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Pre-Kindergarten Screening Information for Parents

When will my pre-kindergarten child/children be screened?

Prekindergarten entrants should be screened prior to the beginning of the school year, and prior to formal acceptance into Seton Catholic's Pre-K Program.

What shall be included in the screening of my pre-kindergarten child/children?

Screening of prekindergarten entrants shall include, but is not limited to:

- evidence of health examination
- certificate of immunization
- vision, hearing and dental screenings
- cognitive development, motor development and language and literacy skills
- a determination of the child's home language

How are the screening results to be used?

The results of the screening will be reviewed and a written report of each student screened shall be prepared by appropriately qualified school district staff. These reports will include a description of the screening devices used, the student's performance on those devices and, if required, the appropriate referral. Parents will then be informed as to whether it is an appropriate time to enter into Seton Catholic's Pre-K program.
