Population grew by 3,238 over the last 5 years and is projected to grow by 5,987 over the next 5 years. 134,710

Jobs grew by 68 over the last 5 years and are projected to grow by 6,864 over the next 5 years.

Regional average earnings per job are **\$26.1K below** the national average earnings of \$79.8K per job.

Takeaways

- As of 2022 the region's population increased by 1.1% since 2017, growing by 3,238. Population is expected to increase by 2.0% between 2022 and 2027, adding 5,987.
- From 2017 to 2022, jobs increased by 0.1% in 7 counties from 134,642 to 134,710. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 2.4% by 2.3%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate decreased from 60.7% to 60.2% between 2017 and 2022.
- Concerning educational attainment, **15.3% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (5.4% below the national average), and **8.2% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.7% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2022 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Restaurants and Other Eating Places, and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.




Sep 2022 Labor Force Breakdown






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity







Job Trends



Labor Force Participation Rate Trends










Retiring Soon




Racial Diversity














Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Location Quotient






Top Industry GRP








Top Occupation Earnings









Educational Pipeline

In 2021, there were 5,152 graduates in 7 counties. This pipeline has grown by 1% over the last 5 years. The highest share of these graduates come from "General Studies" (Associate's), "Truck and Bus Driver/Commercial Vehicle Operator and Instructor" (Certificate), and "Business/Commerce, General" (Bachelor's).
