

Walcha Bowling Club won the delayed 2021 NSW No.7 Pennants Championships at Warilla last weekend when they defeated Ocean Shores 67 – 63 in the final on Sunday afternoon.

# around the traps

It is amazing to think that a month ago we were struggling to get the seeder in the ground in places. Today, there would be no hope of getting the seeder on the ground! I think this must go down as one of the wettest months of March we have had and the climate data on the BOM site confirms this. Looking back since records began on several sites close to Walcha and in most cases 1997, 2001 and 2017 are the only other comparable years in March. Interestingly, in the years we have had wetter months of March, often they have been preceded by very mediocre rainfall totals in January and February. There is no better month to get rainfall than March, so hopefully we finish up with a bit of sunshine for pastures before we get too cold.

The rain has been amazing in the north east of the state, but there are a few areas where rain is needed before planting winter crops. From where we are it is hard to imagine there are some areas needing rain. But there are, and they need rain badly to build soil moisture profiles heading into autumn. Apparently, the wet season in the north has also gone AWOL and seasonal mustering is already underway about a month earlier than usual. This is going to bring more cattle out of the north and will have a flow on effect to live export prices and markets further south if those numbers are too great. In saying that though, there is a lot of country in QLD that is under stocked, and they will be pretty hard to beat if they get some momentum buying replacements.

AuctionsPlus results last week were possibly a sign that buyers are getting a little more cautious and it is suggested in their weekly notes that some dry areas are surfacing in the eastern states, creating a little uncertainty in the minds of buyers. If you take a look at the sale averages though, prices were up, but like all statistics you have to dig a little deeper and the auction clearance rates were considerably cheaper. It is my view that buyers are still prepared to pay the price for quality lines, but thinking a lot harder about paying the rate for the secondary lines. The results on Auctions Plus last week saw feeder weight cattle in most demand, while values for PTIC females was off the boil again. The PTIC heifer average price was back under \$3000 and the PTIC cows was right on \$3000. I still hold the view that PTIC females or with calves at foot are the best value and offer the quickest return, but it all gets down to the program you run.


The sheep sales on AuctionsPlus seem to be following the same pattern as the cattle. After a couple of weeks of poor clearance rates, numbers of sheep dropped again to 87,000 for the week. Even the drop in numbers did not help as clearance rates immediately following the auction on Tuesday were some of the lowest this year. Auctions Plus are calling it a "seasonal stand-off" with buyers becoming far more selective and with vendors' price expectations too high in many instances. Post auction a couple of days and clearance rates for lambs rose from 30% to 61% so there is still plenty of buyers watching and plenty of vendors lowering reserves to make a sale. Lambs accounted for 44% of the sheep numbers offered on A+ last week with 38,250 offered on line. In line with a much brighter wool market, Merino ewe lambs recorded the highest clearance rate on A+ last week with 86% sold at auction. They averaged \$30 dearer at \$183, which is a phenomenal rise in a week. XB ewe lambs also enjoyed a better week with values rising \$3 and clearance rates increasing to 55% by week's end. SIL ewes of all descriptions had a better week with prices for XB ewes rising \$28 for the week and merino ewes up \$4, however clearance rates were significantly higher for the merinos. There is little doubt the processing value of sheep and lambs would be playing on minds as markets seem to lack enthusiasm. The other aspect must surely be that restocking has been going solidly for a couple of years and although sheep numbers are still historically low, paddocks are filling up.

What does anyone think this federal election is going to cost the country? My expectation is a lot. Politicians seem to be making so many promises to spend money, much of it appears to be totally without a business standard, and with an election in mind rather than how it will ever be repaid. The spending first started with the COVID epidemic and once they got in the swing of it, a billion dollars is the new million and who gives a toss anyway! I am pretty tired of seeing the red tape and waste. Speaking of which, how is our new water supply dam going? All quiet on that front, but behind the scenes I am hearing it is bogged down in red tape. Might just about be finished before the drought after next! Have a great week but be thinking of the poor communities on the north coast as they get drenched once again. I hope not.




