	Re	quest for Letters of Recommendations	
		Confirm your list of recommenders. Most colleges require recommendation letters from a guidance counselor and at least 2 subject-teachers.	
		Reach out to additional recommenders (internship supervisor, volunteer leader, coach, peer recommender, etc.) as a supplemental recommender.

		Work together with your parents to fill out the FAFSA and CSS forms for financial aid in the United States.	
		Find and compare University <b>Scholarships</b> worldwide by country, field of study, or university name.
