Wonderful week of golf in Walcha

In what would have to be the biggest week in the history of the Walcha Golf Club, the inaugaral World Sandgreen Championships for women were held last Wednesday and Thursday preceded by a Pro-Am on Tuesday and then followed by the NSW Veterans Sandgreen Championships last weekend.

Welsh player Lydia Hall became the first Womens World Sandgreen Champion when she carded 140 (72, 68) for the 36 holes to finish just a stroke ahead of Thailand teenager Cholcheva Wongras 141 (72, 69).

Locals Julie Presnell, Don Brooks and Doug McDonald teamed up with professional Sarah Yamaki Branch to win the Pro-Am four person ambrose event after they accumulated 104 points. Sneaking home by a point from former NSW Sandgreen Champions Peter Norbury and Wayne Brennan, motorbike legend Casey Stoner and their professional Danni Vasquez Boyd on 103 points.

Last Sunday eight time local club champion Simeon Cross and Donna Martin won the 2024 NSW Veterans Mixed Open Scratch event after registering 61 (29,32) after they took out the Nett Division of the event last year.

Runners up the scratch were Willy Brennan and Margaret Davidson on 59 (29,30) after they won the 2023 scratch on 56 (29,27).

This years Nett Division went to Sally McCormack and Toukley member of Chris Bowen on 90 (46,44) ahead of runners up Steph Sweeney and Julie Olrich 87 (45,42) on countback from Don Brooks and Sue Partridge 87 (46,41).

Club President Allan Green described the five days of competition as magnificent and said the Golf Club wasn't the only beneficiary, the whole town was highlighted through NSW Golf releases and Channel 7Plus telecasts. (More results in 'At the 19th').



around the traps 🔧

The news regarding the attack in Sydney over the weekend was just horrific and hard to understand that someone could harm innocent lives including a baby. Mental health illness is an escalating issue around Australia and something that the government really needs to continue to address with support. It's just so sad that it takes an appalling event such as the one on the weekend to really highlight this disease. Condolences are with those families who lost loved ones who should have never been lost.

The country has responded well to the last rainfall event and even though there were a few slight frost reports last week I think we are safe for a little while longer. The country down off the hill has turned a vivid green since the rain and parts of the northwest have forage crops starting to fire. Speaking with a hay producer at Attunga last week he mentioned that the heavy dews are making it near impossible since the rain to dry hay and he thought the hay season may be near its end. Those parts did receive more than 100mm so it is no doubt there would be plenty of soil moisture making it hard to make hay but ideal to get crops growing. There is a chance of some more moisture this week, but it looks to be patchy, and the forecast is backing off.

The latest beef price forecast looks to be bullish as an industry specialist states the beef market could near double in the coming years for Australian producers. Tight global supply and increased demand will push these values up dramatically and I only mentioned last week about our grinding beef price rise into the USA. Prices domestically in the USA just this week have hit record levels, and he is of the opinion that the price will continue to rise over the next 3 years until it meets a stable price environment. Increased values for beef trimmings mean the price paid for a whole carcass will rise, which will then lift the prices paid at the farm gate. He states that feeder prices could exceed 600c/kg in 2026/2027. The environment will obviously play a huge part in these prices but the forecast for the second half of the year looks good for us, and the USA is looking towards another dry period.

A lift in livestock values and a sustained farm gate price for your livestock will also help with property values. Interest is a lot lower compared to 2 years ago and rightfully so after we saw 50 per cent of the value of our beef herd and sheep flock wiped off, a dry season and an increase in interest rates. I believe we will see a gradual rise in the interest in rural property over the next few years due to global protein demand and hopefully a run of better seasons to go with it.

It's great to see our rural roads getting some upgrading and repairs but after you see the amount of roadworks going on along the east coast it's easy to see where all the money is being spent. If you haven't been to Raymond Terrace lately then you wouldn't realise the extent of roadworks currently being undertaken. The amount of fill, aggregate and concrete being laid to bypass Raymond Terrace is just mind boggling. It made me think just how many kilometres of rural road that would improve for the rural taxpayers of our country.

Competition for weaner cattle this week came off the boil with prices for weaner cattle in Armidale back 20-40c/kg across the board on Monday. Last Friday Tamworth store sale was much the same after excessive numbers over the last month exceeded demand. Fat cattle sales followed a similar trend with Wagga quoting cows back 20-40c/ kg from the week previous while feeder cattle softened by 5-15c/kg from the previous week. Tamworth resulted in similar trends with the best of the cows topping at 230c/kg, feeder steers to 360c/kg and the heifer portion sold to 318c/kg. Tamworth yarded 4300 sheep and lamb; trade weight lambs topped at \$155 while heavy exports made to \$228. Light weight mutton sold to cheaper trends with light condition Merinos making a little as their skin value while well condition heavy mutton topped made from \$60-\$80 per head.



Walcha, let's come together and talk about the rollout of renewables on the Walcha plateau and how the wind projects and transmission lines will affect you.


Nick Cater is keen to talk to Walcha and learn about the impact of renewable developments in a small town and share these findings with the wider public. This is an important opportunity for Walcha.


94th birthday at Apsley Falls


