-must complete a minimum of 18 units of college preparatory coursework

4=English, 3=Mathematics, 2=physical or natural science, 2=social science, 2=in the same foreign language, 5=additional college preparatory courses

#### ● Requirements

-completed application (fee=\$65)

-official high school transcript

-essay

-senior high school courses

-at least one letter of recommendation

### ● ***Transfer Students***

-General Requirements:

~has 24 transferable credits or less=must earn a minimum 2.8 GPA

~has more than 24 transferable credits=must earn a minimum 2.5 GPA

~if was previously for admission=must earn 24 transferable credits with a minimum 2.5 GPA

-with an associate's or bachelor's degree=must earn a minimum 2.4 GPA and it doesn't require a submission of an official high school transcript

### ● ***International Students***

-Application Process

1.)Complete the Common Application (fee=\$65)

2.)Present and turn in documents and completion certifications from national attended secondary school

a.) Official/Original documents=go to the Office of Undergraduate Admission at the time of enrollment

b.) Copies/Scans=conveniently accepted

3.)Submit official translations of the documents, the following languages are not to be accepted for translations:French, Spanish, Portuguese, Italian, Polish, German, Russian, Czech, Slovak, Slovenian, Croatian, Swedish, Norwegian, and Danish

4.)Submit official scores from TOEFL/IELTS/Duolingo=should be directly sent to URI by the testing agency

a.)If one has attended a secondary or post-secondary school where English is the language of instruction, they might be exempted by submitting an English proficiency test score which also may include SAT/ACT scores (if submitted).

5.)Send a request that all official university-level academic records will be sent to NACES certified organization for evaluation/grade equivalency

a.)request for a course-by-course evaluation

b.)request the agency to calculate a cumulative GPA

c.)Ask agency to send all potential and accredited transcripts to URI

6.)Submit at least one letter of recommendation

7.)If one experienced a “gap year”, elaborate on the circumstances during that period.
