# Austin chops his way to two titles in a row

Winning the Most Successful Competitor at one Royal Show isn't an easy feat, but to win it at two consecutive Royals is nearly unheard of.

That is what young Walcha axeman Austin Scrivener acheived on the weekend at the Royal Queensland Show, otherwise known as the Ekka.

From Saturday 6 August, Austin along with his older brother Mitch competed for eight consecutive days against axemen from across the country and New Zealand. All axemen competing at the Ekka receive points for places they attain in finals, and at the end of the show the competitor with the highest accrued points is named the Most Successful Competitor.

To take out this title Austin placed first in the 275mm Standing Block, 300mm Underhand and 300mm Tree Felling handicaps, third in the 275mm Standing block and 275mm Tree Felling handicaps, and third in the Three-Man Relay with his brother Mitch and South Coast axeman David Reumer. He also picked up the minor placing of fourth in the 275mm Underhand Handicap and made five other finals.

Besides the title win, one of the highlights at the Ekka for Austin and Mitch was making their first Double Handed Sawing Championship final at a Royal Show as a pair. In a close final, they placed sixth against a quality field of experienced sawing combinations.

Mitch also spent a little time on the podium bringing home second place in the Open 300mm Jack, Marina and Destiny Pink Memorial Trophy, the 275mm Standing Block, Second Division 275mm Underhand, and the 275mm B Grade Elimination Handicap.

The brothers now have their sights set on the Royal Adelaide Show in early September, where Austin is a member of the Australian U21s team to take on New Zealand. On return it will be a trip to the Gold Coast for Mitch in mid September to compete in the Stihl Timbersports Rookie Series, then a quick turnaround will see them head south for the Melbourne Royal at the end of the month. The brothers definitely have a busy few months of chopping ahead of them.

# around the traps 😝

If they are not saying it, there are people thinking it, and that is, wouldn't it be good to see some fine weather for the last few weeks of winter? Rainfall over the last few days is just sitting on top of the ground and with livestock already sloshing around in wet paddocks from rain the previous week, the problem is exponentially worse. I am having so many conversations around how wet the country is and how difficult it is to get across many low lying areas with machinery or in a vehicle. Many are having trouble crossing paddocks in side by side buggies let alone in a ute or bigger ATV. The country is saturated and another 30 plus mls on the weekend just added to it. Which brings me to the point that spring is not too far away, and it should be a cracker if we can get a bit of sunshine.

To me this winter has been a long one, although we have not yet been exposed to some of those terrible August days we can get. Livestock are certainly not liking these more than wet conditions with poor quality feed and stock standing in water there are all sorts of problems coming forward. For those trying to manage livestock, feeding them is not easy. Paddocks are so wet that vehicles with extra weight are getting very stuck, making feeding almost impossible in some cases. So hopefully with about another 4 weeks of winter left, livestock will hang in there without getting into too much trouble.

I have been travelling to and from the central west a bit lately and have to say conditions are very similar all the way. Water everywhere and winter biting hard. One noticeable difference is that the wattle has been in flower in the central tablelands for the last few weeks. Spring is erupting earlier down that way with clover very prominent and that familiar smell of blossom in the air.

In the 40 plus years in the agency business I can't remember a time when livestock values have jumped as quickly as they have done over the last fortnight. With restockers waving the white flag through July under the weight of the threat of FMD. livestock values tumbled. They were in free fall. The EYCI dropped smartly from 1130 c/kg CW in early June to 885 c/kg CW in the last week of July. Buyers had left the market in fear of an outbreak of FMD. Then we had that significant widespread rain event in the first week of August and it was game on again! The EYCI now sits at around 961 c/kg CW heralding a significant rise in a short space of time. Buyers are back and focused.

I think the market was really spooked by the very real threat of FMD entering our country, but the fundamentals of the cattle market had not changed. Since the rain, many producers have thought about that and were also conscious of just how much feed they are about to produce in spring. We have all learned in recent years that you can't make money out of empty paddocks. I was listening to market reports last week while driving and the increases week on week for some sheep and lambs was in the order of \$50 to \$60 in places, while the improvement in cattle markets was just as amazing. Some restocker types were quoted up to 120 c/kg dearer week on week with all descriptions quoted significantly dearer. It has been a remarkable few weeks in the market and I hope you weren't one of the unfortunate ones who sold in that market down turn. We were highlighting just how buyable cattle had become and maybe you saw that too by taking a plunge into some numbers. The threat of FMD remains, but so does the need for protein. We can only hope that FMD doesn't find its way here.

