The Bachelor of Science degree in Biblical Studies is designed for working adults over 24 years of age who have completed approximately two years of undergraduate studies, typically concentrating on required general studies course work.

- 2. A detailed understanding of Christian theology.
- 3. Ability to defend biblical truth and the Christian faith.
- 4. Practice of proper methodology for interpreting and applying the English Bible.
- 5. Skill in communicating the teaching and application of a biblical passage.
- 6. Commitment to growth in Christian character and lifestyle.
- 7. English Bible: In-depth knowledge of specific areas of Bible and Christian theology

Required Coursework

Emmaus Global Campus courses are 100% online courses. Two or more courses are offered each 8-week term. Individuals taking two courses each term can finish in twelve 8-week terms, or two years.
