#### For both Regents or Advanced Regents Diplomas

• <u>Honors</u>- Earn a computed average of 90 or above on all Regents required for diploma type.

#### For only Advanced Regents Diploma

- Mastery in Mathematics-Score an 85 or higher on 3 math regents\*
- Mastery in Science-Score an 85 or higher on 3 science regents\*

## College Search

- January of junior year is generally a good time to start thinking about future plans.
- 4-year college is not the only option post-high school! Make sure to explore your choices and make an informed decision.
- Prior to visiting colleges, think about what you would like to major in and explore colleges that offer classes relevant to your future. Unsure? Entering undecided is always an option.
- Visit and tour colleges you are interested in if possible. Don't wait till senior spring to tour. Start early.
- Write your personal statement and create a college list summer before senior year.
- Be familiar with app deadlines and different types of admission.
- Connect with admissions officers and utilize other resources provided.
- Be proactive!

## SAT/PSAT/ACT

- PSAT
- October Junior Year.
- Scholarships.
- Use the same email on the test and for your College Board account.
- SAT/ACT
- Requirements depend on desired school.
- Practice.
- Be familiar with the format of the test and time limits.
