

MLA and GLENRAC will be running two farm pasture field days at Dundee and Walcha this month and all landholders are invited to attend.

The field events will focus on the benefits of pasture improvement and provide information useful to local landholders on pasture management techniques, including cost effective control strategies, farm water infrastructure and drone technology for weed control.

The events will also present the findings from research conducted by the MLA funded Northern Tablelands Pastures Group (NTPG) at farm properties in the New England.

Three NTPG demonstration sites investigating pasture management strategies in the wake of the 2018 and 2019 drought will be profiled: Richard and Kerryn Ogilvie's properties near Ebor, 'Te-Angie' and 'Forest Lodge', which investigated pasture improvement using fodder cropping for weed control; and John and Caroline's property 'Bridgewater' in Dundee, which trialled corn silage as a cost-effective fodder reserve.

"These events are a fantastic way to get together with your friends, meet new people and learn about a range of pasture management strategies which may help you in improving pasture productivity on your farm," said GLENRAC Sustainable Agriculture Officer, Emma Tilley.

The Dundee and Walcha field days will provide an opportunity to share findings from the recent research conducted by the Northern Tablelands Pastures Group, MLA and GLENRAC.

The day is free to attend, with morning tea and lunch provided. Attendees are asked to please BYO chair.

Presidents Report 21 September 2022, Martin Oppenheimer

As I complete my three year term as President, I want thank the Walcha Show Society Committee for your support and energy which is a major reason for the Walcha Show being a continued success.

The Walcha Show was held on Friday 11 and Saturday 12 March 2022. The Show was a success and a particularly good result with wet weather making preparations more difficult than usual. A combination of factors such as floods, fuel prices, shortages of staff and stock, some trade exhibitors and competitors pulled out in the week leading up to the Show. The Horse and Cattle sections were down slightly on last year. However, entries in the Motorbike, Cattle Dog and Yard dogs, Shearing, Merino and Meat Sheep, however, were up. Spectator numbers at the motorbikes, shearing and Fashion Parade were excellent. The Pavilion entries and displays were outstanding.

Financially the 2022 Show was a success with an increased surplus, despite a reduced Gate and Bar on the record 2021 Show. The surplus was largely due to increased grant income. Thanks to the NSW Government for a grant of \$36,000 under the Country Shows 2022 package. We have had successful Shows because of the energy of the Committee, Volunteers and support from local business sponsors. Also, because we have continued to provide better facilities, events and entertainment.

Some highlights from the 2022 Show were: Congratulations to Amy Kermode, Walcha Showgirl for 2022 and Amber Macpherson, Junior Showgirl. Thanks to Anna Barwick, NSW Premier's Woman of the Year for sashing the Showgirls. Michael Millner, President of the RAS opened the Show on Saturday.
