Walk for Rice 2019

What a better way to do good for the community than to do good with your loved ones? This year, BCS collaborated with Bethel Assembly of God and organized a family walk in conjunction with our yearly Walk-For-Rice event, in which 73 passionate volunteers participated for a good cause. This event was held in collaboration with the South East Community Development Council (SECDC).

Walk-For-Rice, as the name suggests, results in rice being raised when participants walk or even run! For every 200m completed by a person, it gets a family a bowl of white rice and a bowl of brown rice. This year, a new incentive was added - at the 400m mark, one will earn a pack of oats for a family. Walk-For-Rice seeks to strengthen the social infrastructure through encouraging community participation and forging stronger relationships with one another, while promoting active citizenry and nurturing volunteerism.

The families gathered together at Punggol Park for the walk. At the end of the event, many felt that it was a fruitful time, doing something for the community while bonding with one another.

"Wah, Papa (Daddy) actually wake up so early with all of us to come here and walk for rice leh!" - A volunteer to her family who attended the programme.

It is truly amazing and heart-warming to witness how the concept of doing something for others motivates others to join in. Amongst the participants, our little loved ones were also found- the students from our centres also

For more than three years, my colleagues and I, together with members of Bethel Assembly of God, have been walking around Aljunied Crescent and visiting the residents. During our walks, we pray that God will make us a blessing to the people we meet. Arising from the walk, we have had many opportunities to bless, care and share with several needy families.

Let me share one of the services we started last year. A couple of my colleagues felt the need to provide free haircut for the elderly who are living alone. They started a free haircut service every last Friday of the month with free breakfast provided. Since then, they have been cutting the hair of 70 to 80 elderly people every month. In November last year, they decided to celebrate the birthdays of these elderly folk with a bowl of mee sua soup, two hard boiled eggs and a small

At the first birthday celebration, Mr Lee a resident from Paya Lebar Way was so surprised when the team sang "Happy Birthday" to him. He asked one of my colleagues, "Why do you do this? No one has celebrated my birthday for a long time!" Since that day, the team has brought so much joy and surprises to these elderly ones every month.

Why are we here in MacPherson? We believe God places us here to bless, care and share - so that together we make MacPherson a lovely home for everyone! God bless.

From the ED's desk

In my current role at Bethel Community Services (BCS), I have grown more aware that God has placed us in this community for a purpose, which is to meet the many needs presented here. Through God's grace, as a social service provider, we hope to meet the needs and to support the needy people in our community. In our iCan magazine, I will occasionally share how we are meeting specific needs. In this issue, I would like to share how we are helping Mr X (not his real name). Mr X was referred to us by Pastor Chia, the Senior Pastor of Bethel AG, in 2018. He had come across Mr X on one of his walks in the community and felt that we could provide him some help. Following this, our case coordinator, Ms Natasha Cho, visited Mr X. She found out that Mr X was suffering from schizophrenia and depression, which required permanent medication. Both his parents had passed away, leaving Mr X with his other siblings. Mr X was staying with his siblings in a flat in the community but was chased out of the flat subsequently.

Mr X has a chequered history; he was incarcerated for drug-related and fighting offences and was only released from prison in the recent years. When Mr X has a problem, he turns to smoking and drinking. His siblings could not cope with his coping habits, and as such, Mr X was chased out of the flat.

Towards the end of July 2019, we spotted Mr X in the community and he looked frail. We found out that he had neither eaten nor returned home for days, and thus we started providing packed lunch for him to take away daily from our centre's kitchen. Given Mr X's condition, we tried to persuade his siblings to take him home but they were not keen due to his coping habits. They only allow him to return home to bathe when they are at home. In view of Mr X's mental condition, there are challenges in finding him a shelter. Despite this, we are continuing to work with Mr X and provide him whatever support or help we can.

