#### Pastor's Message: Reconciliation

This past spring I was enrolled in a 5 week course on coaching individuals through conflict. It was insightful to learn how to help people discover their own idols and things that keep them from resolving their conflicts with others.

Subsequently, this fall I was enrolled in another 5 week course on mediating disputes between parties, which builds upon the work done coaching each side of a dispute and then working with them together to not only resolve their issues, but find true reconciliation in their relationship.

As you might expect, the focus of the discussions usually centers on the self. Individuals in conflict are usually frustrated with someone else, at what they have done, and how they need to be corrected. The feeling and emotion that drives the conflict is the expectation that they are wrong and there can be peace when they acknowledge their error and correct their behavior.

However, almost without fail, the solution to our conflicts is not in the other, but within ourselves. As I've learned the key to reconciliation is Confession and Absolution – not *theirs* but mine. We have all participated in whatever conflict we are involved in. To say we are innocent would be to go against what God tells us in 1 John 1:8, "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us." And there is no point in trying to figure out whose sin or fault is greater. That's an empty and vain discussion. Far better is to confess what we have done, first against God and then the other person, and sincerely ask for forgiveness. "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1Jn 1:9).

What's truly amazing, is that when we stop attacking others, their defenses typically go down and then they become open to acknowledging and confessing their part in the conflict. Suddenly, you find yourself on a path, not just to conflict resolution, but genuine reconciliation; not just solving a disagreement, but fixing and repairing a relationship.

I have truly enjoyed my two classes this year...and although I am certainly not ready or experienced

enough to solve major disputes, I can see the path forward and how reconciliation can happen, both in my own life and in the life of the church...and that is truly exciting.

1 John Chapter 1: 8 If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. 9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

#### **Pedal Point Tension**

Pedal point is a term that describes when there is one pedal note played. For those who are familiar with music, the pedal point is usually the primary note of the key that the hymn is written. For example, if the hymn key signature has two sharps, the hymn is usually in the key of D; the pedal point would then be a low D.

Why am I explaining this? This is one technique that I use for alternate harmonization. The unique aspect of this technique is that when only playing one note for a pedal, the listener will feel a sense of tension, a wanting of the pedal note to change or resolve. This technique is best used to highlight the text where there is a major change in its tenor; moving from reflective or threatening


to exclamatory or the text develops from a reflection of sin to the promise of salvation.

The hymn, **A Mighty Fortress** is one of my favorites to use this pedal point technique, but with a twist. The third stanza is "Though hordes of devils fill the land All threatening to devour us, We tremble not, unmoved we stand; They cannot overpow'r us. Let this world's tyrant rage; In battle we'll engage. His might is doomed to fail, God's judgment must prevail! One little word subdues him.

This hymn is in the key of C, no sharps or flats, so the pedal point would be the lowest C note on the pedal board. The pedal point starts at the beginning of the stanza, with words "Though hordes of devils..." threatening to devour us"; this is frightening verbiage. But in the second line, the tenor of the words turns from frightening to victorious "We tremble not, unmoved we stand; They cannot overpow'r us." The pedal point ceases and moves to playing the bass line of the hymn, relieving the tension and lifting up the power of the hymn.

The twist of this hymns pedal point is that there is a side-by-side pedal point, as I play the low C and the D right next to it. You will hear a very low rumble, that seems to not fit. Be assured I'm not playing a wrong note and forgetting about it but doing this deliberately. Last year, when I played these two pedal notes, I noticed that several of the children sitting close to the back of the church literally turned around and looked up at the organ speakers. This is exactly what my intent is....something that makes you stop and consider, what would a hoard of devils sound like.

We are entering a powerful part of the 'green' season where the church recognizes that it is under the threat of the devil yet vocalizes with assuredness of faith when we sing "The Church's One Foundation" and the steadfastness of the grace of our God with "By Grace I'm Saved, Grace Free and Boundless". Besides the obvious High Festival Seasons of Christmas and Easter, these upcoming two months are my favorites for powerful hymns. I can't wait to hear all the powerful singing of the voices at St. John.

With the onset of cooler evenings, shorter days and the smell of autumn, comes the hubbub of our children's return to school and the very rewarding task of preparing the bounty of diligent, summer long efforts for gardeners; fruits and vegetables from our gardens. Whether the fruits of our labor are canned, pickled, jellied, pureed or frozen, those of us who process our garden rewards find it back breaking, exhausting but oh so fulfilling when our pantries are lined with colorful jars and our freezers are stacked with frosty containers.

Canning fruits and vegetables are a task from the heart. The contents of each jar is carefully selected, washed thoroughly (sometimes in washing machines), pared to the perfect size, trimmed to remove any imperfection, cooked, pickled or soaked. The containers are checked for cracks and chips, and bathed in scorching hot water to sanitize. The final jar is inspected for the perfect seal, personally labeled and ready to share or line our pantries.





The memorial service was a joyful celebration of Dad's life as husband, father, friend—and so much more—all with a deep faith in Jesus that has now carried him to eternal life. The rest of the summer included an aggressive schedule of church visits across the United States. We met so many people who are passionate about God's global mission! To be able to shake hands, discuss, celebrate, and pray with those who support our family is an immeasurable blessing.

Upon returning to Cambodia, we've been busy. The kids have started a new school year, while J.P. and Aimee have continued key initiatives begun earlier in the year. As a regional manager, Aimee continues to work with missionaries in Hong Kong and Macau (where she traveled in April), as well as Papua New Guinea. Locally, she also continues to advise Concordia Welfare and Education's development projects. J.P. continues to work with the Cambodia Lutheran Church to implement priorities identified during the spring's strategic planning, itself the culmination of a year-long visitation program. Specifically, the CLC has asked J.P. to expand training in Luther's Small Catechism (which he had already implemented in two locations) to five other strategic locations throughout the country.
