Bridge closure next week

The Blue Hogan bridge over the Apsley River in town will be closed next week for essential maintenance work.

The work will be carried out by Transport for NSW from Monday 4 March until Friday 8 March and will involve joint repair, cleaning flood debris, scour protection work and general maintenance

The work will be carried out between 6:30am and 5pm and is expected to take one week to complete, weather permitting.

It is advisable to avoid the bridge if possible and use alternate routes via Middle Street bridge.

Traffic across the bridge will be reduced to single lane, alternating traffic flow arrangements between 9am and 3pm for the safety of workers and motorists. Parking directly adjacent to the bridge will be reduced during work hours.

Transport for NSW expressed their thanks for our patience during the week while they carry out this essential work.

around the traps 😝

The weather pattern doesn't seem to be changing and I would sound like a broken record, but the rain was once again patchy over the weekend. Some people were lucky enough to yield almost 4 inches for the entire week, with the highest of totals hitting 40mm in a storm on Saturday. All reports Yarrowitch is having a wonderful start to the year with paddocks now too wet to sow. It really doesn't take a lot of moisture to make bare country too wet to get on, but frustrating when you're counting on planting feed for winter. Paddocks are short but the livestock have handled the variable season quite well with a lot of producers beginning to early wean calves and reduce numbers for the long winter ahead.

We've spoken constantly about the current cost of living crisis and amid the price gauging claims by our big supermarket retailers, Woolworths have just released a \$944 million half year profit. Woolworths are claiming the profit is driven by an increase in sales with their online sales growing rapidly, up 27 per cent year on year. It will be interesting to see what the ACCC Inquiry uncovers, but no matter what supermarket retailer, butcher shop or fresh fruit grocer you shop at, you never see a large variance in price, and they all have their specials, especially seasonal produce. If you can shop locally, your money stays within the local community to an extent, you're supporting local jobs and businesses who support our local community.

Western districts of Victoria are under fire threat with a bush fire burning out of control near Ballarat. We haven't seen any bushfires since October last year, when it seemed all of Queensland was on fire before the weather changed for the better. A last bite of summer will make things difficult for the Victorians with temperatures expected to reach high thirties in the coming days with strong winds. Six homes and 20,000 hectares have already been burnt with the conditions set to be the worst bushfire conditions since 2020. We are also expecting the temperature to rise here towards the weekend nudging close to the mid-thirties on Saturday.

Farmers in Brussels, Belgium have clashed with police spraying them with liquid manure, and throwing eggs and flares at them due to the red tape and competition from cheap imports from other countries. The Belgian farmers need to meet the high standards of the European Union to produce and supply their produce. 900 tractors drove into Brussels in protest, which is the second time they have done this. The policies the farmers need to abide by are ridiculous, coupled with the rising cost of production, poor farm gate prices and rising tax costs are slowing killing the farming ways throughout the EU. It will be an interesting space to watch in the coming 12 months and the farmers protest is far from over - I hope it yields results and it's great to see farmers sticking together and fighting for their way of life.

Numbers in the saleyards seem to be slowly dropping as we move closer to Autumn. The general Autumn sell-off may have already begun six weeks earlier this year with numbers swelling throughout the saleyard system during February. Tamworth yarded 1,540 cattle on Monday with the reduced numbers all selling to dearer trends. Light restocker weaners made up the lost ground from the previous week, with steers selling to 400c/kg while heifers sold to 345c/kg. Yearling cattle to feed sold to 358c/kg for steers, while heifers improved by 10c/ kg and topped at 325c/kg. Heavy export steers to process topped at 305c/kg while cows rebounded by 16c/kg and topped at 275c/kg.

Further south, Wagga experienced similar trends and prices in their Monday cattle market which yarded only 4,220 head of cattle. 3,735 sheep and lambs were yarded in Tamworth on Monday, half the yarding of the previous week. Well finished trade and export lambs sold to dearer trends with the trade weight topping at \$162 and the extra heavy lambs making to \$250 per head. A smaller yarding of mutton meet strong competition with well finished mutton topping at \$75.


Outgoing President, Christine Hamel thanked the Club members for their support and encouragment during her time as President.

'We want to have a Skin Check Truck in every State and Territory around Australia' Jay commented, and the wheels are already in motion to get the next truck on the road. February 14 saw the team, along with partners Mole Map, trek to Parliament House to meet with Federal Health Minister, Mark Butler, to discuss the recent submission for funding towards another truck.

The Walcha Show Society is excited to have the Australian Skin Cancer Truck not only coming to the 2024 Show, 8-9 March, but also to have it going for a spin in its first ever Grand Parade. It is a fantastic opportunity to spread awareness about skin health and to remember those who have sadly lost their battle to melanoma, particularly the 88 faces residing on each side of the truck.

