around the traps

Monday afternoon was probably one of the best falls of rain we have received since Spring and a timely follow-up to recent storms. We had Summer-like temperatures last week when it made it into the low thirties, before some intense storms cooled down the evenings. If you managed to be under one of these storms you would have been lucky enough to get between $15-25 \, \mathrm{mm}$ last week and a further $25 \, \mathrm{mm}$ on Monday night. No doubt tractors will be working overtime planting ahead of another week of forecasted stormy, wet weather.

The rain will also give lamb producers a boost of confidence and show some resistance in a market that is gradually declining, especially for store lambs. The New England Tablelands is traditionally a large store lamb breeding area which supplies a large area of NSW producers west of the Dividing Range. Typically the phone would be ringing hot looking for lambs to put on lucerne and summer crops, but it has been really quiet thus far. We really need a widespread front to drop a few inches of rain across NSW to get the lamb fatteners firing again. While ever we're getting rain we can show some resistance to the lamb market as it gives us feed that other areas don't have. Another thought is to shear your store lambs, it may not give you a better price for your sale, but it will make you one.

Rams Sales are in full swing with a number of sales completed last week. Clearance rates and sale averages have been back on previous years, but there is still plenty of interest. The Merino sales look to be less affected by the downturn in value in the mutton and lamb market compared to the terminal sire sales. If you're in the market for a ram, whether that's a merino or terminal ram, there are still a number of local sales at which I'm sure you'll find a suitable purchase for your flock.

There is no doubt the horse industry is in great shape. The annual Magic Millions thoroughbred sale sold 782 horses from 874 catalogued for a whopping \$294,386 average, topping at \$2.7 million. The annual Nutrien Classic sale in Tamworth will see around 650 Australian stock horses and Quarter horses go under the hammer this weekend after a full week of campdraft competition. The values that people will be paying for a horse won't be anything like the Magic Millions, it's a hobby for them and it will be interesting to see if any horse can exceed last year's top seller at \$550,000 for a mare.

Tamworth yarded just 512 cattle on Monday in what has been described as a firm to dearer market due to the low number of cattle yarded. All categories saw small rises; cows saw the biggest increase by 10c/kg and sold to a top of 300c/kg. Wagga yarded 1,500 cattle with lightweight steers, feeder steers and heavy cattle suitable to process all seeing price increases. Feeder steer sold to 414c/kg, heavy bullocks out to 372c/kg while cows topped at 310c/kg. The Tamworth sheep and lamb market yarded 4,000 head with stores selling to a cheaper trend of \$70 – \$90/hd, mutton down \$5-10/hd on the previous week.

The annual Walcha Races are set to run this Friday 3 February which is always a great day out for the local community. Saturday is a real family day, with a foot race on the cards for the kids – make sure you all head along and support this local event.