In our community, Mr X's case is just one of many and BCS will do whatever we can to help. There are challenges we face in terms of resources and funds to do more;

however, as the Bible says, when we entertain strangers, we could be entertaining angels without knowing it (Hebrews 13:2) and Jesus in the Bible also encourages us to feed the hungry, entertain strangers, clothed the naked, care for the sick and visit those in prison (Matthew 25:35-40). We are just following Jesus' command in taking care of Mr X or those who could be in the same circumstances as him. So let us do Lilian Sze our part to do good together. **Executive Director**

目前, 在伯特利社区服务中心 (BCS) 担任的职务中 我更加意识到上帝将我们安置在这个社区中, 足这里的许多需求。我们希望通过神的恩典, 作为社会 服务提供者,满足需求并支持社区中有需要的人们。在 我们的《 iCan》杂志中,我偶尔会分享我们如何帮助某人或满足我们社区的需求。在本期中,我想分享我们如何帮助一位男士-X先生(不是他的真实姓名)。 X先 生于2018年由伯特利神召会的主任牧师谢牧师介绍给我 们。谢牧师是在社区中的一个活动中遇到了X先生,他 认为我们可以为他提供一些帮助。此后,我们的协调员 Natasha拜访了X先生。她发现X先生患有精神分裂症 和抑郁症,需要长期服药。他的父母都去世了,只剩下 X先生和他的兄弟姐妹。 X先生和他的兄弟姐妹住在社 区的一个公寓里, 但随后被赶出了公寓。

X先生因涉毒和斗殴罪而被监禁,最近几年才被释放出 X先生遇到问题时,他转向吸烟和饮酒。他的兄弟 姐妹无法应付他的习惯,因此X先生被赶出公寓。

2019年7月下旬,我们在社区中发现了X先生,他看上去很虚弱。我们发现他已经好几天没吃饭也没有回家了 因此我们开始为他提供外带午餐, 让他每天从我们中 心的厨房带走。考虑到X先生的病情,我们试图游说他 的兄弟姐妹将他带回家,但由于无法应对他的习惯,他 们并不热衷。他们只允许他回家洗澡。鉴于X先生的精 神状况, 为他寻找庇护所, 存在挑战。尽管如此, 我们 仍将继续与X先生合作,并向他提供我们所能提供的一 切支持或帮助。

在我们社区中, X先生的情况只是其中之一, BCS会竭

尽所能帮助这些人。在资源和资金方面,我们面临着更 多的挑战。但是,正如圣经所说,当我们招待陌 生人时,我们可能会在不知道的情况下招待天使 (希伯来书13:2),而圣经中的耶稣也鼓励我们喂养饥饿的人,招待陌生人,给赤裸的衣服,照顾病人和拜访那些在监狱中的人(马太福音 25: 35-40)。我们只是遵循耶稣的命令照顾X 先生, 或可能与他处于相同情况的人。因此, 让 我们尽自己的一份力量共同努力。

BCDC & BK K2 ANNUAL GRADUATION & CONCERT 2019







Functional and Mobility Health Screening 2019

Prevention is always better than cure. In line with Singapore's healthcare approach, the functional and mobility health screening for seniors in the community on 26 October 2019 was introduced.

South East Community Development Council (SECDC) collaborated with Bethel Community Services (BCS), Tan Tock Seng Hospital (TTSH), and the Agency for Integrated Care (AIC) to provide the screening. Over 70 seniors turned up for the event, and they were provided with light refreshments. They even had the opportunity to participate in a lucky draw! Every senior had an opportunity to win something for themselves, and prizes included 3M products that were raised by BCS during the 3M Step-up Challenge organised by SECDC earlier this year.

After the screening, seniors who are assessed to have health issues pertaining to their mobility were referred over to Geylang East Home for the Aged (GEHA) for further intervention or follow-up health advice. When community partners work together, assistance to the seniors can be rendered in a more effective way.

We would like to thank SECDC, TTSH and AIC for reaching out to the seniors in the community while providing affordable health screening for them.







"ROLLING" ACTIVITY

Students of Bethel Student Care Centre attended a fun, interesting and artistic session on quilling by a group of volunteers from St. Anthony's Canossian Secondary School led by their teacher, Madam Xie.
