Five Great MetroABQ Coffee Stops...

I find myself in all quadrants of the city, at all times of the day. I'm not a huge coffee drinker, really on the lookout for spots with good small-portion baked/savory goods and varieties of food and drink. A mid-morning shack, or late afternoon pick-me-up, the MetroABQ always has what we need, hopefully where we need it.

1. Zendo Coffee/Art, Downtown just west of the tracks (413 2nd St SW), is probably the hippest coffee stop this side of Paris. The late Gertrude Zachary's iconic Downtown Parisian Mansion (bottom right) sits across the street from Zendo. both of which are a few blocks north of The Barelas Railyards. To the right is the coffee board. The amazing Aztec Latte. with dark chocolate and cayenne pepper, left a great spicy taste for hours. Zendo is always busy & they are in no hurry to crank out the drinks, which is probably why it tasted so good.



2. La Quiche French Bistro, tucked discreetly in the middle of the Mountain Run Shopping Center (5850 Eubank Blvd NE #17, 87111) in the far NE Heights, is perfect for afternoon snack; a small spinach quiche and baguette hit the spot!

3. Humble Coffee (4200 Lomas Blvd NE), on the northern edge of Nob Hill (bottom right. As



it's near my new Re/Max Select office, I have stopped by a few times now to try different things. The mocha is creamy & their breakfast burritos are very tasty & varied-it's a small place; however with tons of patio seating during warmer weather. Great to stop by as you go from Uptown to Downtown.



4. Cafe Bella Coffee Drive Through

(9121 Eagle Ranch Road NW) is a tough-shed-sized stand alone building on the Westside near the Cottonwood Mall, on the southwest corner of Paseo del Norte & Eagle Ranch Road. It's all about the caffeine there, with a small selection of morning pastries until they are gone. My Chai was super-duper sweet along with the last danish; as a quick fix on your way to someplace else, it is in a nicely convenient location.

5. Duggan's Coffee Shop at 2227 Lead Ave SE, just east of University in the UNM area, is in the most interesting strip mall in the city: there's the very busy Pinata shop Casa de Pinata, a Karate Dojo, a Barber shop, the Rio Grande chapter of the Sierra Club, a beauty salon and a corner laundromat. All this, next to



Duggan's Coffee shop. They have a good comfort food menu and the atmsphere is trendy, image above, which fits in well with the other unique denizens in that strip. Great when you're near UNM. To the left is the sumptuous desert/pastry counter at La Quiche French Bistro.

Surprises come from above, too. This Drone image to the right captured the east half mile around the Mauger Mansion B&B (red brick building in the bottom foreground), which provides a great Upper Downtown view facing mostly east toward Tijeras Canyon; a view few of us get to experience.

The MetroABQ is amazing! The more you explore, the more you understand the city's discreet nuances: artwork in unexpected places, a surprise coffee house that serves Aztec Mocha, or a unique neighborhood with architecture you've never experienced.





Using the Mauger Mansion B&B again as an example, the Virtual Tour allows you to walk up the stairwell to view the parlour below (above), tour the large guest room with the 100year old oval windows & brick fireplace, or step onto the 2nd floor balcony to see how many of your friends can join you after your purchase. Another new tool I love is the Matterport 3-D Virtual Tour. It's an immersive experience: you are able to view a room 360 degrees, walk up and down stairs, turn corners, etc. It's as close to being there as you can get; it gives you the feel for the size of rooms, and puts things like furniture in context--you'll know if the credenza fits before you see the home in person.


It's been a wonderfully busy year:
