around the traps 💦

The trees are already starting to turn, and the weather sure feels like Autumn has arrived after a short but hot weekend. The temperature hit mid-thirties for the first couple of days of Autumn but I'd say it will be our last burst of heat before we count down the days to our first frost which could happen anytime from now onwards. I hope we can hold off lighting fires until after Anzac Day which would give us another 8 weeks of growth, especially the newly sown crops around the district. Judging by the look of the large number of sprayed-out paddocks I'd say everyone has sown more annual crops to try and get through winter as our paddocks aren't holding much grass volume.

I travelled west to the Horton Valley mid last week and I must say they are having an incredible season. Tropical pasture is bonnet high on the vehicle and the lucerne paddocks are fresh and lush with feed. The season as you head back towards Tamworth got drier with Attunga and Tamworth looking like they'd missed all the rain from the previous month. We are not alone with the patchiness of the season which seems to be widespread. I was told the same thing about the western country and that the heat had dried off what moisture they had. After the temperature hitting above forty on the weekend the producers will be looking for another fall of rain before they begin to sow.

The Saturday Telegraph wrote an interesting story about the current and future risk profile of NSW homes to coastal erosion, fires and floods. Believe it or not Walcha made the top 10 list for flooding with 42 per cent of properties believed to be at high risk to flooding, both now and in 30 years. It's not rocket science to see if we are to get a one in 100-year event in the Walcha district, especially the Aspley River catchment that the town would be under threat. You only have to have seen the amount of rain that fell in those super storms that affected Lismore. The levee banks were built back in the sixties, and it hasn't been in the town since but who knows what a 1 in 100-year event would do. If you have a home in these low-lying areas that have a high risk of flooding then no doubt your insurance would be through the roof, which sadly not everyone can afford.

Weaner cattle have started to come forth in the markets as producers begin to off-load before winter and try to get ahead of the numbers that are about to hit the system. The first of the weaners have been met with strong competition with the best of the steer weaners selling from \$1200-1300 per head and the heifer portion \$900-1000. Tamworth to Tenterfield and west to Gunnedah, more than 40,000 weaners will hit the open market over the next 5 weeks including those who sell online. It would be great to see some rain over the next month to help keep the prices firm and if the western graziers get rain and can get a crop in, we might just see the market get dearer.

Congratulations to local seedstock producers Ben Nevis Angus after an Angus bull sold for \$230,000 in Victoria last week who was sired by a bull that Ben Nevis Angus bred right here in Walcha. Local breeders Mitch and Suzie Crawford, Baringa Pastoral also deserve a mention as they were awarded champion carcase at the 2024 Beef Spectacular. This is not the first time Baringa Pastoral have tasted success in these competitions and it just goes to show what quality producers we have in the Walcha district.

The annual Walcha Show is just days away and no doubt everyone is in full preparation for the local competitions at the show. There is no more hotly contested event than the men's cake cooking competition, no doubt there are plenty of ovens in full swing this week. The bragging rights for the district's best lamb producer will be put to the test in the lamb judging competition while I always enjoy watching the dog jump in front of the bar. The Walcha Show is just an outstanding community event and I think we can all agree that it's an event the entire town and local community look forward to each year.

New eNVD web and app

This week an improved LPA electronic National Vendor Declaration (eNVD) web and app system was launched.

Developed in response to industry feedback, 13 new features designed to make eNVDs easier to use and more accessible to a broader range of supply chain users, including agents, transporters, saleyards, feedlots and processors, are now available.

What's new for the eNVD?

- Simplified access to eNVDs it is now possible to go straight to your eNVDs through the myMLA dashboard.
- Broader supply chain access A broader range of supply chain users can now access the eNVD web-based system. This includes transporters, agents, saleyards, feedlots, processors and other receivers.
- Ability to add comments All supply chain users can now comment on consignments. This is a useful communication tool for producers to use if they wish to provide additional information about the animals in the consignment. Transporters can also use this feature when collecting or dropping livestock off out of hours or to clarify a headcount discrepancy.
- Ability to grant third-party access This means consignments can be viewed and shared along the supply chain.
- Adding attachments Easy attachment of food safety and statutory declarations in both the web and app systems is now available. Anyone with permission to view the consignment will be able to view these documents.
- Easy switch between PICs Producers with multiple PICs who
 are registered with myMLA and have linked all their accounts
 will be able to see their PICs in the eNVD web system without
 having to log into each account separately.

 eNVD web-based system users you can now access eNVDs directly through your personalised myMLA dashboard.
 Once you are on your myMLA dashboard, click on the eNVD tile or access eNVD by using the 'Linked Services' dropdown.


Draft Native Vegetation Regulatory map expanded release for Central West, Central Tablelands, North Coast and Northern Tablelands Local Land Services Regions

The Local Land Services Act and Regulation require preparation and publication of a Native Vegetation Regulatory Map. A staged release of the draft Native Vegetation Regulatory map commenced on 5 October 2022. Region 4 is now released for the Central West, Central Tablelands, North Coast and Northern Tablelands Local Land Services Regions.

The draft NVR map is a tool landholders can use when considering how best to manage native vegetation on their land. It does not impose any new legal obligations. The map provides certainty when determining whether an approval is or isn't required.

A free review of the draft map as it relates to your land is available now or at any time in the future. The review will normally be completed in 40 days. Landholders in all regions can request a free map review at any time, even when the map is finalised.
