around the traps 😝

It is amazing how only two weeks ago the paddocks were saturated and now after a few frosts and a couple of nice days the country has dried a little. Springs are oozing water and ducks are still getting bogged in the gullies! The grass is trying to grow, green shoots are everywhere and just like the livestock, everyone has been so much happier with the sunny weather we experienced last week, let's hope this cold, wet front passes through quickly.

I took a trip to Dorrigo on the weekend and the New England looks all the same, short, wet and the livestock look like they have had a long winter. The country is going to bounce in the spring and come away with the heat which I think is why we are seeing some renewed interest back in the cattle market. The EYCI finished last week at 1014c/kg, that's a staggering 129c/kg jump in just 3 weeks since the end of July. The EYCl has recovered over 50% of the loss we saw in the dramatic slide during June and July. Primarily this has been driven due to the lack of supply throughout August, nearly halving throughout the eastern seaboard compared to totals during July. AuctionsPlus numbers sunk to a 27 month low last week and we saw evidence of some sales selling well above reserves due too the lack of numbers. Feeder cattle have been slower than young cattle to regain the ground that was lost during the same period, but it would also make sense as grain fed export plants close between December/January and prefer not to be purchasing 100 day grain fed cattle at present. I think we will see the feeder market continue to get stronger as we head into spring with producers holding feeder cattle back to get as much weight into them as the grids will allow and the season continues.

A couple of weeks ago I spoke about labour shortages throughout the Agricultural sector and now new data has been released stating that the sector is short 172,000 workers which I still think could be under estimated. This massive labour shortage can only mean one thing, increased cost of living pressures. Farmers are currently make difficult choices not to plant some crops as they can't guarantee labour for harvest. The government needs to get on the front foot and get suitable overseas workers on the ground here to stem the worker shortage. I do believe if retirees are able to work and would like to do so, that the government need to be able to allow them to do so without affecting their pension or super schemes. After all, if you are more than capable of working, why not if the desire is to do so.

Bull sales are still in full swing and values haven't taken a backwards step by any means. Highrent Angus held its second annual sale last Friday with 100% clearance, averaging over \$12,000 and topping at \$25,000 for a yearling bull. Ben Nevis Angus will be the last local bull sale on the 7th September with 90 bulls up for grabs, do yourself a favour and go inspect this exceptional lineup of young bulls. An elite Wagyu seedstock sale last week sold 17 elite females to average \$99,853 a head, with a single female topping at a whopping \$270,000. Eight bulls sold to an average of \$62,813 topping at \$105,000, talk about confidence in an industry.

Tamworth yarded just over 700 cattle on Monday with market trends responding to higher demand with some categories experiencing strong gains due to breed and quality. Angus steers to restock consigned from Barraba sold to a top of 734c/kg, yearling heifers sold to a top of 580c/kg. Feeder steers sold to a top of 584c/kg. heavy kill heifers sold to 458c/kg for 616kg while cows passed the 400c/kg mark again selling to a top of 418c/kg for 680kg.

Tamworth yarded 4800 sheep and lambs in a market that saw prices ease by at least \$20-30/hd, lambs topped at \$208 for 68kg+. Demand from processors was quoted as being weak in the mutton section resulting in cheaper trends.

Moona gets prepared

Braving chilly August winds at the gravel pit on Rowley's Creek Road, the Moona community recently came together to chat over a cuppa about how they can be better prepared in an emergency and bridge the gap between emergency services and the community.

It was a good start to the 'Let's Be Prepared Moona' community-driven initiative to ensure all residents of Moona are kept informed and safely assisted when disaster or emergency situations arise. Whether it be bushfires, accidents or critical health incidences, efficient and effective communication is critical in these situations.

The community took the opportunity to update a Moona district map, plotting the location of residential dwellings and other information that would be important in an emergency. When completed, a copy of this map will be laminated and provided to each of the emergency services in Walcha including the SES, RFS, NSW Fire and Rescue, Police and Ambulance. Attendees also provided their information for the community emergency contact list which will be vital in an emergency. They were given a handout on what happens when calling 000 and also a list of important telephone numbers of who else to contact in various situations when help is needed. This also included the location of the nearest evacuation centre and a list of helpful APPS such as Emergency + and Fires Near Me NSW. To identify and share exact locations vital in an emergency, the What3words APP divides the world into 3m squares and identifies each of these squares by a unique combination of 3 words.

A representative from the NSW Rural Fire Service, Steve Carmichael, was in attendance and shared important information about the upcoming changes to the Australian Fire Danger Rating System which will be rolled out from 1 September 2022. This is part of a national project led by the NSW RFS. Steve also brought to light the new Fire Permit requirements.

Moona residents, Tess Johnstone and Dale Webber, are co-ordinating the 'Let's Be Prepared Moona' initiative and are happy to answer any questions the community may have. A Facebook page will be coming soon which will provide a channel for communication and updates on the progress of the project.

