MAYOR'S CORNER

At our LHH City Council meeting on May 9, I had the honor of presenting to outgoing Mayor Dennis Laherty a city lapel pin



designed and made by local jeweler Lance Geiger, who grew up in the Heights and still has family living here. This pin is given to an outgoing mayor only once, even though he or she may have served as mayor multiple times. (For me, it was an honor to receive the lapel pin back in 2011.)

I also had the privilege of presenting a plaque to show our city's appreciation to Los Angeles County Sheriff's Deputy Dan Deville, who will soon be retiring. Dan has been our deputy for more than eight years, and he has always done his job in a very personable and professional way. He will be missed. Deputy Clifford Chu, who is replacing Dan, was introduced to the council. We look forward to working with him.

The council adopted Municipal Code Ordinance 2022-02 into the La Habra Heights Municipal Code to help reduce organic waste disposal in accordance with state requirements (see my April "Mayor's Corner" in *Heights Life*). Because this ordinance will impact trash service pickup for Heights residents, *Guac Talk*, the city's free e-newsletter, will provide more information in the near future. If you haven't yet signed up for *Guac Talk*, I encourage you to do so at *lhhcity.org*.

Back in January, the home of a Heights resident was severely damaged by fire (see the March issue of *Heights Life* for details). The resident asked the city council for a temporary use permit to put a trailer in his yard that he can live in while rebuilding his house. He laid out a detailed plan showing that his rebuilding process will have minimal impact on other residents, and he presented a petition signed by his neighbors, all of whom approved his request—which confirmed what I have long believed: that La Habra Heights is all about friendly, caring and compassionate people. The council approved his request with some conditions, and we wish him the best during this difficult time.

The city thanks La Habra Heights Improvement Association for replacing, repairing and painting the doors on the gym at The Park. LHHIA board member Monica Gunns volunteered to oversee the project. It really makes a difference, and the new "shamrock green" color is quite attractive. The council will soon recognize this civic-minded work in a more formal way.

On behalf of my colleagues on the council, I offer our sincere congratulations to this year's graduates from La Habra Heights (see page 10). Your accomplishments—especially in the midst of a pandemic—are a source of great pride for our entire community, and we wish you every success in the future.

uesday, June 21, is is the first day of summer and the Summer Solstice, the day with the longest period of sunlight all year. With longer daylight hours, we'll likely be spending plenty of time outdoors with family and friends to celebrate Father's Day, graduations and maybe even a traditional June wedding or two. Since kids will be home for summer break, they can give dad a well-earned day off by doing some gardening and chores, including cleaning up the barbeque grill. They can also plant some colorful flowers to attract butterflies, beneficial insects and even several delightful species of hummingbirds that buzz all around La Habra Heights in summertime.

FUN OURDOOR PROJECTS for THE WHOLE FAMILY

Plant easy-to-grow sunflowers! They grow fast, and their seeds can feed birds, chickens—and people! Plant a lovely summer butterfly garden with lots of milkweed, the culinary favorite of monarch butterflies. Look around for different kinds of caterpillars and chrysalises. Collect seeds and label the ones you find (check them out online). Trim back herbs (French tarragon, lavender, mint, oregano, rosemary, sage and thyme), save the trimmings and hang them upside-down in a cool, dark place to dry them out. Then store them in labeled jars. Keep your bird bath clean and full—birds will really appreciate it on hot, dry days—and make a list of different types of birds in your garden. You may be surprised just how many we have in the Heights! Photograph birds, insects and animals that visit your garden—you might even win a prize in the LHHIA photo contest (see page 8 for this year's winners).

SUMMER VEGETABLES & HERBS

Our bad drought conditions are probably going to get even more severe this summer, so you may need to reduce the size of your vegetable garden or even let it go fallow (not planting to let the soil "rest," which can be quite beneficial). But you can also conserve water by using a good layer of mulch, adding shade cloth and watering early in the morning to slow down evaporation. Hope for some "June gloom"!

This is the time to plant green beans, carrots, celery, collard greens, corn, cucumber, eggplant, green onions, melons, okra, parsnips, peppers, potatoes, pumpkins, radishes, rutabagas, sweet potatoes, squash, Swiss chard, tomatoes and zucchini. Sow seeds of basil, chamomile, chives, cilantro, dill, fennel, parsley and summer savory.

HEAT-LOVING ANNUAL FLOWERS

Add a splash of color to attract helpful insects, especially bees, that pollinate fruit trees and vegetables. Plant ageratum, aster, alyssum, black-eyed Susans, celosia, coreopsis, corn flowers, cosmos, dahlias, gaillardia, gomphrena, lobelia, marigolds, petunia, portulaca, saliva, snapdragons, vinca (aka Madagascar periwinkle), zinnias—and plenty of cheery sunflowers! For shady spots, plant begonias (both bedding and tuberous), caladium, coleus and impatiens (bedding and New Guinea).

BRUSH CLEARANCE & OTHER SUMMER TASKS

LHH Fire Department property inspections are underway in the Heights, so we all need to keep up on brush clearance and tree trimming to reduce fire risk. Don't forget the street frontage of your property. Remove low-hanging tree limbs and trim back all areas along pathways. Irrigate efficiently, checking for leaks and using timers. You might consider reducing or even eliminating your lawn—it's a tough choice, but we all need to find ways to conserve water. Deeply water trees and large shrubs instead of irrigating them a couple of times a week. Lightly water cacti and succulents. Some California native plants will start to go "summer dormant," so leave them alone until the fall.


