We want Riverview!

Almost 200 people gathered at the Bowling Club on Monday night to learn more about the opportunity Walcha Council has in becoming the operator of Apsley Riverview Aged Care.

In July last year, the current operator, Presbyterian Aged Care, said they would close the facility if a suitable provider is not found. Since that time Walcha Council has been working hard to investigate if this is a possibility for our Council and community. "Thank you for turning up. The amount of people here tonight speaks volumes of the importance of Riverview to our community," Council General Manager, Phil Hood said.

This proposal would see Council's staff increase by 40% with the structure envisaged to be a Section 355 Committee of Council where a Management Committee would report to Council.

So why aren't any Aged Care providers interested in running our facility? Council's Director of Corporate and Community, Christian Martin explained to the meeting that a business wanting to make money will struggle, whereas a community will aim to break even to keep the vital service in town. "On preliminary numbers we can break-even or make a small profit," General Manager, Phil Hood said.

The local Presbyterian congregation owns the land and buildings at Apsley Riverview, so Council will be responsible for depreciation and maintenance which has been factored into preliminary budgets.

The future threat of Council Amalgamation as a risk was discussed and Apsley Riverview Manager, Julie Blake said that this would still provide the opportunity for a larger Council to run it.

The resounding feeling at the meeting was that it is imperative people can age in their own community. "We have a wonderful opportunity here to resume community management, running it with love not profit," Barry Spry commented.

"We can do this as a community," Holly Fletcher said.

So what next? The Community Consultation runs through until 22 January. Council have a survey available on their website or at the office, asking 'Should Walcha Council become the operator of Riverview Aged Care facility?' Comments and Questions. We all need to fill this in as Council needs to ensure there is community support for this proposal. Council will collate these surveys and hold an extraordinary meeting on 31 January.

If positive, they will move to the next phase of negotiations. "It is not guaranteed to go ahead even at this stage as the nuts and bolts of the deal need to be discussed," Phil Hood said. Council envisage this process could take until 30 June 2024.

The district has really gone off in the past week with the heat taking its toll not only on the pastures but our surface water. The hot days have really put our dams under some stress and some dams that didn't fail through the drought have now dried up.

Tuesday is set to be the last hot day for a while and looking at the forecast back to normal temperatures for the next month. The rain this week leading into Christmas has really been talked up with the prediction of anywhere from 50 – 100mm over the next week and couldn't we use it. I hope this moisture eventuates for everyone as it would be the perfect Christmas present.

A community meeting was held on Monday night regarding the management of Riverview with the meeting well attended by the local community. Riverview offer a vital service to our aged care and come the 1st July 2024 if we don't find a suitable provider to manage the facility it will close its doors. Riverview employs nearly 40 people with the majority being local and our residents would in turn have to find a new aged care facility in another town. It's been twelve months that Riverview has been looking for a new facility provider and thus far have not been successful. If we don't want our local council to run the facility then it will close. We really don't have much of a choice if we are intending on keeping this great local aged care service open.

The first cyclone of the season, cyclone Jasper, has drenched Far North Queensland in a deluge of rain and flooded large areas from Cairns north. All major roads heading north have been cut off to urgent supplies as people wait for essential items like food, water and fuel. Four months of rain has fallen in 24 hours as the tropical low continues to move through. Hopefully the water will recede quickly, and things can back to normal before Christmas. The far north is not the place I would like to be while it is flooding with crocodiles lurking everywhere.

Good news for our beef and sheep markets with China restoring the licence for three facilities to export back into China after being suspended three years ago. All three plants are in the south and interestingly they are both sheep and beef plants. Six plants including one in northern NSW and the other five being in southern Queensland still have their licence suspended but I would image it is only a matter of time before they reinstate more plants. It seems to me that the cheap protein from other countries is drying up, like the USA. China as we know are hungry for protein with a massive middle class of people. The outlook for both the sheep and beef market seem to be looking up for 2024 after a tough 2023.

The first fat cattle and sheep sale in Tamworth will be held on the 8 January while AuctionsPlus will hold its first usual Friday cattle sales on 5 January. It's weaner sale time in the south with in-excess of 40,000 weaner cattle set to hit the market in early January and no doubt they would be sweating on everyone getting some rain.

As we close out the year and head into the Christmas New Year break, I think it is vital you all take a well-earned break from what has been a relentless year. We have all had our challenges with the rising cost of living, continual rise of interest rates, a drier than normal year and the fall of the beef and sheep markets that our district rely so heavily on. Throughout all the negatives we still live in a wonderful country and there are plenty of positives to take away from 2023. I wish you all a Merry Christmas and have a safe and happy New Year.



Now they have a beautiful bright, mural to inspire their work when classes re-commence in 2024.




50 years with CWA