The other incredible market event we are seeing unfold is the values being paid for bulls this selling season. I certainly have never seen anything like this level of activity and interest in bull sales. It is wonderful for the studs, to see them being rewarded for many years of hard work. Just looking through some of the results and there are a lot of Angus sales with averages in excess of \$20,000, some with big numbers in individual sales on offer. I am also amazed at the number of volume buyers fronting up and buying numbers of bulls in these sales. There are certainly some big operations out there buying bulls. I hope there is just as much enthusiasm this Friday when Highrent and Full Circle sell their catalogue of bulls. There is a lot of breeding in these bulls and some very good young bulls if you are in the market. Not too far away is the Ben Nevis sale on 7 September, so keep that in mind as well.

# Farmers bring together renewable voices

NSW Farmers is hosting a series of renewable energy forums that will bring together landholders and government bodies to discuss the state's Renewable Energy Zones.

With the federal government setting a 43 per cent emissions reduction target for 2030, there is increased pressure to build renewable energy installations. While some proponents see regional and rural land as a cheap alternative to urban or offshore developments, farmers and community groups are concerned about the long-term impact on agricultural productivity.

NSW Farmers Energy Transition Working Group chair Reg Kidd said it was a matter of making sure future developments such as renewables did not come at the expense of agricultural productivity.

"There is a finite amount of productive agricultural land in NSW, so we need to make sure it used wisely." Mr Kidd said.

"It's important that people build the right thing in the right place, and in the right way – whether that's urban expansion, renewable energy generation or even the power transmission lines those renewables require.

"We know there's an interest in building renewables on ag land, both from farmers looking to diversify and from developers, so what we want to facilitate is an open line of communication there so agricultural productivity, economic opportunity and social benefit are all balanced."

The Renewable Energy Zone Forums will feature speakers from the Energy Corporation of NSW (EnergyCo) and the Department of Planning and Environment and will cover the planning and assessment process for renewables developments, protections for agricultural land and how to find information and provide input.

"This is one of the key emerging issues for regional communities and we want to ensure the energy transition is done well," Mr Kidd said.

"Ultimately we need to work out how renewable energy projects fit in

with agricultural production – preferably built on less productive land – so future electricity supply does not come at the expense of food and fibre.

"It's critical any renewable development is done with farmers, not simply imposed upon them."

This event is open to the public, not just members of NSW Farmers, but as it will be focused on landholder issues we do ask that only those with agricultural interests register and attend.



# Almost \$400,000 available for Walcha in latest funding

Applications opened in the first week of August for Round Five of the Stronger Country Communities Fund (SCCF) with Walcha Council encouraging local organisations to apply now.

This round will provide an additional \$160 million for community projects in regional NSW, including up to \$50 million for projects delivered by community organisations. This brings the total funding for the SCCF to \$660 million.

The funding available for projects in the Walcha Local Government Area (LGA) is \$1,251,697. Of this \$391,000 will be available to eligible community organisations.

"The Stronger Country Communities Fund means big investment in projects that really matter to our communities," Member for Tamworth, Kevin Anderson said.

"Previous rounds have funded great projects like the ongoing Barraba Rugby Clubhouse renovations, lighting at Dungowan and Kootingal Recreation Grounds, and upgrades to Kootingal and District Pony Club.

Round Five of the SCCF will open to all eligible applicants on 5 August 2022. Applications will close at 5pm AEST on 23 September 2022.



