sized refrigerator, and microwave.
- The common area has a kitchen, air- conditioning, TV, and a hardwired audio-visual system.

• Rosenthal Quad:

- Houses 160 sophomores
- Suites house 8 students, each that two groups select
- Consists of three buildings: Rosenthal North, South, and East.
- In the middle of the campus and near the Shapiro Campus Center, Sherman Dining Hall, Massell, the science complex, Goldfarb/Farber Library, the chapels, and the Hassenfeld Conference Center
- Three Community Advisors
- Has laundry facilities and a small cardio room.

• Skyline:

- Houses around 164 students
- Four Community Advisors
- A mix of single and double rooms that is gender neutral
- Has four levels
- Campus common space, study space, a kitchen area, and a full A/V system with a projector and sound.
- Has an outdoor yard/ quad


• Village:

- Houses 220 students
- Single and double occupancy rooms that are gender neutral
- Consists of three houses: A, B, and C.
- Sophomores live in Village A. In the fall, juniors planning to study abroad live in B and C then midterm students take over the space
- Eight Community Advisor
- Has Laundry facilities, a 24-hour cardio gym, and a Village Living room

• Ziv Quad:

- Location: Southern Ridge of campus

- Houses mainly juniors and seniors
- Four Community Advisors
- Four buildings: 127, 128, 129 (Mazer Hall), and 130.
- Six-person suites.
- Each suite consists of an air-conditioned suite with six single bedrooms, a spacious common area, and two private bathrooms.
- Includes central air conditioning, laundry facilities in each building, and a central elevator.
