around the traps



Back in time: June 1997

We thought it would be fitting to publish one of Bruce 's first Around the Traps columns. On behalf of the community we would like to thank Bruce for his commitment to this column, which spanned more than 25 years. Your weekly updates and comments will be missed.

JUNE 1997 by Bruce Rutherford

Well it's week two of this informative column, and I have to say that the first week has met with positive remarks, so I'll keep going with it. Whilst at the Rugby on Saturday, one reader remarked, "you're a sprinter!", so I guess the challenge has been set.

Walcha had another fair quality yarding of some 1270 cattle last Friday, with some good lines of cattle in all descriptions. The quality of the cattle were not as good as several weeks ago and although winter is now upon us, there were still some very good individual pens of cattle. Competition from the usual field of buyers was strong for the best of the cattle, with the plainer lines meeting restricted competition.

Bullocks and heavy steers were well represented making to a top of 104.8c/kg, with most well finished cattle making from 97 to 102c/kg. Medium weight, well finished steers made from 90 to 96c/kg with a pen of very well finished crossbreeds making 97c/kg. Trade cattle were the big movers from the sale a fortnight ago, with a pen of quality Hereford steer calves making to a top of 105c/kg, and heifers with some polish on them making to a top of 97.2c/kg. Most trade cattle up to around 350kg, with some shape and finish, met strong competition, and sold generally from 88 to 95c/kg. Export heifers sold well to a top of 95c/kg. Best clean cows also continue to sell well, while the lessor quality cows remained unchanged. A good line of heavy black baldy cows sold to a top of 81.2c/ kg, while most good bodied cows sold from 76 to 80c/kg. Medium cows sold to 77c/kg with most from 72 to 76c/kg, while lighter conditioned cows generally made from 60 to 65c/kg. Heavy bulls sold from 80 to 90c/kg.

Next fat cattle sale in Walcha is set down for the 11th of June, and the trend for the better finished cattle to meet the strongest competition is set to continue through the winter months. At least one export works is going to reduce their kill, in line with the reduced numbers on offer. A number of others are considering their position also. This will undoubtedly limit competition, should this occur.

There is not a lot of activity around Walcha in the sheep and lamb market at this time of the year, however, there is still strong demand for the well finished sheep and lambs. Upton Pastoral sold another 1000 lambs on CALM last week to the same buyer in South Australia for in excess of \$66 per head, and there have been some good paddock sales reported also.

Tamworth yarded 3300 lambs on Monday, with the plainer lambs cheaper by \$1 to \$3 and the best conditioned lambs up to \$1 dearer. 2600 good quality mutton was sold to stronger competition for the best grades, and weaker competition on the lighter ewes. 4 score lambs 18 to 20kg sold from \$44 to \$53, while lambs over 20kg sold from \$48 to \$56.20. Heavy, good conditioned sheep generally sold from \$24 to \$28.

With a sheep market that has been driven for the last few years by demand for mutton, rather than re-stocker demand, there are some immediate supply problems facing the processors. We would have to hope that the processors are able to ride out this shortage, and maintain supply to their markets, rather than the alternative, which is, not to supply those markets until the price of product is more attractive. Once we are unable to regularly supply this growing market for our mutton, we face the likelihood of losing some or all of these markets to competitors, or an alternative product.

For interest sake only, in 1990 our sheep sales through our business averaged a mere \$11 including lambs. This year, with dramatically less numbers, the average is over \$30.

A quick response to criticisms directed at VfW

The Voice for Walcha would like to respond to some comments and criticisms that have been raised in the community recently, from largely anonymous sources through maildrops.

Regarding the accusation of NIMBY'ism, we would like to remind our accusers that what we have objected to is large scale industrial developments that impact negatively on our community and our landscape. We are taking the position we have taken because we value our community, our landscape and our town, for the qualities that it has. We make no apology for defending Walcha and its unique and beautiful strengths. We have argued that this project is;

- in the Wrong Place, (against the Oxley Wild Rivers National Park, part
 of the Gondwana Rainforest Wilderness area. Requiring that project
 traffic travel through the LGA using Oxley Highway and Thunderbolts
 Way affecting traffic to Tamworth and Armidale, as well as affecting local
 traffic and residents North and East of Walcha, and in the township).
- is the Wrong Size, (placing massive burdens on resources, housing, health services, childcare and other trade services)
- is being promoted by the Wrong Developer (an inexperienced developer who is really a seller of turbine components, wanting to bolster dwindling European sales by entering the race as a learner developer)

Given that there are multiple projects being planned, it is not necessary for our community, or the NSW planning department, to open the floodgates for the first application – particularly if it is a poor-quality project. Let's demand a good project from a good developer, for it to be successful.

Regarding the accusation of being anti-renewable, we have repeatedly stated our support of renewable technology, and the responsible transition to it. We are prolific users and investors of renewables ourselves, so to label us as anti-renewable is naive and off-target. This uneducated cheap shot is a sign of desperation and lacks knowledge in the argument.

Regarding the comment about Voice for Walcha objecting "for their own selfish reasons", and not for the greater good of the community or the environment", we are not sure whether the irony of this comment requires us to even respond. We are not gaining anything financially from our actions.

Regarding accusations of errors and mistruths, we have had vague comments about "spreading mistruths", or "scaremongering", but not once has anyone had the ability (or decency) to point out specific points that need correcting. We go to extensive lengths to fact check and are careful with information that is not verified. We welcome this effort by anyone who has bothered to describe any of our information as inaccurate, to point to specific examples of fault, so that we can address them. That would be fair. By contrast, we have been able to point to a number of specific mistruths, inaccuracies, omissions, and misleading comments that Vestas have had to correct, or clarify, on the planning portal. Further inaccuracies are yet to be dealt with.

We want to restate our motivation for our activity, that we want the best outcome for Walcha, and we want everyone to be informed and have an opportunity to participate in the conversation while there is an opportunity to do so. To ignore this process, only to find ourselves in an industrial landscape that we were not aware was coming, would be a shame. Let's participate, not be the plaything of an offshore developers profit driven desires, but drive the agenda ourselves, to suit our community.

If it were not for the massive amount of support our office and group receives daily, we would not be motivated to continue. We are determined to avoid any personal vilification, and to avoid division. That does not preclude us from having a Voice for Walcha.
