MEMBERS OF THE GREATEST GENERATION TO GATHER AT THE WORLD WAR II MEMORIAL ON V-E DAY TO COMMEMORATE ANNIVERSARY OF THE END OF THE WAR

WASHINGTON, D.C. – The Friends of the National World War II Memorial (Friends) and the National Park Service (NPS) will pay tribute to the Greatest Generation during a special event at the National World War II Memorial in Washington, D.C. on Thursday, May 8, 2014 at 11:00 a.m. commemorating the 69th anniversary of the Allied Forces Victory in the Atlantic and the end of World War II in Europe.

Chairman of the House Committee on Homeland Security Congressman Michael McCaul of Texas will give remarks. Congressman McCaul's father served as a B-17 Bombadier Navigator in the Army Air Corps during World War II. Susan Eisenhower, the granddaughter of President Dwight D. Eisenhower who served as the Supreme Allied Commander in Europe during World War II, will read General Eisenhower's May 8, 1945 "Victory Order of the Day."

Sixteen World War II veterans visiting the Memorial with the Old Glory Honor Flight of Wisconsin will lay wreaths at the Freedom Wall, along with Congressman McCaul and Ms. Eisenhower and other honored WWII veterans and guests.

Robert Vogel, Superintendent of the National Mall and Memorial Parks, will speak on behalf of NPS. Friends Chairman retired Army Lieutenant General Mick Kicklighter will speak on behalf of Friends. Robert Kelley, a member of the Friends Board of Directors, will act as the Master of Ceremonies.