Thank you to the National Recovery and Resilience Agency, Resilience NSW, Walcha Council, HealthWISE and the NSW Rural Fire Service for supporting this community-based initiative.

OXLEY HIGHWAY CLOSURE

Following a meeting between our General Manager Barry Omundson, Director Infrastructure Phil Hood and myself two weeks ago with Transport for NSW (TfNSW) in relation to the constant closure of the Oxley Hwy in an area we term "the mountain" we were given some bad news. The constant heavy rain following drought and bushfires has caused major damage to the road. I believe we came away from the meeting feeling that TfNSW is doing everything they can to minimise the impact to Walcha and businesses that rely on this route. The bulk of the work that can be done from the lower side of the road has been done and the remaining work will need to be performed from the roadway. This will require the complete closure of the road due to machinery on the road and workers being suspended over the edge. They were very receptive to trying to make access easier on Fridays to allow tourist access to the coast for weekends and to fit in on our motorcycle weekend.

A quicker fix would be ideal, but it's

also understandable that the focus of the repairs to transport links has been shifted to areas around Lismore and the Hawkesbury-Nepean Rivers systems which in some places don't yet have access. At this stage closures will be:

- 13 September to 6 October CLOSED Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 7am to 4pm.
- 11 October to 16 December CLOSED Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday 7am to 4:30pm AND Friday 7am to 3pm.

It will be open on 17 and 18 November for the Motorcycle Rally.

No closure is ideal, but the longer it is delayed the longer until the work is completed. Apparently they have to drill horizontally into the road base and place ties and grout to hold the reinforcement in place. An engineer can probably give you a more technical answer here but hopefully you understand the issue. When I visited the site last year Pablo the Project Manager explained that when the road was originally built that most of the outer lane was just the excess material from the cut that worked well for a long time, but heavier vehicles and changes in risk require a more substantial solution. The tough part of this is that this work will not be completed until mid 2025.

TfNSW have committed to keeping us up-to-date on any changes. Hopefully Live Traffic can be tweaked to give motorists better information, and of course these timelines are weather dependent.

UPCOMING MEETINGS

I alluded to the Energy Corporation and Department Planning and Environment (DPE) in last weeks column and hopefully those interested have read the press release in relation to it. Many may know that Energy Co are tasked with building the New England Renewable Energy Zone. This basically takes in the Council areas of Walcha, Armidale, Inverell, Uralla and Glen Innes, but reaching into other neighbouring Councils. Much of their scope is the transmission of the electricity to connect with the current grid. The urgency to build renewable energy projects to replace ageing coal fired generation, I believe sees many communities struggling to keep up with the pace of this change. It appears Walcha will be in the middle of this expansion, both with projects and transmission.

The Wednesday 24 August meeting (today) at 12:30pm at the Walcha Bowling Club, and organised by Energy Co offers an opportunity to learn and ask questions around what is coming and the impacts it will have on our community. With the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Winterbourne Wind project nearing release from the DPE and going on public exhibition for a minimum of 28 days it gives community members the chance to be part of the process through a submission. DPE will attend to explain this process. In the words of Molly Meldrum "do yourself a favour" and engage in this process. There is always a lot of conjecture around what is happening so you won't get a better opportunity to engage with those in the know. Just register and ask a question if you have one, on the link in the press release.

The following week 31 August, which has also been advertised in the Apsley Advocate, is an information forum, once again around renewable energy and its impacts. Focused more on a local level it will also be a good opportunity to understand and discuss these projects moving forward.

COUNCIL ENGAGEMENT

In light of the of what could be a changing environment around renewable energy projects for Walcha, Council is engaging with as many councils having been and currently being impacted by these projects as possible. The first is New England Renewable Energy Zone Councils, instigated by Mayor of Armidale Regional Council, Sam Coupland, and centres on State Government mandating the Community Contribution Fee, Decommissioning Bond and Demonstrated Authentic Community Engagement.

The second, which has been instigated by Walcha Council is the Coalition of Renewable Energy Mayors (CoREM). The added purpose of this group is to engage with other councils who have experienced renewable energy projects come to their Local Government Area. The information coming out of this group will assist in the writing of effective Road Infrastructure Agreements, traffic management, water requirements, and all other infrastructure issues. On top of this we hope to gain a better understanding of social impacts including accommodation, short term population increase and community sentiment. Both groups will hopefully give us better advocacy with Government.

OFFICE CHANGES

Anyone who has visited the Council Office over the last month will have noticed the changes to the front office. Easier access to Service NSW and seeing a smiling face as you walk in the front door gives a more welcoming feel. With limited space to work with I believe it's a great outcome for customers. The funding for this came from a grant from Service NSW and came at no cost to Council.

The evening saw the King family celebrate Mass at St Patrick's Church before a family function at the Showground.






