Areas surrounding Walcha are just some of the locations across the region, and 46 across country NSW. to be connected to fast and reliable fixed wireless broadband internet, thanks to the State Government's new landmark \$50 million agreement with NBN Co. Northern Tablelands MP Adam Marshall announced earleir this month.

Mr Marshall said the agreement would lead to improved internet services through the construction of new fixed wireless broadband towers in six areas across the Northern Tablelands, including Kentucky, Deepwater, Emmaville, Mungindi and areas surrounding Walcha and Moree.

"Faster, more reliable internet means a boost to education and job opportunities which will open more healthcare options and connect more people, making everyday tasks much easier," Mr Marshall said.

"Most customers in the six locations currently have to access their internet services via satellite, which is notoriously slow and unreliable.

"In comparison, fixed wireless is much faster and more reliable and residents around Kentucky, Deepwater, Emmaville, Mungindi and Moree and Walcha will be thrilled to hear that better internet is coming to them "Even though telecommunications is the sole responsibility of the Federal Government, I'm pleased NSW has shown some leadership here, stepping up to the mark to address this key area of inequity and help bridge the vast digital divide.

"These days, fast and reliable internet is not simply about lifestyle to stream shows or movies, it is an essential part of every business, whether at point of sale through EFTPOS and online retail sales, to precision broadacre agriculture."

Mr Marshall said this was one of the largest ever digital infrastructure investments by the State Government.

"Whether you're running a household or a business, you need fast, reliable internet and residents will have a choice of service providers at comparative prices and speeds as the city," he said.

"This is good news all round and now I'll be pushing for even more small communities and rural locations to get these towers."

NBN Co will commence detailed planning and will provide these communities with more details about the rollout in the coming months.

The network of new and co-located NBN fixed wireless towers will be rolled out incrementally and will be completed by the end of 2025.

around the traps 🚱

The weather has been rather unusual over the past week with summer like temperatures over the weekend. Everyone was looking for shade when temperatures hit the low thirties throughout the tablelands and the plains climbed into the forties. The moisture that fell during the previous week has all but gone as we now look to another possible change at the end of this week. Predictions vary but there seems to be some moisture on its way. We need another drink after summer decided to return.

The weaner sales are well and truly underway with Armidale varding just fewer than 3000 calves on Monday. It's a completely different market to 12 months ago with the EYCI tracking at 37% less compared to the same time last year. Steers 200-280kg averaged 455c/kg, \$1119/ hd while 280-330kg averaged 430c/kg, \$1304hd. Heifers looked to be good buying when 200-280kg averaged 324c/kg, \$790/hd while 280-330kg averaged 331c/kg, \$997/hd. The season has really put the pressure on the market with pasture quickly deteriorating in large parts of eastern Australia due to insufficient rain this year. Not only is the season on edge but there is definitely a larger run of weaner cattle being offered up for sale compared to the previous couple of years. Auctionsplus numbers compared to the previous year look to be back but have still been yielding some great results with the better prices relevant to breed and quality. Angus weaner steers in southern Qld, 258kg sold for 521c/kg while their lighter sisters made 414c/kg. Quality joinable EU Angus heifers, 400kg made 400c/kg while PTIC females made from \$1600-\$2200, topping at \$3550 for some outstanding young Angus females sold ex Angus stud at Guyra.

The local property market has been red hot over the last 12 months with numerous transactions taking place for record values. It's an interesting space as carrying capacities and prices paid per DSE come under extreme pressure as livestock markets retract and the season looks shaky. History shows that land only gets dearer over time but have we reached a plateau or peak? Current livestock values will struggle to service the debt depending on the debt/equity ratio on these current land values being paid. The banks are running a fine tooth comb through budgets prior to property acquisitions and values paid per DSE, or cow calf area. People investing in rural property are data hungry and will always be scrutinising your numbers, especially at these current values. It will be an interesting 12 months ahead with rising interest rates, lower livestock prices and weather patterns forecasted to be dryer than normal with a possible return of an El Nino later in the year If you are in the market for some quality local cattle, Nutrien Boulton's will hold a twilight AuctionsPlus cattle sale next Thursday 30 March at 6pm.

Currently the one stable market, lambs look to be coming under some pressure with lamb grid slowly retracted and currently sitting around 720c/kg. The Trade lamb indicator is down 9% while the mutton is down 37% compared to the same time last year. The Australian sheep flock is tipped to hit a 15 year high and reach nearly 80 million head which will keep the pressure on prices, but we may see some extra orders generated from overseas markets at these values. Sheep slaughter and mutton numbers are set to increase for the next few years producing plenty of product to enable Australia to fill new and existing orders.

Tamworth yarded 2550 head of cattle on Monday in a market that lost ground on the previous week with demand weaker through all categories. Weaner steers lost up to 30c/kg struggling to make over 400c/kg, heifers topped at 311c/kg while feeder steers made to 390c/kg. Heavy kill steers averaged 308c/kg while cows topped at 266c/kg. 6000 sheep and lambs were yarded on Monday and Light store lambs once again met weaker competition due to the lack of local lamb feed just selling to \$95. Trade weight lambs made from \$140-160 and heavy export lambs sold to \$245. The mutton market was firm for the better conditioned sheep while light condition sheep lost ground. Heavy mutton sold to \$145 while light mutton sold down to as little as \$25/hd.

"The committee were overwhelmed with entries this year and we currently have over 200 on the wait list," said committee member Amanda Scott.

The day's events will commence at 6.30am and include a Maiden, Novice, Open, Ladies, Junior and Juvenile drafts. Popular sporting events such as the bend, barrell and flag races, along with Junior riding classes will commence at 1.00pm. Large and small dog races are also being held on the day, so bring along your canine friend and enjoy some fun.

The annual Vic Robson Memorial Stockman's Chop, which consists of cantering a horse whilst cracking a stock whip and cutting pieces of paper once again is expected to be highly contested this year. The John Stanton trophy will also be awarded to the child that best displays sportsman and horsemanship on the day.

With so much action, along with a full canteen and bar open on the day, a drive out to Woolbrook could be a great option this Saturday.

If you can't make it this weekend, the Walcha Campdrafters Club will be hosting their annual draft over Easter, from 7-9 April at the Walcha Showground, while an Autumn Jackpot Campdraft will be held at Yarrowitch on 29-30 April.




