Steph qualifies for National Championships

Walcha athlete Steph Blake will compete against the best runners in Australia next month when she lines up in the 400 metre event at the National Championships in Adelaide.

The 14 year old, who turns 15 this weekend, was competing in the Under 16 age group at the NSW Athletics State Junior Championships to qualify for the Nationals. Representing Armidale Athletics Club, Steph ran an astounding 59.75 seconds for 400 metres, placing her second in the heat and 7th in the final in a time which qualified her for the National Championships.

Steph showed her versatility at the State Championships, also competing in the 800 metres where she placed 6th in a time of 2:23.06, as well as placing 11th in the State in long jump. This impressive result in the 800 metres has encouraged Steph to focus more of her training on this distance and the future is looking very bright for her. This result at the State Championships is only one second off the pace for the qualifying time to Nationals, winning her heat by 50 metres!

Steph will warm up for the National Championships by competing this weekend at the State Little Athletics Championships at Olympic Park in Sydney. She will compete in the 200 metres, 400 metres, 800 metres and long jump.

This is the second year Steph has qualified for the Nationals, running in Perth last year where she placed 9th in the 400 metres.

Her father Stuart will accompany her to the National Championships which will be held at the South Australian Athletics Stadium in Adelaide from 11 - 19 April.



How good was the rain on Monday with falls of between 20-60mm falling around the district. It's a relief that we still can get a widespread fall of over an inch and the moisture looks to be building again for next week. Tropical cyclone Megan has made landfall in the Gulf of Carpentaria causing widespread flooding and damage with rain totals expected to exceed 300mm in parts of the Barkly and Carpentaria regions. It's this exact system which may track south into Queensland and NSW bringing widespread rain next week which would be a welcome backup to this weeks fall. Looking at the crop paddocks around the district it has sparked some colour back into the plants and given us all hope that we might grow some kind of feed before the depths of winter.

I've been having a lot of conversations around town with people who are very concerned about the new water supply and why the water is brown that's coming out of the taps. I was driving past the town water reserves late last week and noticed just how low the dam was getting that supplies town water, and it explains why we are still on water restrictions. The new pump is currently being installed that supplies water to town from the Macdonald River and our newly built storage dam. The old pump had been removed before the new pump could be installed but the calculations would have been completed that we will have plenty of water in town while we wait for the new water supply. Interestingly, I've been told numerous times that there is a lot of green grass below the new dam and I'm sure everyone understands how dry it has been, but I wonder if the new dam is leaking and if so, can it be fixed? New dams can leak, especially depending on what ground they are constructed on and what type of soil they are made with. Sometimes they can fix themselves, but some dams will never hold water.

Australian feeder cattle could soon be making their way on a boat to the United States as soon as next year. This has never been done before but looking at the possibilities lying ahead for the US, it may be financially viable to do so if three factors all align. High US beef prices, low Australian beef price in comparison, and our currency needs to be low compared to the US dollar to make this feasible. I don't think this will happen as it costs around \$1200 per head to freight a beast and \$500 in quarantine fees associated with every animal delivered.

Last week the EYCI dropped 38c/kg due to a tightening of the season and the extra supply of weaners coming onto the markets. As quickly as it has dropped, I think we could see it lift with a decent widespread fall of rain which may just happen next week. Armidale had advertised 2500 weaners on Monday and only yarded just on 1500 as producers weigh up the risk of waiting and seeing what the next few weeks bring. Light weaner heifers look to be very buyable in the weaner sales as they struggle to make \$500. AuctionsPlus cattle saw a tough week also with a clearance rate of just 36 per cent across all the cattle listed for sale. The northern tablelands of NSW had less than a 10% clearance rate of what was listed in that area which reflects just how marginal our season has been and the bleak look ahead for winter feed reserves.

1970 head of cattle were yarded in Tamworth on Monday with the majority of the yarding selling to cheaper trends. Weaner steers bucked this trend and sold as much as 20c/kg dearer for the better-quality calves topping at 360c/kg. Weaner heifers topped at 289c/kg; feeder steers made to 355c/kg while the heifer portion topped at 298c/kg. Heavy fat cows dropped by 7c/kg and topped at 225c/kg. 5500 sheep and lambs sold to a firm market in Tamworth with young trade weight lambs topping at \$150, heavy exports lambs made to \$230 while the mutton market topped at \$90 of XB ewes.


