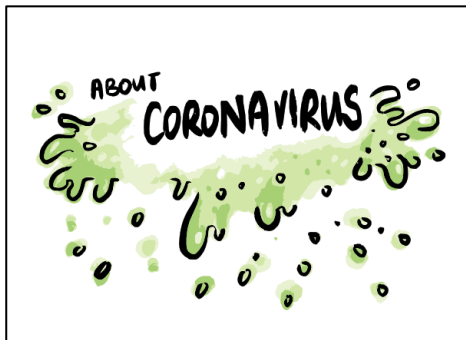

IN THE FACE OF COVID

Ever since the 2019-nCoV outbreak in People's Republic of China in December 2019, Marcap has been monitoring the situation closely as cases of infection started in neighbouring Asian countries.

As the WHO declared this outbreak as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern, Marcap started implementing measures in place.

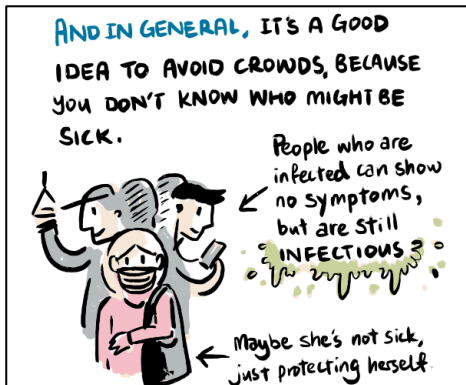
The priority was to educate onshore and offshore personnel and quell any unwanted panic by disseminating facts and prevent rumours and false information from spreading.



Circulated information includes:

1. What the virus is about
2. What are the symptoms
3. How the virus can spread
4. When is there a need to undergo testing.

Further information was disseminated on prevention of the spread of such germs.



Considering the welfare of employees, Marcap's fitness program continued but individual exercise mats were acquired for each employee attending the thrice weekly session in the gym.

However, with the increasing number of infections in the GCC countries, further measures were implemented for prevention.

Safe distancing was encouraged, where:

1. Masks were disseminated to every employee.



2. Group lunch or gathering in pantry area is prohibited.
3. Glass doors on office floor to remain closed.
4. All line managers are encouraged to conduct meetings online or via telephone and avoid conducting meetings inside or outside Marcap premises.
5. Suppliers are requested to submit invoices online only as paper invoices will not be accepted on reception desk.
6. No one should be allowed inside the offices without prior appointments and this should only be allowed in case of extremely urgent matters and should be approved by the directors beforehand.
7. In case of urgent meetings, an empty chair always has to be kept between any two persons for a distance of at least 1 meter maintained between them.



8. Temperature checks for every personnel and anyone with 37.4° and above are required to go home. Should the temperature persist, he or she must seek medical attention



The company then started with:

1. Fumigation of the office precinct every Saturday.



2. Fumigation of the guest house where on-signing / off-signing crew resides.



3. Fumigation of some vessels calling port.



4. Provision of disinfectant and sanitizers to every personnel and department.



The company has also activated "Work From Home", with the initial 50% shore staff working in office and thereafter trimming to 30%.

This was made possible as Marcap started data migration to cloud system since 2018. Such policies enabled all data to be stored online for ease of access regardless of location and timing.

With 70% of the personnel working from home, meetings within departments and divisions were hosted online as a workplace chat and video meeting system was integrated since 2019. Hence this pandemic acts as a litmus test for the company's readiness for business continuity.



Not forgetting the company's mantra "*Mens sana in corpore sano*" (a healthy mind in a healthy body), the fitspiration program continued in momentum as the fitness aficionados came together religiously using the same remote video meeting platform.



Words of encouragement were also relayed from the crew of several vessels, emphasising on "Stay home, Stay safe".



Even though this pandemic may have brought challenges and uncertainties to many, Marcap choose to believe this episode serves as a test of our resolve, showcasing our strength and weaknesses, and prepares the company for the future ahead!

MARCAP WELCOMES MARCAP AIDA AND MARCAP NISREEN

On the 23rd February 2020, Marcap welcomed two Fast Speed Crew Boats (FSCB) “Marcap Aida” and “Marcap Nisreen” to our fleet.

The sister vessels were loaded onto a breakbulk vessel in Singapore and departed for UAE on 12th February 2020.



“Marcap Aida” and “Marcap Nisreen” are part of Marcap’s fleet revamp program incorporated since 2018, initially with the DP2 PSV “Marcap Supporter”, followed by LCT “Marcap Mars”.

With “Marcap Supporter” enhancing our offshore supply services, and the “Marcap Mars” further strengthening our reputation in project logistics, these new crewboats will further enlarge Marcap’s service offering by providing passenger and cargo transportation in the offshore oil and gas sector.

In addition, both crewboats will be flying Marcap’s flag in a new geographic area as they work for our new client, as they were awarded long term charters.



Built in Singapore, “Marcap Aida” and “Marcap Nisreen” are powered by 03 Cummins engines for total of 4,050BHP, thereby able to achieve cruising speed of approx. 23 knots and maximum speed of approx. 25 knots.



Equipped with comfortable seats, each crewboat can ferry 70 passengers at any time. With 80m² deck area, they are conveniently able to transport smaller cargoes to offshore platforms and rigs within a shorter period.

On the 11th March 2020, Marcap welcomed Anchor Handling Towing Vessel (AHT) “Marcap Shine” to our fleet.

Along with “Marcap Danny” (4000BHP, 46TBP) and “Marcap 202” (4500bhp, 60TBP), Marcap will now have 3 AHT in the 4000BHP class serving our esteemed clients in the offshore oil and gas sector.



