Only a couple of weeks to go and we will wind the clocks back to join Queensland and Western Australia on standard time as they maintain their objection to this 21st century idea of daylight savings (DST). Good or bad, everyone seems to have an opinion on DST and how it affects them. Personally, I am OK with DST as it presents a few more options on how to spend daylight hours. The worst of DST for me is when we do finally wind the clocks back, it signifies the start of the colder months. Once we are back on AEST the days appear to be suddenly much shorter, and I am never prepared for that. The winding back of the clocks is a signal that time before winter is limited and the inevitability of the colder months. Every winter seems different, some longer than others, some colder than others. Last year seemed to be longer as we appeared to almost bypass autumn and launch from summer into winter. What will this year bring? We don't know, but we do know that for the second year in a row we are going into winter in great shape, which is often not the case. There is a huge body of feed and livestock are in great condition. So that is half the battle and at this point that is comforting to know.

With the body of feed as good as it is in just about every district, we are seeing unprecedented demand for all descriptions of livestock playing out in markets. Restockers are having to play hard ball when trying to replace livestock that have been sold, or rebuilding herds and flocks. Restocker demand is so strong that values continue to defy forecasts from many industry authorities. Restockers don't appear to be fazed by that and have decided they have to keep trading. So, it seems to me that many who have held off somewhat to this point, expecting markets to ease as forecasts suggest, have now decided that time is limited for them to get back into business before numbers ease and availability is further restricted. In the case of cattle markets, every year we see the last of the northern weaner sales around the end of May signal tighter supplies of trading stock and this year will be no different. Except this year there appear to be less numbers and less weaner sales than we would normally see. It appears that a lot of cattle are being held back or have already been sold. Consequently, prices are remaining very strong.

Taking a look at results on AuctionsPlus this last couple of weeks, and values for light cattle have been very solid, as have values for quality females. Clearance rates have been a little erratic but values have remained pretty solid. Many buyers have tried to keep the dollars per head value down with less regard for the c/kg cost, and they have been willing to step back into the tropical breeds and their crosses to do so. Then there have been the buyers sourcing quality young females to join, scan in calf and shift them on. Values for quality young females are fully firm. Finally there are the herd builders who have been buying the PTIC females for the longer term. Prices for each category have been very strong, particularly for the better, British bred cattle. If you study the clearance rates, the British bred cattle are regularly much higher than the rest. The interesting feature of the market is the continued strength in the EYCl, sitting well above 1100 c/kg. This is about 250 c/kg above the indicator this time last year and 350 c/kg above where it was two years ago. Amazing numbers given that it has been above the 1100 c/kg level for some months and continues to defy predictions of a correction.

I know nobody wants to think about it, but there is certainly opportunity to put some hay in a shed at the moment. Hay producers are struggling to sell their summer production because of the great season. From what I have seen you can buy pretty good lucerne hay for around \$250 to \$300 per tonne and if you are not too fussy about dry land pasture hay, it is very cheap. You do have to be mindful of weeds etc, but it is worth thinking about. One day you may be pleased you did.

There has been a lot of discussion about carbon farming recently in media and beyond. I don't profess to know anything about it but have tried to get my head around what the potential is and how it affects us. There is also a lot of discussion about being carbon neutral in our businesses and how that may play out for producers in the coming years. There is talk that we may be required to map our carbon foot print in order to access some markets with grain and livestock. With that in mind, some advisers are making the case that if you sell your soil carbon (as is being encouraged by some quarters) you may well be doing yourself a disservice when it comes to selling your livestock down the track. When you think about it, if you sell your soil carbon to someone trying to offset their emissions, you may well have to buy carbon credits back to satisfy buyers requiring beef that is carbon neutral. So my point is, that you should fully explore all possibilities before committing your carbon to someone else.

Paula and Katie are driving their own cars to Woodburn over the weekend to be there for the trucks' arrival on Monday. They will spend next week there distributing the food and products to needy families. "If anyone would like to donate cash to assist us with our fuel costs, it would be greatly appreciated," Paula said.
