It always surprises me when I'm teaching a class and someone says, "I remember a sermon when you once said....." It is incredibly humbling; and yet surprising. By the very nature of my week to week schedule, on Monday morning I don't remember much of what was said on Sunday. I'm already moving on to the next sermon and Bible class.

It brings to mind a story I once heard. There was a gentleman in England who was tired of going to church and, in particular, having to sit through long and boring sermons. So one day he wrote into the local newspaper expressing his frustration. "I don't see the point in going to church anymore. I have attended worship services faithfully for over twenty years, and I can't remember a single sermon that was so tremendous or spectacular, that it has stuck in my head. The whole experience just doesn't seem worth my time and effort anymore." Well, over the following weeks, there were a few replies to the editorial, most of which agreed with the gentleman's sentiments. That is, until one such reply appeared in the editorials. The response said, "Sir, I certainly understand your grievances. However, I have eaten my wife's cooking every evening for the past 30 years. In that time I can't remember any special dinner that was so tremendous or spectacular that it stands out in my mind. And yet, I know that if I had not eaten them, I would surely have died."

Once again, I am truly humbled when someone thinks something I have said is worth pondering and remembering. It is one of the highest compliments I could possibly receive. And yet, the practice of coming to worship each week is less about hearing something "tremendous or spectacular" than it is being fed by God's Word and Sacraments so that you are refreshed and strengthened to face the world and all its temptations in the coming week. The writer of Hebrews likewise encourages us writing, "Let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." (Hebrews 10:24-25).

I know that summer is a busy time for families with many of us travelling. However, I would encourage you, when Sunday rolls around again, whether you are in Cañon or not, find a church (preferably LCMS) and be fed by God's word and sacraments. It is only HIS Word that will refresh you and prepare you for whatever whatever the coming week may bring. Enjoy your summer!







Five hundred years after Luther's now famous Ninety-five Theses appeared, Eric Metaxas, acclaimed biographer of the bestselling Bonhoeffer: Pastor, Martyr, Prophet, Spy and Amazing Grace: William Wilberforce and the Heroic Campaign to End Slavery, paints a startling portrait of the wild figure whose adamantine faith cracked the edifice of


This spring, Aimee visited Hong Kong and Macau to spend time with two LCMS missionaries she cares for as Mercy Manager for the Asia region. It was a valuable visit, providing insight that can never be gained from reading reports or Zoom meetings! In addition to working with local partners, planning the family gathering and opportunities for continuing education for the whole region, Aimee provides one-on-one support to four missionaries on the team.

The first few days Aimee attempted to keep up with <u>Deaconess Carol Halter</u>'s busy schedule: providing care to shut-ins, sharing with an LWML group from the United States, meeting local friends for meals, sharing the Gospel, and learning about the history of the LCMS' mission in Asia. For more than 40 years, Dcs. Halter has been training Sunday school teachers, proclaiming the Gospel alongside partner church members, and caring for marginalized people. Meredith (pictured top left), a 92-year-old woman we visited in a government nursing home said, "The snacks that she brings me are nice, but time spent with Carol is essential!"

After 4 days in Hong Kong, Dcs. Halter and Aimee traveled to Macau to visit with alliance missionary Pastor Michael Wu (pictured bottom left). Together they visited the Concordia School for Special Education (CSSE), where Pastor Wu leads chapel and youth group. CSSE was founded around 40 years ago and serves local families in Macau. Over 180 special-needs students currently receive services from the school. While in Macau, Aimee met a young woman named Debbe. She first heard the gospel from LCMS missionaries at CSSE, where her brother attended. As a teenager, she fled her abusive mother and got involved with a casino-based mafia group and started using drugs. Many years later, Dcs. Halter encouraged her to remember her baptism and turn from her dangerous lifestyle. Praise God, Debbie repented and returned to faith. This past Easter she joyfully celebrated her 16th baptismal birthday.

Aimee finds immense joy in supporting and advocating for missionaries like Dcs. Halter and Pastor Wu, so that they can continue to do the life-changing work God has called them to do!
