## NEARLY A DOZEN D-DAY AND WWII VETERANS TO COMMEMORATE 74<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF D-DAY AT WORLD WAR II MEMORIAL

Wreaths will be laid at the Atlantic Arch of the Memorial in memory of the 9,000 Allied soldiers killed or wounded during the invasion.

**Washington, D.C.** – On Wednesday, June 6<sup>th</sup> at 11:00 a.m., the Friends of the National World War II Memorial will host a brief ceremony and wreath presentation at the World War II Memorial's Atlantic Arch to commemorate the 74 years since 160,000 Allied troops landed along a 50-mile stretch of heavily fortified French coastline to fight Nazi Germany on the beaches of Normandy, France

Friends chairman Josiah Bunting III will provide remarks. Mr. Bunting is a Vietnam veteran, Rhodes Scholar, and former superintendent of his alma mater, the Virginia Military Institute.

During the ceremony, Megan Rosener will perform the song "Heroes," which was written by her father Marty Rosener in tribute to World War II veterans. A portion of the proceeds from sale of the song will go to the Friends' FDR D-Day Prayer campaign. Friends has been charged with the immense and honored responsibility of designing and funding the addition of President Franklin Roosevelt's D-Day Prayer to the Memorial, as mandated by Congressional legislation signed into law by President Obama in 2014.

As part of the ceremony, approximately ten WWII and D-Day veterans will place wreaths at the Atlantic Arch of the World War II Memorial in memory of the 9,000 Allied soldiers killed or wounded during the invasion.

Following the ceremony, several of the WWII will participate in a brief ceremony honoring them and commemorating D-Day at Nationals Park preceding the baseball game at 1:05 p.m. on June 6<sup>th</sup> (Washington Nationals vs. Tampa Bay Rays).
