

We incorporated Science and Art to investigate the characteristics of different materials when wet and dry. We embraced the mess and had great fun creating Papier Mache hot-air balloons which are now proudly hanging in our classroom for everyone to enjoy!

In Irish this month, we were learning all things 'Bia'. We are excited to share that we have learned how to write a procedure as Gaeilge (Scríbhneoireacht Ghnásúil). We wrote a procedure on how to make a sandwich and how to make a delightful hot chocolate!

We are so happy to be playing the tinwhistle and learned 'The Rattlin' Bog' as well as 'Jingle Bells' to help us get in the festive spirit.

#### Fifth Class

November began with Science Week and we enjoyed a week packed with investigations and experiments. We took part in an Epic Explorers Space Workshop with the Science Federation of Ireland. We are focusing on Living Things at the moment in Science, so we studied all about the Amoeba through our microscopes. We followed this with a wonderful experiment on DNA!! We worked in pairs to extract and examine the DNA of a banana. During the process of extraction, we used our iPads to document the experiment and wrote up our experiment using the pictures we had taken! We finished science week by learning all about acids and bases. We took lots of common household materials and predicted and tested each of them to see which were acids and which were bases. Following this, we tested each one to see what pH they were. What a super week!!

In Literacy, we have been studying the features of Report Writing and Oral Reports. We used News2Day to help us examine the features of good reports, read lots of different types of reports and have written our own reports. We worked hard to create our own PowerPoint presentations, practised presenting them in small groups and finally presented to our whole class. Our printed PowerPoints are looking very professional in our SALF folders now. We also finished reading our class novel, Planet Earth is Blue, which we rated 10 out of 10.

We discussed some of the most important parts of the story and we created storyboards using our computers and an incredible storyboard website.

We finished our swimming lessons in U.L and received huge praise from all our instructors along with our PAWS certificates. We also concluded our Cricket workshops from Munster Cricket, which we absolutely loved! Arsalan, our instructor was very impressed with the natural skill of lots of the girls!

In Art, the handprint peacocks and finger print sunsets we painted are proudly hanging in our classroom. We also constructed CD snowmen and wool nativity star decorations for Christmas. As a final treat, we celebrated Lá na Nollag by having festive Christmas Table Quiz which was very close in the end. The music round caught lots of us out! We brought in our blankets and teddies, cuddled up and popped fresh popcorn while watching the pantomime. With weekly trips to UL for swimming lessons and also mid - week cricket classes with Arsalan from Limerick Cricket Club, we have been keeping fit and healthy. We also had a Food Dudes week in November to remind us to "try and eat a rainbow". In other words, we should try and eat as many types and colours of fruit and vegetables as possible daily.

In Literacy and SESE, we have been learning about North America. Having researched different North American States, including Massachusetts, Texas, Hawaii, Washington and New York, we used our report writing skills to compile comprehensive and interesting reports about them. Following this, in History, we learned about the Native Americans. Working in pairs, we gathered information about tribes such as the Sioux, the Cheyenne, the Inuit and the Mohawk. We presented our information on a Powerpoint presentation and shared this with the class, allowing us to practice and develop our oral reporting skills. Our poet in November was WB Yeats and we enjoyed learning his well-known poem "The Ballad of Father Gilligan."

Sa Ghaeilge, we started "scríbhneoireacht tuairisciúil" (report writing) by writing a report about where we live and we have been singing "An Chéad Nollaig", a beautiful Christmas song. To get into the Christmas spirit, we also been learning "Silent Night" and "Joy to the World" on our tinwhistles. We decided to reuse and recycle when making our Christmas decorations this year. Check out the cool snowmen we made using old jigsaw pieces! We also made festive Santas using craft sticks. This term, we have experimented with print in our Art lessons, creating unique string and bubble wrap prints.

Science Week was hugely enjoyable. We attended an online webinar hosted by the SOPHia project in UL. This project aims to encourage more students, especially girls, to take up physics as a Leaving Certificate Subject. Did you know, there is a three to one ratio of male to female students taking physics at Leaving Certificate level in Ireland at present? We did lots of interesting experiments while on the webinar and also heard about physics in the world around us. Our design and make task for the week was to design a catapult and we had great fun testing our catapults for speed, power and tower afterwards. To tie in with our Food Dudes week, we also tested for the presence of starch using iodine. There is no doubt that we have many budding scientists in Rang a Sé, with all science classes engaged in with great enthusiasm!

Chrismas truly arrived in our class with the celebration of Lá na Nollag in the school. We enjoyed a very competitive Christmas Table Quiz and the online pantomime "Little Red Riding Hood" with popcorn after. 6<sup>th</sup> class starred in our outdoor disco on the day, with an energetic performance of Ob La Di by the Beatles. In Religion, we have been learning about Advent, the Jesse tree and the Christmas Crib, so we took a trip to see our very own beautiful crib in Holy Trinity Abbey. A trip to the Heritage Centre for hot chocolate and marshmallows afterwards was a lovely way to end what has been a very busy term.
