Walcha scooped the pool at the Keep Australia Beautiful NSW Tidy Towns Awards over the weekend. The awards were hosted in Scone, who were the overall winner last year.

Walcha competed in the Population Category A awards for towns <1500 and received two wins and two highly commended prizes.

Walcha Mens Shed won the prize for Local Legends >65 years. The award recognised their commitment to reducing landfill by creating items from recycled timber to sell at local markets; as well as growing plants to sell locally. The judges were quite impressed that the Mens Shed also hold information sessions from health professionals and tradesmen to share and gain knowledge. In addition the Mens Shed repairs and restores watches, furniture and other items using second hand tools and machines that have been donated by individuals and businesses, to reduce consumerism.

Also in the winners circle on the night was the Aunty Sue Project. This project was initiated by Walcha Central School as an extension of the 2018 NAIDOC Week theme "because of her, we can". The school approached Aunty Sue Green and asked if she would consider sharing a story. Over the course of a year, students worked with Aunty Sue Green to listen to and then retell part of her story through the creation of a 42-page student-created illustrated book; and the built on this experience with the opening of a sculpture, garden and yarning place.

The Bev Betts Rose Garden was Highly Commended in the Bush Spirit Award. The brainchild of the former Walcha & District Beautification and Tidy Towns Committee, the rose garden is now an attractive and popular new landmark in our town.

In the Overall Tidy Towns Awards, Walcha was a finalist in our population category. We were narrowly defeated by Bowraville. Keep Australia Beautiful NSW said that our town, although small and quaint, is well maintained, featuring clever public artwork, and cherishing a rich colonial history. "Although Walcha is at the start of the sustainability journey, given the small size and population base, it is punching above its weight and should be congratulated for its initiatives so far."

around the traps 💦

The storms started rolling through the district last Friday with very patchy results, but nevertheless moisture coming from the right direction. East of town had 20-25mm and the high country in the south recorded anywhere from 35mm-70mm. The patchy falls of between 10-20mm was all that fell closer to town and in some cases only a couple of millimetres. The next two weeks and really the rest of November looks like there will be follow up moisture around and hopefully we can record some larger falls. The grass is changing colour and trying to grow but it will probably head straight to seed which won't give us the bulk we need but that might have to wait until Autumn.

The coastal region of the mid north coast and far north coast looked to get the bulk of the rain with those regions notching up between 50-120mm of much needed rain. Those areas have been extremely dry and with those totals the grass will begin to grow. If anyone has looked at the long-term forecast for 2024 well it looks a damn sight better than this year. There is no doubt we have a tricky 6 months in front us, but a better forecast builds resilience. The rain over the weekend reminded us that it will still rain.

The wrap from the referendum which failed to get up was that surprisingly not a single regional electorate voted in favour of the Voice to Parliament throughout Australia. If this isn't a red flag to Labor about maybe starting to listen to the rural people and not just focusing on metropolitan areas, then I'm not sure what else we can do to be heard. Labor is meant to govern for the people of Australia and clearly, they aren't listening to our voice and the divide is just growing.

The Melbourne Cup will have been run and another interest rate rise most likely announced by the time you read the *Traps* this week. There is no doubt the cost of living is hurting a lot of people but when you think how much money will be punted on the Melbourne Cup in Australia on Tuesday, then there is still a lot of money floating around through society. I'm still trying to understand the inflation, to me when they lift interest rates then it's meant to put further pressure on spending, yet wages continue to rise to compensate the rising cost of living.