Somewhere in this fine publication (Page 3) is a press release for a Renewable Energy Zone Forum next Wednesday 24th August at 12:30pm. To simplify this release the meeting will engage Energy Corporation and Dept. Planning and Environment to give information around the New England Renewable Energy Zone, but DPE will also present on the Environment Impact

Statement process for projects. This is an information session and not a debate on the merits of renewable energy. Personally after my conversations with Energy Co I disagree that this should only be focused on landholders as alluded to in the release and anyone interested in the pathway of projects should attend. #### **OLD HOSPITAL**

The remainder of this column is once again devoted to the "Old Hospital". I still receive many question and comments around its future. Quite often there is a Thumbs Down to its condition. The following email chain sums up the lack of enthusiasm by the State Government to assist. I believe it speaks for itself. I could include all the letters written over the years in relation to it but suffice to say the most recent will do. Maybe we need a concerted effort on behalf of the community for some progress. At this stage I'm not sure what that will be, but everything until now has not worked.

Dear Kevin.

I'm writing again in relation to the "Old Hospital" in Walcha. Over 5 years of pushing and trying to have an outcome for this abandoned infrastructure I feel I have gotten

I won't reiterate the issues and problems that have been raised in that time except to say that my community and myself are extremely frustrated. Surely there must be a pathway to solve this ongoing problem. The building continues to deteriorate and cause both social and health issues to our community. On top of this it still costs our local MPS. I struggle to make any traction with this issue that has been ongoing for 12 years. There must be a pathway forward and I ask you to assist us along that path. CIr Eric Noakes

I am making representation on behalf of Councillor Eric Noakes, Mayor of Walcha Council regarding the 'old Walcha Hospital site', Walcha.

.....

The Walcha Hospital closed in 2007 when a modern and purpose built Multi Purpose Service opened on a new site. The old hospital was decommissioned and became the focus of a Local Aboriginal Land Claim under the Native Title Act.

Since the decommissioning, the buildings have been severely vandalised as well as a significant amount of disturbed asbestos has been identified on the site. The building and the site are becoming more derelict, and the cost to restore and monitor activity at the site will be increasing.

I am informed that the repair of the damage to the site is the responsibility of the Multi-Purpose Service and this will be draining funds and resources that could be

The Walcha Council Mayor fully understands the complexities of an Aboriginal Land Claim and the sensitivity around these issues, however from a community viewpoint there has been no action for 11 years and the Mayor believes there could be commercial options for the use of this site should that possibility arise.

On behalf of Walcha Council, it would be appreciated if an update on the 'old Walcha Hospital site' could be provided.

Thank you for writing on behalf of Councillor Eric Noakes, Mayor of Walcha Council, about the former Walcha Hospital site.

I acknowledge Councillor Noakes' concerns about the site and appreciate your advocacy on this matter.

Mr Michael DiRienzo, Chief Executive, Hunter New England Local Health District, confirms an Aboriginal land claim was lodged against the site a number of years ago and remains undetermined.

Mr DiRienzo acknowledges the long delay in the land claim being resolved. The NSW Department of Planning and Environment is managing the land claim and consulting with the NSW Aboriginal Lands Council. Regrettably, the District is unable to negotiate the sale or transfer of the site until the land claim is determined. I am assured the District is maintaining the old hospital buildings and grounds as safely and securely as possible but do acknowledge that the long period of non-use may be making them unsightly. I am sure that the District is doing whatever it can to facilitate a conclusion to the land claim process.

# What is Cyberbullying and what can I do about it?

Cyberbullies use the internet and social media to embarrass, upset, scare, or exclude a person. Cyberbullying includes sending, posting, or sharing negative, harmful, false, or mean content about someone else. Some cyberbullying crosses the line into unlawful or criminal behaviour.

If you are being bullied online, you can take some steps to help stop the bullying. The first thing is to take a screenshot of the bullying post. The next is to block calls and texts from the bully. It is best not to respond to the bullying as it is the attention the bully wants.

If the bullying continues. Report the bullying to your child's school and show them the saved proof. The school will develop a plan to help alleviate the bullying. If the bullying endures then you should take your complaint, with evidence, to the Police and it will be dealt with through the courts.

Another support is to put the computer in a high-traffic area of the house. This allows you to monitor their activity without issue. It is better not to confiscate their mobile phones and internet access. This will make them less likely to speak to you about their problems, as they will be afraid you will take away an important social outlet for them.

Bullying harassment takes away security and safety and it makes the person feel vulnerable. It is important to provide a safe place for them to talk about what has happened.
