

Flu cases 100 times higher in 2023 than 2022

Influenza cases are resurging exponentially this year. In the first 3 months of 2023, there have been 8000 cases of laboratory-confirmed cases of influenza. In 2022, over the same period, there were only 80 cases. This is because of artificial protection created by strict COVID measures which almost eliminated the flu in 2020 and 2021. However, influenza is still a potentially deadly virus to vulnerable adult and children and vaccination against the flu is our best form of

defense. The groups who are particularly vulnerable to flu are children, older adults over 65 years, pregnant women, ATSI people and people with chronic medical conditions.

The flu vaccine is therefore not only recommended for the above vulnerable groups but it is also funded by the government.

The 2023 influenza season is expected to be severe because our herd immunity against the flu is less than in the pre-COVID times because of fewer flu infections during COVID restrictions plus lower flu vaccination uptake in recent years.

The peak flu season varies from year to year and is hard to predict with higher degree of certainty. The general trend is that cases begin rising from April/May to their peak around June to August before they begin falling in October. It is therefore important to have your flu vaccination before June 2023.

The 2023 flu vaccine has been updated to protect against more recently circulating strains.

There are different types of the flu vaccines. Some more effective in older people aged over 65 years, some for younger adults and children and others available for people with egg allergies.

Flu vaccine can be given on the same day as COVID vaccine.

COVID-19 is now becoming like the flu virus and has become endemic. There has been recent spike in reported cases according to latest surveillance report due to omicron immune-evading subvarients but this is not expected to lead to a massive outbreak.

Health authorities have recommended a 2023 COVID-19 vaccine booster dose to be given before June 2023 if your last COVID vaccine dose or confirmed infection was 6 months or longer regardless of the number of prior doses received.

Older adults aged over 65 years, adults or children with immunocompromising health conditions and ATSI people are particularly vulnerable to COVID-19 and have been recommended to receive the booster dose.

Bivalent mRNA booster vaccine (Moderna and Pfizer) are the preferred vaccine choices due to their proven efficacy and safety records.

How others create a Renewable Future

A couple of weeks back we suggested that Walcha should decide its own renewable energy future by adopting the concept known as Community Owned Renewable Energy. CORE projects are really catching on big time in Australia. The Community Power Agency (CPA), working with Melbourne and Sydney Universities, has identified at least 120 CORE projects across Australia, targeting community-based renewable energy approaches that seriously question corporate-based works such as big wind farms. Walcha should take a good look at these, and with that in mind - Hey Presto this article highlights six such CORE projects. In actual fact, most of those 120 CPA projects are worth inspecting. But Advocate space is scarce, so all we can offer is a brief paragraph on each example, along with links so that you can check out details for yourself.

Hepburn Energy, Australia's first real CORE project, started as a two turbine wind farm in 2009, recently adding solar and battery storage. it's a

classic co-operative with over 2000 shareholders, making 42% of Hepburn Shire's energy needs. https://www.hepburnenergy.coop/

Yackandanda is a fabulous example of CORE principles, with a 100% volunteer-run community group. Completed in May 2022, the town is already producing almost 70% of its energy, and says it will reach 100% by 2027. https://totallyrenewableyack.org.au/

Manilla's solar farm has the support of over 100 local residents and businesses in a system that turns electricity into a local business instead of an economic leakage. This is a dynamic community

really enjoying the fruits of its energy. http://www.manillarenewableenergy.com.au/

Goulburn's 4000-panel solar farm grew from a local association determined to establish a CORE project. It's a shareholder-based cooperative, with one vote per member no matter how many shares they own, keeping vested interests at bay. https://goulburnsolarfarm.com.au/

Lismore's floating solar farm is just a small part of collaboration between many local councils. Mayor Smith said local councils can "make a huge difference" in how communities use energy. https://www.energymatters.com.au/renewablenews/largest-floating-solar-farm-lismore-nsw/



futures. That way it's in all our hands, not just with a few. We don't have to start big if our energy future is community based. "Out of little things..." they say. Or as Saul Griffith maintains: "It's a story of community economic abundance, and a once in a lifetime opportunity for Australia." 