The predicted rainfall and increased optimism surrounding a change in our season have improved all markets to some extent. Last week the clearance rates on Auctions Plus were a lot better with livestock selling well above reserves in all markets. Heavy lambs suitable to feed are out-selling light new season lambs that need grass to grow as feed rations continue to get dearer. Restocking lambs sold from \$40-\$80 online, weight & breed dependent. Locally 2-year-old shorn merino wether lambs sold for \$30 per head. Young 1st x restocking ewes look to be the best value selling from \$70-100 per head. Friday's online cattle sales saw the majority of the weaner and yearling cattle sell over \$2/kg including the heifer portion. It was only 2 weeks ago that heifers sold well below \$2/kg. Majority of the steers sold between 240-260c/kg, heifers sold from 180-210c/kg. EU Angus cows looked to be the flavour of the sale after some quality local units topped the sale making \$2670 which is a value we haven't seen since the start of the year. Majority of the quality young units made from \$1400-1800 for cows and calves while the best of the PTIC sold to \$1100.

Tamworth yarded 1000 cattle with strong gains seen in the young cattle while the heavy finished cattle saw price increases. Weaner steers made to 276c/kg, heifer portion sold to 204c/kg while feeder steers made to 246c/kg and heifers to 217c/kg. Domestic kill cattle saw strong gains of 25c/kg and sold to 243c/kg, while cows improved by 15c/kg selling to a top of 190c/kg. Small yarding of 950 lambs and 850 mutton was yarded on Monday in Tamworth and the market didn't respond to the lack of numbers. Trade weight lambs sold to \$70-95 while heavy lambs topped at \$130. Mutton sold between \$15-\$65 depending on weight, condition and breed.

Winterbourne Wind Farm VPA

From Voice for Walcha

The much-anticipated Voluntary Planning Agreement (VPA) (previously known as the Community Benefit Fund) for the Winterbourne Wind Farm will be on exhibition for community feedback in the near future.

So what is a VPA?

A VPA (Voluntary Planning Agreement) is legal document between a developer and the Council for the provision of funds by the developer. It is what we have come to know as the Community Benefit Fund (although there is some confusion around this). It is money, provided by the developer to compensate or to provide benefits to the wider community.

What should the Walcha Community expect?

In March, 2023, the mayors from the New England REZ (CoREM), including the Walcha Mayor, signed and sent a Statement of Expectation to the State Member, outlining what they deem to be the essential requirements for a renewable energy project to achieve widespread community and Council support. It states:-

"Community Contribution Fee – Developers of energy projects to provide a community benefit contribution to a common fund established and solely managed by the individual Councils. This community benefit contribution would be in the region of 1.5% of build cost of the project (as detailed in the Capital Investment Value Report) or circ. \$800 per MW (AC) per year over the life of the project."

Based on this, the benefit should be 1.5% of the capital investment or build cost (1.5% x \$1.588 425 billion as outlined in the Winterbourne Wind Farm EIS) **\$23.8 million.**

The current proposal published on the Winterbourne Wind Farm website is well below what the CoREM statement of expectations has outlined. Given Walcha Council has been a part of CoREM since its inception, surely, we should be adhering to their minimum expectations.

Other things to consider - Should the benefit be paid up-front or in instalments? When does indexing start? How will the money be spent so it doesn't create further community division? Who decides how the money is allocated?

The negotiated VPA will go on display once an in-kind agreement has been reached between Winterbourne Wind Farm and Walcha Council. This is the community's opportunity to make comment on the proposed VPA. It is our only chance to have a voice around this important funding agreement so make sure you are ready to have your say.

While a VPA can not compensate adequately for the impacts this project will have on the community if the project proceeds, we just want the best outcome possible.

Member for Northern Tablelands, Adam Marshall caught up with Mayor Eric Noakes and General Manager Phil Hood to deliver the good news and inspect some work underway on Aberbaldie Road, just out of Walcha.



'Council will be incredibly busy over the next few years, now holding more than \$10 million in grants funds for road upgrade and bridge replacement projects across the district, improving safety and making it easier to get primary produce to market,"Adam Marshall commented.

Walcha Council General Manager, Phil Hood said that the funding was flexible, with Council able to use it for all renewal and maintenance projects. "We have until October 2027 to use the funds given to us through this program, which will be incredibly useful."
