#### 15. New and Miscellaneous Business

## a. Update regarding speed zones in the City of Elkhart

City Clerk is working with Polk County to address speed limit concerns along Walnut, east of Grant. Coordination is required with Polk County due to Farm-to-Market status of some of the streets within Elkhart.

b. Timeline for requesting applicants for new Parks and Recreation Committee City Clerk suggested that Council review the requirements for the Parks and Recreation Committee and establish direction for the committee prior to taking applications and making appointments during the regular business meeting of the City Council in January, 2018.

### c. Planning and Zoning Vacancy

A member of the Planning and Zoning Committee will be submitting their resignation in December and Council will need to fill the vacancy. City Clerk suggested taking applications and making an appointment to this board in January, 2018 at the regularly scheduled business meeting of the City Council.

### d. All-Terrain Vehicles within city limits

City Clerk notified Council of complaints about all-terrain vehicles driving within city limits. If vehicles are seen operating on City streets, residents should call Polk County Sherriff and notify City Hall.

#### e. Water Quality

The City Clerk received several complaints on Sunday, November 19<sup>th</sup> and Monday, November 20<sup>th</sup> about the water quality during the Fire Department training burn. Council discussed ways to more clearly communicate with the Fire Department, City Staff and the public during future training burns in order to allow for timely notification to residents.
