around the traps

Summer is now officially over and we welcome the first day of Autumn with the countdown to lighting your fires well under way. Looking back at summer it was quite mild except for a few weeks of warmer weather, the nights remained cool and if I remember correctly we had a little frost in December. The forecast for March looks to have us in for a good chance of rain, most likely storms next week and that's about it for the month, I hope they're wrong. March is when everyone needs rain for Autumn growth which helps prepare us for the winter months and gets those cereal and grazing crops in the ground out on

Speaking with farmers out in the Coonamble and Walgett shires they mentioned it was quite dry but normal for this time of year. They have a good body of dry feed and will be looking for decent rain soon, these areas buy plenty of weaner cattle or take on alot of cattle agistment when the season permits during the winter months. Still hard to believe that back in November towns such as Walget were cut off by flood water.

Beef markets around the world are waiting in suspense after Brazil, the largest Beef exporter detected a possible atypical case of BSE in a cow. The animal was found in a processing plant that was apparently not China listed but due to their trade agreement, Brazil voluntarily suspended beef trade to China. A lengthy absence of Brazilian beef supply into China could have profound effects on global beef supply and demand. Brazil last year accounted for 41% of China beef imports, while China consumed 62 % of Brazilian beef exports. If the suspension last months then it will start to have significant impacts for our export markets. Australia's biosercurtiy needs to be top level; we produce such clean proteins at the highest of quality to export to global markets. These global market disruptions allow Australia to take advantage with our products and in return putting more \$\$ in our producers pockets.

The mandatory date for tagging sheep and goats with electronic identification tags (EID) has been set at 1 January 2025. NSW has held out against the individual tags for more than 6 years but following the Foot and mouth outbreak in Bali last year, the government have supported the EID mandate. The bottom line is that if you don't have EID in your sheep by 1 January 2025 you won't be able to sell them to abattoirs, and restockers won't be buying them without an EID. The whole thought process behind the EID mandate of sheep and goats is to make traceability quicker if we have a disease outbreak. Victoria implemented the EID for sheep and goats back in 2016 and speaking with an agent in Victoria he mentioned that it had its teething issues, mainly saleyards where large volumes of sheep and lambs moved through the system. He believes the sale yards are at 98% accuracy and all Victorian producers now tag at lamb marking, just like you already do with the property ID tags. In terms of how robust these tags are and percentage of sheep that lose tags is an unknown.

Tamworth yarded 1600 cattle on Monday with all classes of restocker and yearling cattle to feed selling to cheaper trends with feeder steers topping at 378c/kg and heifers 358c/kg. Heavy weight export cattle sold to dearer trends with cows up by as much as 10c/kg selling to 288c/kg while bullocks topped at 348c/kg. Kill cows in Mortlake Victoria on Monday topped at 330c/kg and bullocks sold to 394c/kg.

Tamworth held its annual Autumn lamb show and feature sale on Monday yarding 3000 lambs and 1000 sheep. Restocking lambs met reduced competition due to lack of fresh lamb feed in paddocks, trade weight lambs sold to \$5/hd cheaper while new season suckers sold to \$5/hd dearer and up to \$178. Heavy export lambs sold to \$230/hd while demand for mutton was weaker, selling from \$5 – 10/hd cheaper and topping at \$118/hd for heavy mutton.

Zone 4 Young Woman winners crowned


