Practicum: Applied Research for Organizational Change

Applied research is a participatory, emergent, inquiry, systems thinking process that drives organizational change. Klingenstein Center graduate students conduct applied research and consulting in partner schools under the supervision of Teachers College professors as Practicum coursework.

All phases of the applied research cycle are done collaboratively with stakeholders to create buy-in, engagement, and sustainability for change.
