Turbines on my mind

I don't go out of my way to talk to people. Apparently that's what authors are like. Not that people go out of their way to talk to me either, and I don't blame them. "He's just that funny little bloke who writes books and stuff." But occasionally they do, and that's exactly what happened recently. Quite a few people called me, on their phones. About wind farms. I won't say I was swamped, but the calls did come thick and fast for a couple of days. I was blown away. (Heff! That is pathetic!)

Sorry, but it's true. That's what they wanted to yack about, wind farms. People I didn't even know called. Don't get me wrong, I'm not complaining. I'm actually to blame for the tsunami of calls. Last week I put a small piece in the Advocate telling anyone who wanted to have a beef either way about these turdbines to call me. My aim was to record a heap of short videos to get as many voices and faces of Walcha out there as possible stating their thoughts about these possible blow-ins.

As it happens quite a few brave souls were prepared to front the camera and spout their bit. What amazed me though was something else, something that made me realise how very important this matter is to many people in this community. By far the bulk of callers were confused, feeling that they were in a kind of info limbo. They wanted to know things but said they couldn't find out anything substantial, just words and generic stuff and promises that sounded suss.

I had to do something. So I've made a short (half-hour) podcast dealing with twelve main issues regarding wind farms – what I call Matters that Matter. It's a kind of layman's intro to the subject, helping you navigate what can be a minefield of info and data, so that you can begin to make up your mind (one way or the other) on what will be a very important decision for Walcha. Download the podcast to your phone and listen while walking the dogs or driving or on the loo. But do get that podcast, do listen, and do think about it all. It's one way of making sure you are part of the decision

Certainty v Conjecture



Last week councillors and senior staff once again set off around the community to engage in six regional visits. This is a yearly listening tour in a semi informal forum to hear issues that may not generally come to council. Added to our standing itinerary was information in relation to the Special Rate Variation (SRV) that councillors unanimously agreed to undertake in response to the recently completed Financial Sustainability

Review performed by Professor Joseph Drew and two international local government specialists. This report is available on the Walcha Council website and complements the mail out to every ratepayer in the LGA last week. Professor Drew presented his findings at each venue, and his recommendations on the way forward.

This review presents a comprehensive and detailed analysis of Council's financial path over the last ten years, and while the intent is not to be critical it must be factual, and leaves council with no other option than to seek an increase in land rates. The feedback at the regional meetings has been overwhelmingly positive when the irrefutable facts are tabled. The root cause of the issue is State Government control that has restricted income while passing on costs, some of which were once borne by other tiers of Government, to Local Government. In an environment where inflation is higher than our capped income there comes a point where the tough decisions need to be made. That time is now, but in retrospect probably should have been earlier. Long term decreases in reserves have lead us to the point of solvency, but not sustainability- there is a marked difference.

Part of the reason for writing this article is to counteract what I would term "word on the street" that no one appears to be the author of, but is being relayed to me as someone else's thoughts. This is not a witch-hunt or blaming exercise but we need to be able to have a

challenging, open and honest conversation about the best path forward for Walcha. It is nearly 10 years since the last amalgamation attempt, and they are well renowned for coming around at regular intervals. As councillors it is our responsibility to place our council in a sustainable position, not with the focus on any amalgamation debate but to give our community what it deserves. That being a financially sustainable future capable of delivering the services our residents not only require to reside in a liveable community but also to retain Walcha's unique identity.

The often stated rhetoric that our financial challenges have only arisen over the last few years are refuted by the summation of Walcha's position in the *Fit For The Future* program that in 2013 stated that Walcha had "weak financial sustainability and a "negative outlook". Quoting from Professor Drew's report "To put this assessment into perspective it is important to note that Walcha received one of the lowest financial sustainability ratings provided by TCorp (NSW Treasury) in 2013: just fifteen percent of the 152 member peer group were deemed to have an equivalent or worse financial sustainability position. Moreover, most of the local governments which received weak ratings were subsequently amalgamated". The reason for Walcha LGA's ability to stand alone and avoid amalgamation is a not so well kept secret.

Any rise in cost of doing business, or effects on household budgets should be avoided where possible, but to avoid this SRV will have irreversible outcomes for Walcha. If we continue on our current path I believe there is no way that either administration or amalgamation can be avoided. Our rates are lower than surrounding councils, we provide so many services to this community that other councils have fees for and as an example to maintain sports grounds must come out of general rates. This applies to many other services that council provides for free. All councils must display their Fees and Charges on their website. It's interesting to look at other councils and see what this council does free for users, but is obviously not free to council. As I understand we were the last council in NSW to put a charge to use our waste facility. Before that the fee you paid did not cover the day to day running let alone the long term expansion. The cost of compliance around waste disposal is onerous and is going to keep becoming tougher.

