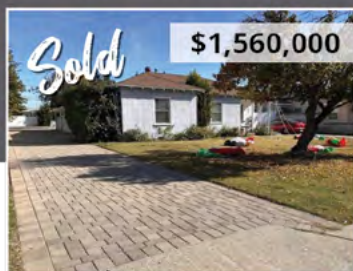

MAYOR'S CORNER

Traffic signal update

The city council approved a bid of \$946,487 from Crosstown Electrical & Data to install a new traffic signal at Avocado Crest and to stripe Hacienda Road. Completion is tentatively scheduled for this November. Although a grant covers a large portion of the total, some costs will have to come out of the general fund, including engineering and inspection fees and a 15 percent contingency.

If you've noticed flashing red lights on East Road, it may be because rodents have been burrowing under pull boxes and diligently chewing on signal wires. Rewiring and preventive upgrades are underway.

February storm damage reimbursement

Our staff has been assessing hillside conditions and long-term damage to our community from the devastating February storms. On May 7, staff members attended a briefing by the State Office of Emergency Services concerning potential reimbursement to our city for storm damage. Paperwork for this, as well as for the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), is daunting.

The city spent several hundred thousand dollars during and immediately after the storms to deal with mud, street closures and cleanup. At its May 13 meeting, the city council approved an initial \$90,000 project for repairing damaged infrastructure after receiving bids for grind-and-overlay and berm replacement on sections of East Road, Fullerton Road, West Road and Le Flore Drive. This is only a small portion of initial estimates of at least \$3.4 million needed to repair roads and public facilities.

Firewise workshop and storm video

Visit the city's website (lhcity.org), click on *Agendas and Minutes* and go down the table on the left column to the entry for the *May 4 Firewise meeting*. Click on *Video* in the right column. In addition to interesting Firewise content, about 15 minutes into the presentation you'll see a large collection of resident videos and photos documenting the unprecedented storms that inundated the Heights in early February (stay for the credits to find out how many of your neighbors contributed). You'll see some harrowing scenes, including a truck almost getting hit by a falling tree!

You'll also learn about the current fire insurance situation from Kwan Lee, our Emergency Preparedness Committee chairperson, and receive a Fire Department update from Deputy Chief Ed Martin. These Firewise workshops are extremely interesting and helpful, and you should make a point of attending the next one in about 60 days.

House fire on Vista Road



LHH Fire Department photos



Fire severely damaged a house on Vista Road on May 5. LHH Fire Department arrived first on the scene at 6:20 a.m. and found half of the home fully engulfed in flames. LA County Fire Department units soon arrived to assist with extinguishing the fire, which took 33 minutes. The other half of the house, which is divided by a breezeway, was

saved. Cleanup by firefighters required five hours. Residents of the home had safely evacuated before fire units arrived, and no one was injured. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

Multi-agency brushfire training held in LHH

If you noticed numerous helicopters in action above the Heights in late May, it's because firefighters from La Habra Heights, Brea, Fullerton, Santa Fe Springs, Downey and Los Angeles County Fire Department were all taking part on May 21, 22 and 24 in a major training exercise on fighting wildfires in hills like ours. Ground participants were in the Lupin Hill area to practice managing fires in brushy terrain 24 hours a day, and air-support crews put our recently dedicated Heli-Hydrant to good use.

Building a La Habra Heights CERT one volunteer at a time

Albert Villagomez is a 10-year La Habra Heights resident. After witnessing a small fire near Hacienda Road, he began wondering about getting prepared for future emergency situations in the Heights. "Who will help us evacuate?" he asked himself. "How can residents help the fire department?"

"It dawned on me that I needed to get involved," Albert said. Today, as a member of the city's Emergency Planning Committee (EPC), he is working with Fire Marshal Al Alcalde to re-establish a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) for La Habra Heights—and they're currently seeking volunteers.



Certified by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), CERT training is offered free of charge by the Los Angeles County Fire Department. It includes training for disaster fire suppression, disaster medical operations and light search and rescue. The training provides residents with skills and tools necessary to take care of themselves, their families, neighbors and coworkers until emergency responders can reach them during an emergency.

Albert received his CERT Training at the Los Angeles County Fire Department Training Center in the city of Pomona. He is now partnering with the city of La Mirada, which has a robust CERT program, to learn how La Habra Heights can build a similar volunteer team.

According to Albert, CERT training enables volunteers "to help assess people's need for assistance and to learn basic first aid and evacuation skills." Well-trained CERT volunteers can also provide valuable, accurate information for first responders, increasing the speed and effectiveness of their response.

La Habra Heights is looking for 12 to 15 volunteers to take the 20-hour training course, which will consist of weekly classes offered in late summer. The goal is to have a trained CERT cohort ready before the fall fire season. It's a great way to help make our community safer while getting to know your neighbors better.

