Pastor's Message: All Saints' Day

With All Saints' Sunday on November 5th, I thought I'd give you some history and background on this Feast Day. The following comes from Celebrating the Saints by William Weedon (2016). Enjoy.

With overflowing joy, the Church of Jesus Christ celebrates the Feast of All Saints' Day.

For all the saints who from their labors rest,
Who Thee by faith before the world confessed,
Thy name, O Jesus, be forever blest.
Alleluia! Alleluia!
O blest communion, fellowship divine,
We feebly struggle, they in glory shine;
Yet all are one in Thee, for all are Thine.
Alleluia! Alleluia! (LSB 677: 1, 4)

The Feast of All Saints' is one of the principal feasts of Christ. Many congregations observe the custom of transferring it to the first Sunday in November each year so that a maximal number of people may join in its joyful celebration.

All Saints' was originally observed in the West as All Martyrs' in the spring. Since the number of those who have laid down their lives in the confession of Christ far outnumbers the days available in the Church's yearly round, All Martyrs' served as a sort of catchall. Pope Gregory III, bishop of Rome from AD 731 to 741, expanded the feast further to embrace all saints and ordered it observed on November 1. A similar Feast of All Saints, is observed in the Easter Church calendar on the Sunday following Pentecost.

The joy of this particular feast is in its celebration of the unity of the Church Triumphant (the saints gathered already into rest) and the Church Militant (the present and future Church that struggles still under daily crosses). Together, both constitute but one communion, one fellowship.

They are the crowd glimpsed in the reading from Revelation for this day, a vast multitude beyond human numbering and calculation. What makes them one is what they have received from the Lord: They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. Their sins are forgiven and they hold the palm of victory He has placed in their hand.

If you look at the crowd, you can readily discern that some were among earth's famous and powerful. Most were quite unknown to history. There are some black, some white, and every color of flesh of humanity. Some were very wealthy upon earth; most quite poor. Some spoke this language, others that. They come from every nation and tribe. What is most captivating about them, however, isn't their diversity; it's the unity of their attention. They aren't paying the last bit of attention to themselves. They are united in their gaze upon the Lamb on His throne, the Lord Jesus Christ victorious in His sacrifice of love. And therein lies the secret to becoming part of that crowd. You do so not by squeezing in and trying to imitate the look of astonishment and awe upon their faces. Rather you share their blessedness by joining in what they are so fixed upon: Jesus Christ, who humbled Himself to become what they were (a child of man) in order to lift them up to become what He is (children of God).

Almighty and everlasting God, You knit together Your faithful people of all times and places into one holy communion, the mystical Body of Your Son, Jesus Christ. Grant us so to follow Your blessed saints in all virtuous and godly living that, together with them, we may come to the unspeakable joys You have prepared for those who love You; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Here is the latest thank you letter and update from the Cañon City Pregnancy Center. (St. John is a long-term supporter). I will contact the director and for an update on their medical transition.

Julie Barrett, Missions

Dear St. John Lutheran Church,

Thank you so much for your gift to the center, and your amazing faithfulness in serving families in our community! I believe that it can be very helpful to see the fruits of our labor, and at this point in the year, it's good to do a small check-in on our impact on the community. Because of your faithfulness, as of August 1st:

342 client families have been served so far this year. 80 of those clients are new, and 39 of those new clients are under the age of 19. The under-19 age bracket is very impactful to me as I have a home full of teenagers. We look at the faces of these brave young people, and I can see the faces of my own children. Even though we've already seen 342 families walk through the doors, the staff and volunteers at the center would still be here if there was only 1 person needing help. Because every single life matters. The center has provided 21,150 diapers and 252 cans of formula, and including all material services- furniture, clothing, equipment, etc., 45,074 items have gone to homes of families in need.

On a separate note, I would be so honored to be able to meet with a member of your staff and bring the church up to date on where we are in the medical transition. If this is a possibility, please let me know. I am at your service.

Thank you for choosing to be part of this mission field. Thank you for choosing to be part of the greater good. Lives will forever be changed because of your kindness. Blessings,





Reformation Potluck: Sunday, October 29th



Alana's Letter from Concordia - St. Paul: Seeing Red

When I moved to Colorado, I was asked quite frequently "what do you miss most about New York"? My go-to answer was often "the green". In Honeoye Falls, the rain, snow, and humidity were givens. There was moisture when it was needed. Sure, summers often saw plants drying due to a lack of rain. But the rain always came. Spring and Fall were times of color.

Spring showed you lupine and phlox in the ditches, lilac bushes EVERYWHERE, and flowering Apple, Dogwood, Crab Apple, and ornamental trees were common. Fall brought the colors of the sunset. Maples and Sumac turned violent red. Boxelder and Sycamore flamed orange, while Basswood and Honey Locust covered the ground in yellow. Traveling to places like Letchworth Gorge and the Adirondacks specifically see the fall colors was common, while gardens and flowerbeds were cultivated in every front yard to decorate with spring blooms.

And as a constant, underlying all seasons of color, was the green. The grass was green and needed to be mowed weekly (if not more frequently in the spring). You couldn't see your neighbors' house hidden behind a wall of green trees and bushes. Then I moved to Colorado. And I complained. I wanted the same thing I had before, that I had gotten used to.

Over the last five years, I came to see the beauty in Colorado. The red rocks in counterpoint to the blue-green cedars and juniper. The all-pervasive BLUE that is the Colorado sky, adding interest to the browns, reds, and greens. Of course, fall shows us the brilliant yellow and white of the Aspen, and the evergreen nature of the pines and cedars.

Last week I had the opportunity to go hiking with a friend in Afton State Park here in Minnesota to see the fall colors. I found that I have missed the reds of Maples and Oaks from my childhood. But I also long for the everpresent mountains always in the corner of my eye. The rapidly changing landscape that a 15-minute drive through Canon City or Colorado Springs can bring you.

I realize now that the one thing that does not change is the beauty of creation all around me. God creates trees and vegetation on the third day. "The earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed according to their own kinds, and trees bearing fruit in which is their seed, each according to its kind. And God saw that it was good" (Genesis 1:12). No matter what the plants around us look like, there is beauty and intentionality. God made it and it was good. Take the time to walk in God's creation, and behold all He has made for us.



Here is what is happening at the BOOKClub:


