

Pastor's Message: Blessed be the name of the Lord

It is Monday morning and as I write this we only have 6 days before my nieces Leena and Bea move to Georgia with their mother. It has been a quite a journey as Tricia went to Michigan to care for her brother, guide the girls through the loss of their father, move them to Colorado, and bring them into our family. And now, in spite of our best efforts, the courts have decided that the girls need to live with their mother. It will not be easy to see them go; and I can only imagine how it must feel for them to be uprooted and move again in less than 6 months. However, this is what the courts have decreed; and so we hold onto hope that we will stay in touch and will see them again.

Our Men's Breakfast is currently studying the book of Job. In chapter one, Job hears of the loss of his livestock and children. One after another the blows keep coming as his servants in rapid succession bring Job the tragic news. Raiders have killed his oxen. Lightning has struck his sheep. More raiders have killed his camels; and then a great wind has collapsed the home of his eldest son killing all of his children. It was a horrific loss that would devastate anyone. The text says that in response Job tears his clothes and shaves his head as signs of his grief and sorrow. But then the text says Job fell on the ground and worshiped the Lord saying, "**The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord**" (Job 1:21).

Now, I understand the first part. "**The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away**". In so many areas of our lives we are completely powerless. The cancer strikes. Your car is rear ended because the other guy wasn't paying attention. The house floods while you're on vacation. The courts make a decree. None of it happens because you are negligent. Things just happen. Life happens; and it doesn't really matter whether the Lord caused it to happen or allowed it to happen. The end result is the same. "**The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away**".

What is far more difficult to understand in the face of this tragedy is the second part of Job's statement. "**Blessed be the name of the Lord**". We typically have no problem blessing the Lord when life has been good to us. A new baby is born. A baptism, confirmation, graduation. A new job, promotion, retirement. It is easy to bless the Lord and thank Him for all He has done for us.

But when tragedy strikes, how can Job bless the Lord? It seems so contradictory and counter-intuitive, not to mention incredibly difficult. Well, the only way is by focusing on the love and the promise of the Lord rather than the tragedy. Even when tragedy strikes, Job knows with all confidence that the Lord still loves him. He doesn't understand why things have happened as they did. He complains and demands answers from God; but in the midst of it all, Job continues to trust in the love of the Lord, so much so that in chapter 19 Job says, "For I know that my Redeemer lives, and at the last he will stand upon the earth. And after my skin has been thus destroyed, yet in my flesh I shall see God, whom I shall see for myself, and my eyes shall behold, and not another" (Job 19:25-27). Job clings to the love and the promise of the Lord. It was literally all he had; and yet it was enough.

While Job had the promise of the Lord, we have the fulfillment of that promise in Jesus Christ. His birth is the proof that God has not abandoned us. God is with us. He is our Emmanuel! His humiliation and suffering of the cross is the answer to how much God loves you. He will go to ANY lengths to redeem and save you. And His triumphant resurrection demonstrates His unequalled power to save. Through Jesus, I KNOW That My Redeemer Lives.

And so when tragedy strikes, we may not understand what is happening or why. We can mourn and cry out to the Lord in pain; and yet, through it all, we cling to the love of the Lord shown to us in Jesus Christ. Like Job, we can bless the name of the Lord because the Lord in Jesus Christ has blessed us.

Altar Flowers





Here is what is happening at the BOOKClub:

The next book on our list is <u>Martin Luther</u> <u>The Man Who Rediscovered God and</u> <u>Changed the World (ISBN 978-1101980019)</u> by Eric Metaxas. This book comes *HIGHLY* recommended by Gordon. The description reads:

From #1 New York Times bestselling author Eric Metaxas comes a brilliant and inspiring biography of the most influential man in modern history, Martin Luther.

On All Hallow's Eve in 1517, a young monk named Martin Luther posted a document he hoped would spark an academic debate, but that instead ignited a conflagration that would forever destroy the world he knew. Five hundred years after Luther's now famous Ninety-five Theses appeared, Eric Metaxas, acclaimed biographer of the bestselling Bonhoeffer: Pastor, Martyr, Prophet, Spy and Amazing Grace: William Wilberforce and the Heroic Campaign to End Slavery, paints a startling portrait of the wild figure whose adamantine faith cracked the edifice of



Western Christendom and dragged medieval Europe into the future. Written in riveting prose and impeccably researched, Martin Luther tells the searing tale of a humble man who, by bringing ugly truths to the highest seats of power, caused the explosion whose sound is still ringing in our ears. Luther's monumental faith and courage gave birth to the ideals of liberty, equality, and individualism that today lie at the heart of all modern life.

Mission work is...whiteboards!?



Four of us standing in front of a white board perfectly captures the substance of J.P.'s recent two trips to Kampot Province. These trips were the culmination of the Cambodia Lutheran Church's (CLC) program of intentional visitation (supported by the LCMS). Begun just over a year ago, the main component of the project was visitation to each and every congregation of the CLC, in order to build common identity, teach and distribute resources, and collect data for understanding the ground level situation of churches. This would provide a stable foundation for the CLC's strategic planning. Having completed all the visits and collected all the data, our visitation team sat down in March to begin understanding what the data was telling us. J.P. analyzed the data and created basic pie and bar graphs to visualize the results. J.P. led a discussion on each data point, from which we identified the CLC's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats. This resulted in over 65 points that filled three large whiteboards, far too much for the CLC to accomplish given its small size and modest resources. On his second trip in April, J.P. sought to help the CLC narrow down to 4-6 priorities (fitting on a single whiteboard!) that would guide the work of the CLC over the next 2-3 years. This step was difficult (because everything seems so important!), but after multiple rounds of discussion, and lots of writing and erasing on the whiteboard, 6 priorities naturally emerged as most critical. After nailing down our priorities, we discussed each of them to identify action steps that will help us to address it. Finally, we had a blueprint of the CLC's strategic plan! We'll share more about the content of the plan as it is formalized and publicized, but the story here is the importance of the process we went through. Due to internal challenges years ago, and COVID-19 in recent years, the CLC has struggled with a lack of momentum. This process of visitation \rightarrow data \rightarrow understanding \rightarrow priorities \rightarrow action helps the CLC to build momentum for service that is grounded in the real needs of church communities. J.P. was honored to facilitate this process! (And is now happy to be done with whiteboards for a while.)

Praises: for a <u>recent trip to Hanoi</u>, Vietnam, our first since departing 5+ years ago; for <u>fun opportunities</u> to bless Cambodian youth; for the completion of <u>two cohorts</u> of Small Catechism training; for a <u>meaningful Holy</u> <u>Week</u>; for the recent <u>visit of a friend</u> from Vietnam; for Aimee's recent trip to Hong Kong to support missionaries there.

Prayers: for the CLC's strategic planning efforts, that those plans would bear much fruit for the Gospel in Cambodia; for the kids as they finish the school year; for our home service planning and travel; for a time of separation as J.P. travels to the U.S. before the rest of the family.