Off the cuff claims that council has too many staff, inefficient or wasteful practices need to be backed by fact and not emotion. Personally I have struggled with some of the above but in the heavily legislated environment that we exist these are often not options, this is not like a commercial business where unprofitable sections can just be cut free or shortcuts taken.

The current council is focused on looking forward, but in doing so we must acknowledge the path that brought us to this point so we can avoid repeating decisions along that path that were made with the best intentions but may not have delivered the desired outcomes. In the past I have led a council that has overseen some decisions that I would not repeat now with more information at hand. We cannot continue to be everything to everyone and we must begin a path of "fee for service".

Without financial sustainability there will be no happy ending. If amalgamation becomes the result no council that we are amalgamated with has a war chest of money to turn around our declining position. Road maintenance will not be held at its current level, rate harmonisation with what will be a larger council, over a four year period will see our rates rise by far more than our desired SRV. Anecdotally our council office will just be service centre and staff numbers and services will be slashed.

As I engage with councils all over NSW it has made me appreciate how well we have done under a harsh operating environment. 40% of our land sits in National Park or Forestry that is un-rateable. We control close on 1000kms of road for 3200 people, yet Tamworth control 3000kms for 65,000 people.

As you are most likely aware we are holding a public meeting at the Walcha Bowling Club tonight (Wednesday) at 5:30pm to explain in detail what an SRV entails. I invite and encourage everyone to attend to ask your questions, detail your concerns maybe understand more about the financial and legislative environment that Local Government works under. No respectful and informed question will be off the table and there will be people with the knowledge to answer it. You may not get the answer you would like but we will be transparent and deal only in the facts.

Renewable Energy in Walcha

The Australian Energy Market Operator (AEMO) manages electricity and gas systems and markets across Australia, to help ensure Australians have access to affordable, secure and reliable energy. The AEMO, on 10 October 2022 in the Australian Financial Review, called for a "mature conversation" to be had regarding the need to transition to renewable energy as coal fired power plants shut down their operations 5-10 years ahead of schedule.

This same transition is happening in the rest of the world and it is happening because renewables are half to one third of the cost of new coal power generation (GenCost 2021-22, CSIRO) no matter what your political stance is on this issue. The transition is needed because the coal fleet is old and needs replacing and they are beginning to break down. These old power plants should be replaced with whatever is the cheapest option to keep the lights on. This will require the development of wind, solar and pumped hydro projects along with the construction of new transmission lines capable of carrying the power if we do not want to be faced with major blackouts (load shedding) and we expect to receive a reliable electricity supply. Fundamentally, these developments need to take place in the locations where the resources exist. This in why the State Government established the New England Renewable Energy Zone as one of three Renewable Energy Zones in NSW. Walcha has been identified as one of the best wind resources in the State and is ideally suited for its proximity to major powerlines and suitable sites for pumped hydro schemes.

Change is going to happen and we need to adapt to and embrace this change with the spirit of collaboration, co-operation and compromise. This change will not be painless and, understandably, it is difficult for our tight knit community to shoulder the burden of construction and to host the necessary infrastructure and transmission lines while the benefits will be shared with people hundreds of kms away. That said, we have always benefited from energy generated from Hunter Valley coal and now it is our turn to shoulder some of the burden to build new clean energy infrastructure to support the rest of the State. All towns in each Renewable Energy Zone are in the same unenviable position. However, the National and State clean energy agenda is a reality that we need to accept if we expect to have affordable and reliable energy for our houses and businesses in the future.

Apart from the fact that some people will find the projects burdensome, we need to embrace all the good things that will emerge from having some renewable energy projects in Walcha. There are many benefits that will flow to the community through substantial Community Benefit Funds, the opportunities for extra jobs, apprenticeships, a more viable Local Council, a more vibrant local economy, improved facilities for the community, extra opportunities for tourism and extra income for our local businesses and accommodation providers.

It is easy for people to criticise the renewable energy developments proposed for the Walcha LGA. However, what choice of new industry or source of economic stimulation do we have to ensure the arrest of Walcha's population decline? The recent review of Walcha Council's financial sustainability by Professor Drew and 2 other colleagues clearly demonstrates that Walcha Council is currently unsustainable without a large increase in rates and, without attracting new substantial industry to Walcha, we are setting ourselves up for amalgamation.

I understand that some people disagree with windfarms and they are completely within their right to do so. However, some meetings have taken place that are designed to create fear in the community. Healthy debate is a good thing and should take place but it should be a mature debate based on mutual respect which I have not witnessed to date.
