Instructions and Sample: Copyright Page

If you decide to include a copyright notice in your thesis, it should be placed on a separate Copyright Page. According to the seminary's Format Guidelines, the Copyright Page should follow the title page of your thesis. In other words, Turabian's instructions for the *order* of these pages should not be followed, but for the *format* of the Copyright Page, Turabian, 9<sup>th</sup> ed., 388–389, should be followed. This notice legally establishes your copyright.

Leave a 1-1/2" left-hand margin.

Include the copyright notice near the top margin of the page, flush left. The Copyright Page should follow the title page.

Assign a page number to the Copyright Page, but do not display it.
