around the traps

Everyone was happy to see some rain last week and it was just the boost in confidence we needed, that it can and will rain. Recordings of 10-20 mm were widespread throughout the district with some graziers recording over an inch for the week. This next week doesn't show any chance of rain but some of the forecasters are showing a decent change later in the month and early into November.

I'm sure everyone who watches the news or listens to the radio has seen or heard about the horrific scenes in Gaza over the weekend. The war between Israel and Hamas has intensified which will disrupt oil supplies around the world and Australia already warning everyone to expect fuel price rises. It's just outright barbaric what these people have done and then to parade them around the streets is just disgusting. We live in Australia and to see the pro-Palestine rally allowed to happen by our government is an embarrassment. They were celebrating the loss of innocent lives and labelled the Hamas attack as a day of pride and victory. If these people wish to do this amongst our multicultural community then they should be sent home and celebrate with their own culture.

The feedlot sector is also having the same issue as all rural agricultural sectors in resourcing labour to operate. Depending on the size of a feedlot they would need around 20-25 staff to complete the everyday running of a feedlot and talking to a buyer last week he said the biggest problem was affordable housing. The cost of rentals has risen dramatically in rural areas and availability has dropped, especially in areas of QLD that compete with gas projects and mining. He mentioned that they just can't get housing for workers. I personally don't think the government is doing enough to solve these housing issues, obviously they are trying to attract skilled migrants to help with our labour shortage, but they forget they also need to have a roof over their heads. Since COVID, where have all the workers gone, or have we as a nation just got lazy!

The rain in the south last week didn't kick the market a lot but it did improve the interest in cattle. AuctionsPlus had its lowest listing of cattle in 14 months which in return improved the prices online. Steers back to the paddock were up to 25c/kg dearer than the previous week with lightweight Angus weaners, 213kg topping at 314c/kg. Heifers didn't see the same lift but managed to increase by 5-10c/kg, while feeder cattle continued their downward trend, dropping by 10c/kg to average 231c/kg. PTIC females still seem to be tough enough to move with cows topping at \$940, while cows and calves made from \$840-\$1500. The sheep market also improved with its biggest lift in the mutton indicator week on week by 67c. The wet weather held back mutton and lamb numbers which resulted in a sharp rise due to less supply with new season trade weight lambs selling over \$100 and up to \$138, while heavy old season lambs topped at \$197. Heavy mutton bounced by \$30-40/hd with heavy XB ewes selling to \$81.

1855 head of cattle were yarded on Monday in Tamworth with light restocking cattle seeing a small improvement due to last weeks rain. Feeder steers saw little change making to 242c/kg while the heifer portion slipped 10c/kg, topping at 192c/kg. Heavy grown steers sold to cheaper trends topping at 222c/kg for 655kg while the heavy cows lost 20c/kg and topped at 168c/kg. 3370 sheep and lambs in Tamworth followed the southern markets and sold to dearer trends on Monday. New season lambs over 22-24kg made up to \$110 while heavy young lambs topped at \$122. Restocking young lambs made to \$65, while a run of XB ewes and lambs made to \$69 a unit. Heavy mutton sold to dearer trends topping at \$55 for XB ewes and \$85 for a pen of heavy XB hoggets.

Hard to believe that Christmas is just over ten weeks away and the children have just returned for their final term of school for 2023, where has the year gone?

Fire trail inspections underway

Crown Lands has been conducting aerial (helicopter) fire trail inspections across our area as part of a statewide inspection program leading into summer. The aim of the inspections is to check trails and pinpoint any areas needing final maintenance prior to the summer bushfire season.

The aerial inspections are being undertaken by Crown Lands and the Rural Fire Service, with the Soil Conservation Service assisting with trail repair work.

Follow up trail work can include clearing vegetation and fallen trees, maintaining or creating passing and turning bays for firefighting vehicles, and earthworks to manage water drainage, soil stability and erosion.

The NSW Budget recently allocated an additional \$10.6 million to maintain and upgrade fire trails on Crown land across the state to ensure firefighters have ready and safe access to fight bushfires and conduct hazard reduction work.

AMSAG Rally cancelled

Organisers of the AMSAG Rally scheduled for Walcha this weekend have made the difficult decision to cancel the Walcha rally for this year.

With no available slots remaining in 2023 to run the event, this will now be pushed out to next year.

The decision was not made lightly, and was made in conjunction with Forestry, National Parks, Walcha Council and the Rural Fire Service.

The current dry conditions in the Walcha/Nowendoc region, along with the moderate fire danger rating and lack of substantial rain in the short term forecast have all ultimately led to the decision being made in the interests of safety. Given almost half of the event was to run on shire roads around farming properties, the risk to not only farm lands but also livestock was a high consideration in the decision.

"We understand that people will rightly be unhappy with the outcome, but we wanted to make the call as early as possible to allow time for people to cancel plans rather than pushing forward and hoping for the best next week," organisers said.

AMSAG are in the process of finalising our calendar for next year, and plans are in place to move the event to a different time of year to help with these types of issues.



Marshall pushes for new fire station in Walcha with Minister

Member for Northern Tablelands Adam Marshall is continuing his campaign for a new and upgraded fire station at Walcha, turning up the pressure on the Emergency Services Minister with more questions in State Parliament about when the critical works will be undertaken

The existing Walcha station was built in 1966 and there have been no upgrades or extensions since that time, with larger fire trucks and more personal safety gear putting the squeeze on what little space there is.

"Times have moved on since 1966 when the smaller fire truck, maleonly firefighters and far less safety and protective gear didn't fill this little station to the brim," Mr Marshall said.

"Today, the 57-year-old station is simply not up to scratch for modern firefighting operations – it is far too small and does not have the mandatory safety areas, training space, changerooms or amenities.

"Put simply, the conditions are appalling for our local firefighters and far from conducive to attracting new men and women into the service – this needs to change."

After inspecting the station in June and discussing conditions with local firefighters, Mr Marshall questioned the Minister on what plans the government had to upgrade the existing station or build a new one.

The Minister replied in late July that an assessment of station in February this year "...confirmed the facility is not reflective of the needs of a modern and diverse fire and rescue service."

He also told Parliament that, in regard to when any upgrade works would be undertaken, "the timing and scope of works is dependent upon the annual budget process."

Mr Marshall said now that the new government's first Budget had

been handed down. he was pressing the Minister further detail on the scope of the proposed works, total and cost when the community could expect those works to begin.



"The Budget provided additional funds to Fire & Rescue NSW to upgrade more of its stations and build new ones, just like we are seeing in Uralla right now," Mr Marshall said.

"The Walcha station should be immediately prioritised for funding under Fire & Rescue NSW's Fit for Purpose Program so a new and larger facility can be constructed on the existing site.

"Walcha's firefighters do an extraordinary job protecting the community I am determined to work to secure the funding so that the station can be rebuilt on the existing block of land to better cater for the firefighters and their equipment into the future.

"I now eagerly await the Minister's reply in Parliament in the hope it will provide some good news for the Walcha community."

The Minister has until 26 October 2023 to answer Mr Marshall's questions in the Parliament.