We are pleased to share that “Marcap Shine” will be serving out a long-term charter in the UAE.



Built in China, “Marcap Shine” is powered by 02 MAK engines for total of 4,200BHP, providing bollard pull in excess of 40T. Equipped with double winch for 140T Brake and 75T Pull, and deck equipment from Brattvaag, the “Marcap Shine” spells quality.

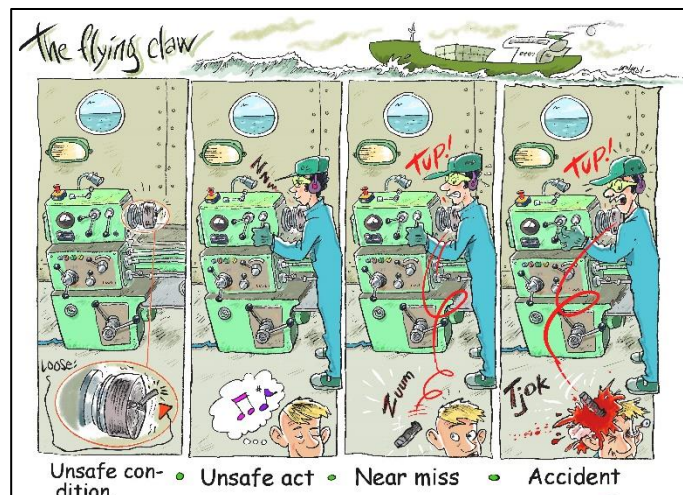


For this occasion, VIPs were invited for a tour of the sister vessels, as Mr. Samer showed the guests around.

COFFEE WITH CEO

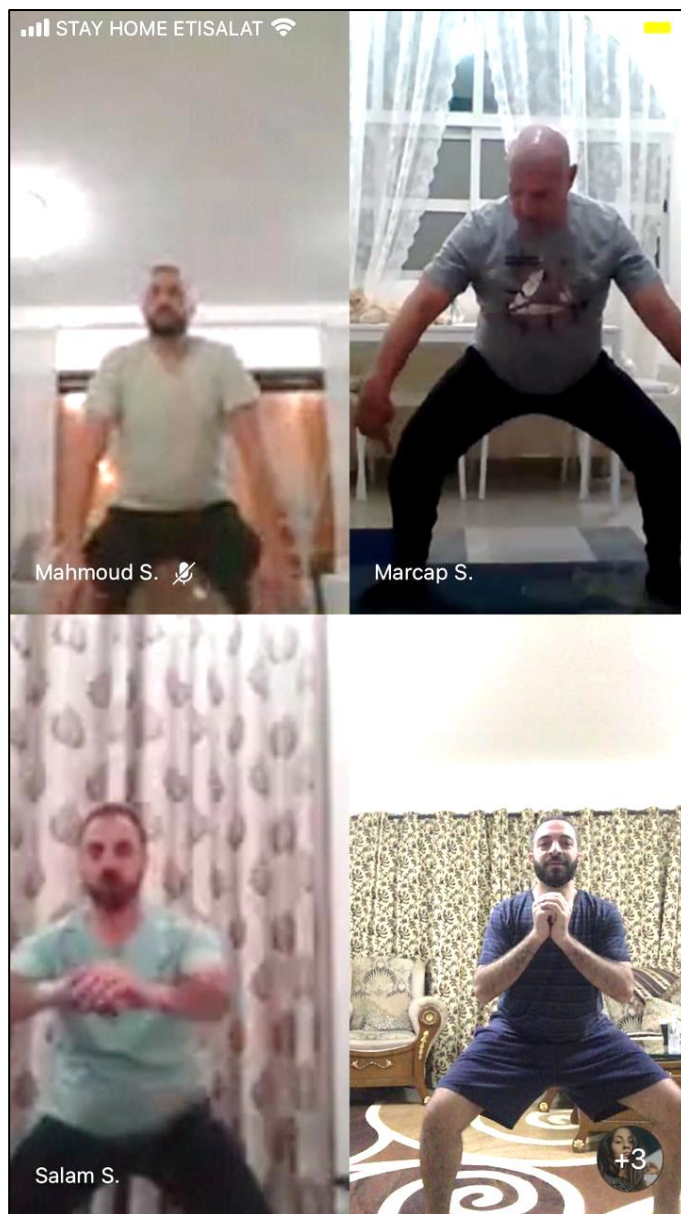

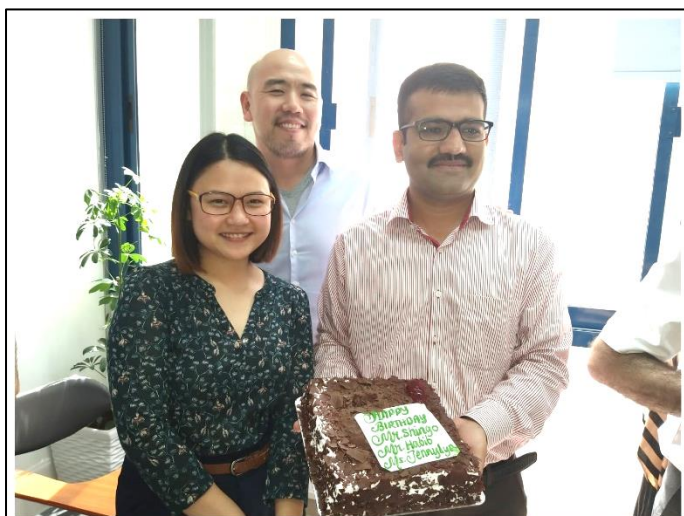
