Principal Adverse Impacts Statement 2022

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Document integrating the expected elements pursuant to the provisions of Article 29 of the Energy-Climate Act and Article 4 of European Regulation 2019/2088 known as SFDR for the year 2022 (data as of 31/12/2022)

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Meanings Capital Partners takes into consideration the principal adverse impacts of its investment decisions on sustainability factors. This document is the consolidated 2022 principal adverse impacts ("PAI") statement covering investments made by funds managed by Meanings Capital Partners.

The present PAI statement is produced voluntarily. It covers the period from January 1st to December 31st, 2022 and integrates investments (companies and real estate assets) held for at least six months as of December 31st, 2022.

The information presented in this statement exclusively relates to the institutional funds managed by Meanings Capital Partners and excludes managed mandates, for which information could not be collected. These institutional funds account for 89% of Meanings Capital Partners's assets under management for the year 2022.

Meanings Capital Partners considers the impacts of its investments on environmental and social sustainability factors at each stage of its investment cycle, as detailed in the Sustainability Policy of the management company, accessible on its website and summarized below.
