#### Pastor's Message: Don't Talk About Religion or Politics

No doubt that is the advice that your parents gave you when you were younger. When going to a party or a corporate event or even a family gathering, one way to avoid arguments is not to talk about beliefs that others hold very strongly and that may differ from your very strongly held beliefs. Broaching these subjects seems like an accident waiting to happen; and I would suspect that your parents' sage advice has saved countless relationships.

Lately I have also heard the argument that the lack of discussion around religion and politics has created a culture that is largely ignorant about both. Not only that, but we then surround ourselves with like-minded people, never learn how to listen to, evaluate, and civilly disagree with one another.

St. Paul gives us some guidelines in Romans 14. Throughout the chapter he is discussing issues that are adiaphora (things that are neither commanded nor forbidden in Scripture). He uses issues of eating meat and days of worship as examples; and his conclusion is that it doesn't really matter. Eat meat or don't. Worship on Sunday or Tuesday. These are issues of Christian freedom, and each person "should be fully convinced in his own mind" (14:5). In other words, know why you hold the position you do, but love and respect your neighbor enough to let him disagree with you. If you find freedom on an issue, don't flaunt it; and if you are strict on another issue, don't expect others to be strict like you.

And then the guiding principle is found in verses 7 & 8. "For none of us lives to himself, and none of us dies to himself. For if we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord." So, the one thing that trumps all of the issues is Christ: His love and His sacrifice. Hold the Lord above everything else and know that he loves your neighbor too!

In just a few days I will leave for the 68<sup>th</sup> synodical convention of the LCMS in Milwaukee which runs from July 29<sup>th</sup>through August 3<sup>rd</sup>. In contrast to your parents' advice, this might be considered the very worst of all situations - a week dedicated to both religion and politics. But among the very strongly held beliefs of both pastors and laymen alike, I have hope that Christ will be exalted above all. He is the common ground that unites us all.

Please pray for me; and I will give you a full report when I return.

- Assist me in taking down music, turning pages, and/or being my prompter during communion, so I get the music timed just right. You DO NOT need to read music. (Angela Bellantoni has offered to do this, but will occasionally need a substitute).
- Work with me before service (I arrive 1 ½ hours before service starts for my final run through) to review hymn melodies that aren't familiar and then sing out during service to support others until they become more familiar with the tune. I would let you know in advance when this type of hymn will be sung.
- A computer savvy person who can occasionally create timed slide shows, like was done for this past Good Friday and Easter services.

Alana has been my right-hand support in my role as music director for the past four years. She will be missed immensely for many reasons. However, this educational opportunity will allow her to share her God-given talents of teaching, music, leadership, singing, artistic and listening skills and a personality of befriending anyone in need, plus a giver of 'great hugs' as I was told recently. 

What our worship is like (the liturgy, hymns, prayers, creeds, Sacraments),


Where we worship (St. John at Field and Central),



The next book on our list is <u>You are What</u> <u>You Love</u> (ISBN 978-1587433801) by James K. A. Smith. This book was recommended by a speaker Lyle and I heard this past spring. The description reads:

You are what you love. But you might not love what you think.

In this book, award-winning author James K. A. Smith shows that who and what we worship fundamentally shape our hearts. And while we desire to shape culture, we are not often aware of how culture shapes us. We might not realize the ways our hearts are being taught to love rival gods instead of the One for whom we were made. Smith helps readers recognize the formative power of culture and the transformative possibilities of Christian practices. He explains that worship is the "imagination station" that incubates our loves and longings so that our cultural endeavors are indexed toward God and his kingdom. This is why the church and worshiping in a local community of believers should be the hub and heart of Christian formation and discipleship.



The author creatively uses film, literature, and music illustrations to engage readers and includes material on marriage, family, youth ministry, and faith and work. He also suggests individual and communal practices for shaping the Christian life.


