1) Lead-in: Set the context for the reading

- a. Stimulus: The teacher shows a picture of a ninja and elicits from the students the word *ninja*.
- b. Pair-Speaking Activity: The teacher asks the students to speak in pairs about what they know about ninjas and what they have to do with the month of December.
- c. Whole Class Feedback: The teacher nominates some of the students to share their ideas.

2) Pre-Teach Vocabulary: Matching

- a. Task Setting: The teacher gives instructions for students to match the words with the correct visual (Activity 1).
- b. Matching: The students individually complete the activity.
- c. Pair-Checking: Students check their answers with a partner.
- d. Whole Class Feedback and Language Clarification: The teacher elicits and boards the answers, asking comprehension questions to check the understanding of the words.
- e. Form and Pronunciation: In pairs, the students discuss
 - i. the part of speech of the word
 - ii. the number of syllables

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- iii. and the main word stress.
- f. Form and Pronunciation Feedback: The teacher elicits the answers from the students and drills the correct pronunciation.

3) Gist Reading Task: Skimming for the main idea

- a. Task Setting: The teacher instructs the students to read an article and put the title and sub-titles in the correct locations (Activity 2). The teacher sets a time limit of about three minutes and emphasizes that they should read quickly at this point.
- b. Gist Reading: The teacher hands out the article, and students individually read for the answers.
- c. Small Group Checking: After students read individually, the teacher puts the students into small groups and has them sort the titles and sub-titles in the order they appear in the text (Activity 3).
- d. Whole Class Feedback: The teacher hands out the full article without blanks as an answer key (page 6).

4) Detailed Reading Task: Scanning for specific information

- a. Task Setting: The teacher gives instructions for the students to look through article and fill-in the charts about why we should celebrate Ninja Day and how we should celebrate it (Activity 4).
- b. Detailed Reading: The teacher hands out the activity folded so students can't see the answer key. Students read and do the activity individually.
- c. Pair Checking: Students check their answers in pairs.
- d. Whole Class Feedback: The teacher instructs students to unfold and check their answers with the answer key. The teacher monitors to see if any students put the wrong answer or if there is any confusion to address in whole class feedback.

5) Productive Speaking Activity: Planning collaboratively

- a. Task Setting: The teacher instructs the students to make up their own fun international day in small groups, focusing on what the day is, when should it be held, why we should love it, and how it should be practiced (Activity 5).
- b. Speaking Activity: Students work in small groups to come up with their international day, filling out their charts.
- c. Presentations: Groups go to the front of the class and present their international days to the rest of the class.
- d. Whole Class Feedback: The teacher decides which international day he or she likes the best.
- e. Delayed Error Correction: The teacher boards some student errors made during the speaking activity and elicits corrections from the students.
