I think I speak for all when I say that we would love to see spring sooner rather than later and I can't help feeling that even though it's only 4 to 6 weeks away, these weeks are the toughest with a Walcha August being eight weeks not four! Calves and lambs are beginning to hit the ground at pace and the feed wagons getting their fair share of work until the spring growth arrives. This winter has been tough for livestock, cold and wet are the harshest conditions to contend with as livestock consume so much energy keeping warm, let alone now contending with a newborn.

Foot and mouth continues to headline the news as the Agricultural sector mounts pressure on ramping up our national biosecurity. To be honest, our fines for infringement breaches aren't dear enough. For example, a passenger who recently arrived in Darwin airport was picked up by a new biosecurity detector dog carrying undeclared products in his bag. This passenger was carrying two egg and beef sausage McMuffins from a McDonald's in Bali and a ham croissant. The products are now being tested for FMD but for goodness sake, he was only fined \$2664 for the infringement which could have an 80-billion-dollar consequence. The government is the one preaching that our biosecurity isn't a joke, well I think our infringements are. Come on Mr Albanese, your government pledged a new 14-million-dollar biosecurity package to deliver more frontline defences which look to be working. Why don't they up the consequences and start fining these people who clearly ignore the rules. At least dearer fines might help pay some of the operating costs and make people think twice about what they are carrying.

Fodder looks to be dear enough or even hard enough to buy. Numerous hay producers have told us on more than one occasion that the cost of producing hay has continued to rise in a market that is now dominated by grass in our paddocks. Plenty of people, especially in the New England tablelands feed hay during the winter months but for \$400 a ton, plus freight I think the hay market has gone a tad stale. These hay producers are telling us that the larger hay operators will be opting to put cereal grain crops in rather than hay and hay could get dearer next season which is hard to believe. If anyone is currently looking for some value for money hay, good quality oaten hay for \$200/ton, ring the team at Boultons.

Fuel prices have come off in the recent weeks which has been unpredicted with unleaded now sitting around 180c/L, while diesel is approx. 205c/L. Experts were telling us the price could get to 300c/L by Christmas without the government excise of 22.1c/L which is set to finish as of the 28 September. It's hard to know what these fuel prices are really set to do in the next six months or so but relief at the bowser is more than welcomed by everyone as the cost of living continues to rise.

Bull sales are still running red hot with averages exceeding expectations. Tummel Herefords had a great sale last Tuesday selling 25 out of 30 bulls to average \$7721 and topping at \$16,000. The Angus breed still seems to dominate the bull values with Texas Angus averaging \$28,057, topping at \$80000, but a whopping sale gross of \$5,863,913. Knowla Angus had an exceptional day at Gloucester with a bull selling for \$190,000 and a sale average of \$26,512. Sale of the day I believe goes to the commercial Knowla Angus heifers just 12 months of age, 300kg selling for \$4800 each. Now that's some confidence in the beef industry. Yalgoo Genetics sale will be held next Monday 8 August and we wish them the best of luck.

Tamworth yarded just 692 cattle on Monday with all regular buyers present and operating in a dearer market compared to the previous week. Cows improved 10-30c/kg topping at 339c/kg, well bred younger cattle improved up to 45c/kg with some lightweight Angus steers topping at 648c/kg. Yearling steers topped at 554c/kg to average 480c/kg while yearling feeder heifers sold to a top of 504c/kg averaging 476c/kg.

1815 lambs and 435 sheep were yarded on Monday in Tamworth with all regular buyers operating in a similar to slightly dearer market on the heavier lambs. Trade weights lambs sold between \$100-140, heavy trade lambs to \$170 while extra heavy lambs topped at \$210. Light mutton sold as cheap as \$20/hd to \$90 but most of the better condition mutton sold between \$100-\$140, topping at \$160.

Delay to the start of Bush **Fire Danger Period**

The Bush Fire Danger Period (BFDP) for the New England/Northern Tablelands Districts will now commence on 1 September 2022 and cover the Local Government Areas (LGA's) of Armidale, Uralla, Walcha, Glen Inness Severn, Inverell and Tenterfield.

NSW RFS Superintendent Paul Metcalfe said that due to significant rainfall and ongoing wet conditions over most of Region this year the NSW RFS, in consultation with other agencies, has announced a delay to the start of the Bush Fire Danger Period, now to begin on 1st September 2022.

Superintendent Metcalfe stated "Now is the time for residents to take action and prepare their property for the bush fire season by removing flammable materials from their yards, clearing gutters of leaves, checking the condition of their hoses and that they reach right around their house, and where appropriate, conducting burning activities.

"These preparation tips, as well as helpful information about what to do in the event of a fire, are contained in the Bush Fire Survival Plan guide, which can be downloaded from the NSW RFS website," Supt Metcalfe

Property owners are not required to obtain a permit until the 1st September 2022 BFDP start date but are still required to notify adjoining neighbours and the RFS at least 24 hrs prior to lighting up. Property owners can notify the RFS via the online notification portal at: https:// www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/notify

Walcha and Wind Development It's not too late

Dear Walcha Community,

Some of you maybe aware Red4NE is an incorporated entity established to promote on behalf of the community responsible energy development in the New England. We don't oppose renewable energy, nor do we oppose the logical scientific arguments in favour of the decarbonisation of our energy systems.

Simply put, we advocate for renewable energy development which is responsible and in the best interests of the whole community.

ReD4NE from its regional standpoint is pleased to see more awareness filtering into the Walcha community as the development of Winterbourne Project progresses.