All you need to do to book yourself in for a check is turn up with a phone in hand, scan a QR code, add a few details and wait in line until it's your turn to enter the truck. 'We have people lined up waiting to see us before we even get to each location' Jay said when talking about the Truck, so be ready to head on down to the Walcha Showground to get yourself in line for your free skin check!

Mayoral Column

RIVERVIEW

First cab off the rank this week is the progress of negotiations between Council and Presbyterian Aged Care to take over operations of the Riverview Aged Care Facility.



We now have a Council Resolution to proceed and have made initial contact with Presbyterian Aged Care (Sydney) to agree on the proposal that will subsequently form the contract for business transfer. Council are engaging the services of a specialist legal firm with experience in this area in order to guide us through the contractual part of the process. This will come at a cost, but it's important that Council 'get it right' and manage our risk appropriately. This is also not a fast path but we need to be sure that all possibilities are covered and Council is not left exposed to financial or operational risk through poor planning. Having said this, Council are committed to progressing this pathway as quickly as practicable to give confidence to staff, residents and community.

ORIGIN ENERGY

The news last week that Origin Energy has purchased Walcha Energy, the proponent that is developing the Ruby Hills Wind Project and Salisbury Solar at Uralla, shows the commercial interest in developing these projects. Probably one of the larger entities involved in the energy sector, Origin's arms reach into coal fired power (Eraring Power Station), coal seam gas, wind and solar generation. In a meeting Council General Manager, Phil Hood, and myself had with them last week they committed to being consultative with the community as they take the Ruby Hills Project along the path. Still in the scoping stage there is a long way to go.

The Winterbourne Wind Project owned by Vestas still sits with the Department of Planning as submissions are answered which will be followed by a determination by the Department and onto the Independent Planning Commission for public meetings.



While this project follows the State Significant pathway Walcha Council in conjunction with Uralla Shire has been in negotiations with Vestas refining the Voluntary Planning Agreement (VPA). These are legal documents and must be negotiated between developers and in this case each Council. The intended outcome of a complicated and firmly negotiated process is to deliver benefits to a community impacted by a development and developer. The draft VPA will be tabled at Council very soon, prior to public exhibition for public comment before being signed and implemented.

There is a lot of information in relation to the how's, why's and requirements of VPA's on the Department of Planning's website. Anyone who wishes to be informed can find answers there. The funds secured through the Winterbourne Wind VPA would be considered a Community Benefit Fund (CBF), and will be allocated after consultation with the community through a process covered in the VPA.

CAPITAL WORKS

At our last meeting Council awarded the contracts for the rehabilitation of Walsh Street and Middle Street (from Bridge to Fitzroy Street) and work should begin soon.

The Tender for the Derby Street rehabilitation both north and south is advertised and will progress to construction soon after the Women's World Sand Green Golf tournament in April.

If all goes well the Tender for the Darjeeling Road Pathway should be posted by the end of the week. With a total value of around \$9 million these projects will bring massive benefits to our community. Although there will be some disruption during the delivery phase, especially along Derby Street, the outcome will be well worth it.

The long needed pipeline to connect John Oxley Oval amenities (and Beaver Place) to the town sewer continues to snake its way to a connection point and will eliminate an issue that has plagued the facilities at that oval for years.

WALCHA ANTIQUE MACHINERY & TRUCK SHOW

Anyone who was fortunate enough to see the street procession or attend this event at the Showground must have been amazed at the outcome of 12 months of organisation that culminated in a great weekend. The vast array of trucks and machinery etc that built communities like Walcha, and continues to drive them, was fascinating. That so much of this has survived and is still functional allowed many generations an insight into the past and enabled those who used some of this an opportunity to reminisce.

Businesses I spoke to were elated with the increase in trade this event brought and are eager to see it return next year. To the organising committee, who I am constantly told was led capably and competently by Megan Tisdell, thank you for not only bringing a great event to Walcha but giving our residents an opportunity to relive the past for a while.

WALCHA SHOW

On the subject of the Showground our local Show is only 10 days away and will once again be the spectacle we have become accustomed to. The recent rain (although patchy) should see the grounds in excellent condition and the committee has lined up 2 days of fun filled and educational entertainment. The addition of the skin cancer bus with the opportunity for residents to have that check-up we keep putting off is a great community outcome.

Sheree and I were privileged to attend the announcing of the Zone 4 NSW Young Woman in Tamworth recently at which Emily Scrivener represented Walcha with grace and style and we believe was unlucky not to proceed to Sydney. You did your community proud Emily and I'm sure the experience will be invaluable.

This Show also follows what is a busy time for Walcha events. The Races, blessed with fine weather was its usual spectacle of fashion and fun. The work that goes into any of these events by small dedicated committees is unbelievable and should be applauded by us. It's great to see the town abuzz with people that these events bring into our community.

Following on from a successful Motorcycle Rally in November last year and combined with campdrafting and a rodeo there has been plenty of entertainment this year.
