Definitions

Immigrants: leave home primarily for economic or social reasons.

Refugees: flee due to war or a well-founded fear of persecution based on race, religion, nationality, social or political reasons.

- Domestic Violence








What Barriers do Immigrant and Refugee Women Face in seeking help?

 - Address mistrust of legal system
 - Provide client assistance with obtaining visas
 - Create a dialogue with immigration officials