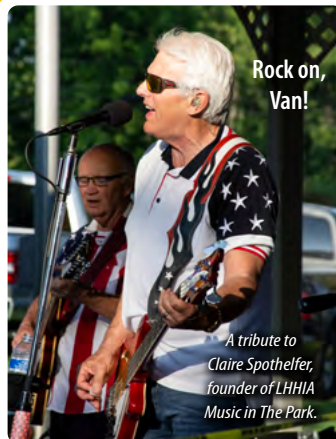

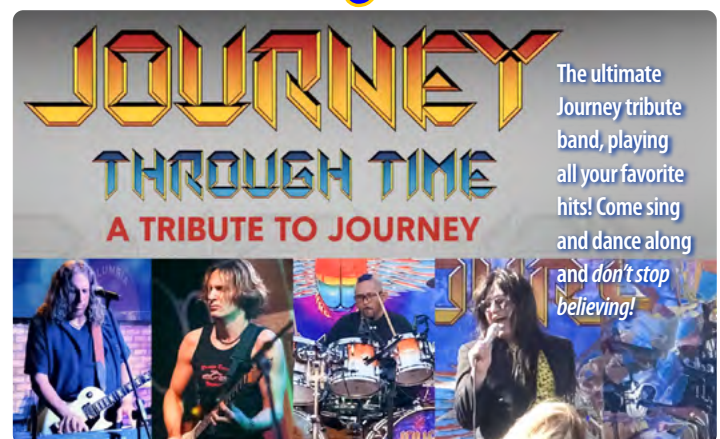

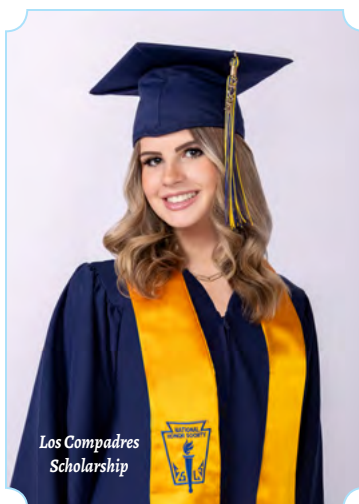

Garden Plot

Fresh Ingredients from Your Own Cuisine Gardens

Heights residents are fortunate to have such great weather to grow our own healthy, delicious vegetables and herbs that are used in numerous worldwide cuisines.

Although most vegetables and herbs require full sunlight for most of the day, some need protection from blazing heat and bright light. Cover heat-sensitive plants with shade cloth when summer temperatures rise.

Calculate how much growing space you have, and bear in mind that some plants will spread and take over your garden if you don't confine them, especially cucurbits (cucumbers, pumpkins and watermelons). Learn about plant growth characteristics on seed packs or description tags.

Prepare soil by loosening and incorporating amendments and compost. Some plants need more acidic soil. For higher yields, use organic nutrients or slow-release fertilizers. Choose a method of irrigation—furrow, sprinkler, subsurface or drip—or just water by hand. Water early in the day to reduce evaporation.

Most vegetables can be grown in straight rows for easy access. If you want a more formal-looking garden, you can plant according to a geometric design or custom layout.

Position tall-growing plants in places where their shadows won't affect lower-growing plants. Many herbs grow well in pots. Trellises, tomato cages and bean poles save space and provide support and optimal growing conditions for vining plants.

Most vegetables and some herbs are annuals that only live for one growing season. After they die, they can be replaced with other plants. Vegetable gardens change with the seasons, and they can be combined with specific cuisine plants for almost continual yields.



Chutney

Chutney & Curry Garden

Chutney is a savory condiment made from slow-cooked fruits or vegetables, vinegar and spices. Originating in India, chutney recipes have traveled around the world, and every country has developed its own versions of this versatile condiment.

Curry is a dish with a sauce seasoned with flavorful spices. There are many curry varieties, mostly originating in India and South Asia.

Herbs to plant for chutneys and curries: asafetida, coriander, cumin, fenugreek, ginger, mint, mirchi (chili pepper), nigella and sesame. You'll also need tomatoes—smaller varieties like plum and cherry tomatoes are traditionally used in chutneys, but any type will work fine.

Dried curry leaf is also a key ingredient in many curries and chutneys, and you can grow your own by planting a curry leaf plant (*Murraya koenigii*), a small tree from India with highly pungent leaves. It starts out as an easy-to-care-for house plant, and when planted outside, it can grow into a tree six to 20 feet tall. Give it partial shade in summer and full sun in winter.

Italian Cuisine Garden

So many easy-to-grow vegetables and herbs are part of Italian cuisine! Basil—whether Genovese, large leaf, or many other varieties—is a must for pesto, a versatile sauce traditionally made by blending fresh basil, pine nuts, extra-virgin olive oil and Parmesan cheese. Chopping the ingredients by hand is the traditional way preferred by purists, but you can save time by using a food processor.

Other herbs to grow for Italian dishes include chicory, fennel, oregano, parsley, rosemary and thyme. Also plant these vegetables: arugula, banana and bell peppers, carrots, cucumbers, eggplants, endive, escarole, onions, radicchio, spinach, sweet peppers and, of course, plenty of tomatoes—especially Roma, San Marzano (*at right*), Rosa Sicilian, ciliegini (cherry), datterini (plum), costoluto fiorentino (heirloom beefsteak), cuore di bue (oxheart), canestrino (little basket) and numerous other delicious Italian varieties.

Salsa Garden

Guacamole could use some spice! A salsa garden is just what you need to complement avocados grown in the Heights. Plant cilantro, cumin, garlic, red and yellow onions, tomatoes and tomatillos.



Carolina Reaper peppers

Peppers! You'll need lots, and there are so many from which to choose, ranging in heat from mild to murderous! Plant (listed mild to hot) poblano, güero, jalapeño, serrano, cayenne, and habanero peppers. If you're brave, you can also plant extremely hot ones: (listed hot to hottest): Ghost, Naga Viper, Trinidad Scorpion, Komodo Dragon, Carolina Reaper (*above*) and Pepper X (currently the world's hottest, rated at 2,693,000 Scoville Heat Units; for comparison, the hottest jalapeño is 8,000 SHUs).

Fall Harvest Garden

This is the time to plant certain vegetables to be ready to harvest in the fall: pumpkins and squashes (acorn, butternut, buttercup, spaghetti and others); root vegetables (parsnips, potatoes, sweet potatoes, turnips and rutabagas); and alliums (leeks, garlic, onions and shallots).