This is critical from 2 perspectives:

Firstly, The community will have a small 28 day window in which to assess a significant and technically detailed environmental impact statement (EIS) which is due for release in August 2022. It is crucial that the Community inquire and understand as to the future risks to the lifestyle they currently enjoy

Secondly, it's ReD4NE's read that community consultation has failed through poor process in the Winterbourne Wind Community Consultation Committee (CCC). It is ReD4NE's observation that this outcome is not isolated to the Winterbourne Wind project. Similar outcomes can be witnessed at the Nundle Hill of Gold Wind Project, the Ben Lomond Rangoon Wind Project, the Kentucky Thunderbolt Wind Project.

Nonetheless, the main message ReD4NE wants to leave with the Community is it's not too late to shine a light on critical issues. In the short time available before EIS is approved for exhibition the Community needs to continue to increase at every opportunity its understanding of what this project will mean to Walcha – not just in the near term but for the next 25-30 years. Similarly, the Proponent needs to be on the front foot – in a meaningful, open and transparent manner. Each of the following issues

were either given a light touch or glossed over in the failed CCC process;

- Cumulative Impact: ReD4NE from the getgo has been banging a loud drum on this issue- we cannot wave enough red flags. Together with the Winterbourne Wind Project there is a verifiable horizon of significant emerging wind and solar development. This forecast development is either in the planning system, or in advanced and early stage feasibility. Estimates suggest that as of now in a 70 Klm radius of Walcha on or around 550 (250-300M) wind turbines and potentially 8-9M solar panels are forecast for installation. It is clearly incumbent on the Winterbourne Proponent, in their EIS, to assess the relevant cumulative or compounding impacts not only on and from the Winterbourne projects but also on past, present and reasonably foreseeable future projects. This cumulative impact assessment is critical now and for future generations who may want to call Walcha and surrounds home. Despite being the subject of new Government Guidelines, this cumulative impact was not directly contemplated within the Winterbourne CCC Process.
- Social Impact: Inevitably any significant transitional development such as proposed by the Renewable Energy Zone agenda will disrupt and/or divide a Communities sadly this is maybe a reality for Walcha. Hopefully, the Winterbourne Developer notwithstanding the legacy they have inherited -can address proactively and collaboratively social impacts in the context of Walcha and its associated communities. Social Impact Assessment can't just be an after the fact add on -a 'tick the box' component of an EIS. This is all about people in the Walcha community -their current and future relationship to each other and to the community itself. Does the Walcha community really want to host 550 wind turbines and 8-9 million solar panels and all that Is associated with their Installation?
- **Economic Impact:** The New England Community through the REZ is now doing the heavy lifting for this NSW Energy Transition. It is the largest REZ. Macquarie St spin suggests there will be an economic nirvana new job new industry etc. The Community needs to know not just on a regional basis how and where this opportunity will materialise on a project by project basis, but what will this mean for those living in and around Walcha both good and bad.

So, we implore the Community and the Developer not to wait for the 28 Day Public Exhibition of the EIS -as it's a retrospective hindsight assessment. Let's promote a transparent engagement and let's get as many answers on the table and now - before it is too late!

Preparing Moona residents for emergency situations

Who would think that in an emergency in a large rural area, a 000 operator would ask for the nearest cross street or the street number of the house, and when not knowing this, that they would ask for the number of the "house across the road"? This was the reality when Moona Plains resident, Dale Webber, was faced with when a critical health incident occurred on a nearby property in the dark of the night. "Some would think that this is not a significant issue but losing precious time in the emergency is. Trying to convince the 000 operator there is not a house across the road but nearly 2kms away and that we didn't know the house number as there was no address on the entry gate which was some 500m away anyway, was taking away time that could have been used helping the person in need. Sure, I knew the name of the property and the directions on how to get there but to do their job well and direct the emergency services to the right location, the 000 operator needed more information, and as simple and basic as it sounds, I just didn't have the important details they needed."

This experience, and after being in another couple similar situations where emergency services were needed some 40kms from town, was the impetus for Dale to reach out to the Moona community to create a neighbourhood contact list for the use in such emergencies. "This list will include basic contact details of the residents of Moona, along

with the street address and the longitude and latitude co-ordinates of their place and other important information that will help emergency services respond to an incident as efficiently as they can.

Working alongside Dale is Moona resident, Tess Johnstone, and with the support of Walcha Council, Healthwise and the National Recovery and Resilience Agency, this contact list is starting to take life. It is the start of the Moona community 'getting prepared' for future emergency situations whether it be a bushfire, an accident or a critical health incident where efficient and effective communication is critical.

'Let's be Prepared Moona' is a community driven initiative to ensure all residents of Moona are kept informed and safely assisted when disaster or emergency situations arise. It is also about educating the community around disaster preparedness and understanding what emergency services may require from members of the public (eg when calling 000), and who else to contact in various situations when help is needed

An informal afternoon tea will be held on Sunday 14 August, between 2pm and 4pm, on Rowley's Creek Road to share information on this initiative with the Moona community. Drop by for a cuppa and a chat about how Moona can be better prepared and bridge the gap between emergency services and the community at large.

Also, the way Fire Danger Ratings are determined and displayed across NSW is changing, the Rural Fire Services Inspector from Armidale will be in attendance to share this important information.

As part of a national project, led by the NSW RFS, the new Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) will be rolled out from 1 September 2022. There are several key changes:

- There will be four levels of fire danger (instead of six) – Moderate, High, Extreme and Catastrophic;
- Clear action statements which are displayed to give the community advice about what to do at each level;
- A new design for roadside signs across NSW; and
- Behind the scenes, the science to determine the daily fire danger rating has also changed.

The rollout of the new system will be supported by a public education campaign from the start of September. Join us at Rowley's Creek Road and speak with representatives of the NSW Rural Fire Service about the changes including permit changes.

Drop by for a cuppa on 14 August and a chat about how Moona can be better prepared and bridge the gap between emergency services and the community. As a community, we share the same environment, let's work together to get prepared and to stay safe.
