At noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. **34** And at three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" (which means "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?").**35** When some of those standing near heard this, they said, "Listen, he's calling Elijah." **36** Someone ran, filled a sponge with wine vinegar, put it on a staff, and offered it to Jesus to drink.
