More Walcha History


When Walcha staged it's first show in 1878 the town had an estimated population of 350 people, with a similar number in the surrounding district. At that time public transport was provided by horse drawn coaches, while freight was hauled by both bullock wagons and horse wagons.

Local writer Bob Walsh has been very busy of late collecting stories, photos and more for his new book titled The Walcha Show Society. Bob's new book traces the history of the Walcha Show, from the difficult formative years through two World Wars and the Great Depression, up to the present time.

around the traps

A couple of half decent frosts this last week have sorted out the last of the tomatoes and anything else that is frost sensitive and clinging to life at the end of the warmer months. It was a sudden death for them, but also a reminder of the colder weather to come. I have to say it has been wonderful to go this deep into autumn without the frosts, something we do not normally see. There has been very little frost damage to pastures evident other than couch at this point, but no doubt it is only a matter of time now.

Rain is forecast across much of central QLD and NSW later this week, some of it has potential to be significant according to the forecasts. Farmers with winter cropping programs have been working around the clock trying to get seed in the ground before this event. However, with some central western districts a chance of receiving upwards of 75mm this weekend, some farmers are hanging off planting until the event has passed. If the rain is too heavy and crops are not out of the ground, there is a chance that some country will have to be re-sown. Who would be a cereal farmer! For us, a good fall of rain would be wonderful at this time of year as we would still get some pasture growth and it would give crops a lift. Looking forward to it.

There are now some real biosecurity threats to agriculture looming for Australia, coming from just to the north of us. Indonesia has announced this week they have discovered cases of Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) which is a wake up call for us. It is not the first time in Asia and it has been eradicated before. So there is some hope. Other diseases we have seen recently to the north of us include Lumpy Skin Disease, (which from all accounts would have the same effect on markets as FMD if we had an outbreak), as well as African Swine Fever, (which is still running rampant throughout Asia and Europe). If we were to have an outbreak of any of these diseases, it would have a catastrophic affect on our export markets. We do have a lot of migratory birds fly into the north of Australia and there is very little we can do about the possibility they will bring in an exotic disease. However, the thing we can control is what comes in on ships and in containers or with passengers on a plane, so it would be good to see AQIS ramped up in an attempt to stop what many believe is an inevitable event at some point.

The election campaign has been so easy not to watch unfold! I find the media and the tidal wave of political spin a combination too hard to put up with. A lot of what I have heard is very much what I have heard every election. It does not change. Same old, same old ... while they are all promising to spend money nobody has, it would be great to see some real money go into telecommunications in the bush. If we want to attract city based professionals and tradesmen to the country, we have to have first class communications. It is something missing in this political debate. The first question a prospective city based property buyer will ask is about the quality of mobile phone and internet services. If they are not good, you have a battle with those buyers every time. Good mobile service and internet connectivity would go a long way to bridging a gap that will be forever, if not fixed. I really don't know why the Nationals have not pushed this issue harder for much longer.

Although the EYCl is still elevated at 1096 c/kg cwt, there are some signs that restockers are becoming a little more cautious about how they spend their hard earned. This rain event forecast through QLD and much of NSW this week may change their ways of thinking, but many of the secondary types have come off the highs of a month or so ago. Reports out of AuctionsPlus and several physical markets this last couple of weeks have indicated there is more caution from restockers when it comes to the secondary types of cattle. The last couple of store sales in Tamworth have reported that the cross bred types of heifers in particular have been harder to sell. AuctionsPlus has had similar experiences with the heifers selling to cheaper trends last week. The 280 to 330kg LW range of heifers increased in numbers by 72% on AuctionsPlus last Friday and sold at average \$199 per head lower than the previous sale. The clearance rate was only 52%, so that does tell you the appetite may be waning. The heavier class of 300 to 400 kg heifers sold at an average of \$109 per head less. The lighter steer lines also saw prices for the secondary types lower as buyers have become far more selective. This was always going to happen and the hope is that the season holds the market together for at least another 6 to 9 months to let buyers trade the cattle they have purchased since late last year.

Polling booths will be open from 8.00am to 6.00pm. Locations around Walcha where you can vote on Saturday 21 May:

- Kentucky Hall
- Yarrowitch School
- Nowendoc Hall
- Woolbrook SchoolBendemeer SchoolUralla Central

<u>House of Representatives:</u> Voters in each electoral division elect one person to represent them in the House of Representatives.

In the New England there are 8 candidates standing, so you will need to number ALL boxes on the green ballot paper from 1 through to 8 in order of your preference.

<u>The Senate:</u> Each state and territory elects multiple Senators using a preferential voting system. At a Federal Election only half of the Senate positions for each state typically become vacant, resulting in six Senate vacancies per state.

On the white Senate ballot paper, either:

- Number at least six boxes above the line for the parties or groups of your choice, or
- Number at least 12 boxes below the line for individual candidates of your choice.

Polling officials are available to assist voters complete their ballot paper. If you make a mistake on a ballot paper you may return it to the polling official who issued it and receive a fresh one.

With the right growing conditions, it will reach twenty metres. A beautiful specimen tree. Currently blooming in the Apsley Riverview Hostel grounds is a very pretty Silk Tassel Tree (top right). It is a very distinctive evergreen tree with long tassel-like flowers, glossy leaves with a woolly underside.
