

#### Pastor's Message: Honest Repentance

This Lenten season, our sermon series will focus on the theme of repentance. Here is a brief description of the series:

Each sermon will explore the biblical text with other parts of Scripture and Lutheran doctrine to sketch a picture of what repentance looks like in the Christian life. Repentance starts with being honest before God and ourselves about who we are. When it comes to sin, everyone has a natural impulse to hide, but repentance means finding the courage to be honest. It also means having faith in the promise of forgiveness. But being honest about faith means recognizing that faith is contested on many sides not only by society, but by our own



experiences, and sometimes even by the actions of God himself. Finally, repentance means becoming more human, not less. Because our thoughts, desires, and actions are so linked with sin, it is easy to view repentance as fighting against our humanity as if holiness meant trying to stifle as many of our natural human impulses as possible. But honest repentance recognizes that sin is the thing that stifles our humanity, while repentance results in our natural impulses functioning more as God designed them.

#### Make a Joyful Noise

"Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises!" Psalm 98:4

I have a few favorite bible verses and phrases that make me smile every time I hear them. Paul's catchphrase of "by no means!" and the angel's ever-present "fear not". Combined with "make a joyful noise to the LORD", all three of them bear specific imagery for me. Paul's phrase reminds me of a lawyer suddenly slamming their hand on the table yelling "OF COURSE NOT!" It's a break of the eloquent speech that normally defines Paul's letters, and now that the picture is in my head, I cannot read his statements in any other voice.

The angel's phrase of "fear not" takes a bit more back story. My parents have a nativity set that we set up most Christmases that is all snowmen. There's Mary, Joseph, little Baby Jesus held in Mary's arms and an angel. The angel is suspended from a wire stretched between two snow-covered pine trees and looks more like a snowman in an angel costume than an actual angel. And held between his hands is a sign bearing the words "fear not". For whatever reason, the simplicity and adorableness make it stick in my mind. Whenever I hear the angels tell someone to "have no fear", I picture the snowman hanging by a wire in a costume proclaiming "fear not".

Finally, Psalm 98 tells us to "make a joyful noise". What is a joyful noise? Notice it doesn't say 'sing a perfect song' or 'play a beautiful symphony'. It's a noise. Joyful, happy, carefree noise. I tend to picture a toddler regaling mom and dad in the living room with the song they just made up on the spot about pancakes. The little one is clearly exuberant about the masterpiece they just performed. And mom and dad just sit back and lovingly smile. Because their child felt it was important to share this piece of joy with them. A 'joyful noise', to me, is a toddler happily singing about pancakes.

Let us go about our daily routines with this same mindset. That "whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him" (Colossians 3:17). We don't have to be the best, or do things perfectly. God loves us, no matter what joyful noise we make to Him.

As many of you may remember, I am a member of Christus Chorus here at CSP. Coming up this spring, we will be touring through a few states and performing for about a week. On Tuesday March 19<sup>th</sup>, we will be performing somewhere in Lincoln, Nebraska. Our choir director Paul von Kampen is completing his doctorate and will be

using our tour performance as a final for his doctoral program. I am unsure which specific church we will be performing at, but I wanted to put that date on your radar. My parents will be traveling out to view the concert and have room to take four (4) more people with them, barring bad weather. If you are interested, please speak to Lori or Kris Holt sometime between now and then to plan specifics.

Another update for you all is that last semester I made the Dean's List for academic excellence. I received all A's in my four classes, and currently have a 4.0 GPA. 

**We Welcome All** in the name of Jesus Christ. Thank you for blessing us with your presence at worship. Please sign our guestbook, and take a visitor packet.



Here is what is happening at the BOOKClub:

The next book on our list is <u>The Color of Compromise: The Truth about the</u> <u>American Church's Complicity in Racism</u> (ISBN 978-0310113607) by Jemar Tisby. This book is highly recommended by our district president Rev. Maxwell; and after discussing the anti-semitism of WWII, we will now consider the racism a bit closer to home. The description reads:



The Color of Compromise is both enlightening and compelling, telling a history we either ignore or just don't know. Equal parts painful and inspirational, it details how the American church has helped create and maintain racist ideas and practices. You will be guided in thinking through concrete solutions for improved race relations and a racially inclusive church.

The Color of Compromise:

- Takes you on a historical, sociological, and religious journey: from America's early colonial days through slavery and the Civil War
- Covers the tragedy of Jim Crow laws, the victories of the Civil Rights era, and the strides of today's Black Lives Matter movement
- Reveals the cultural and institutional tables we have to flip in order to bring about meaningful integration
- Charts a path forward to replace established patterns and systems of complicity with bold, courageous, immediate action

The Color of Compromise is not a call to shame or a platform to blame white evangelical Christians. It is a call from a place of love and desire to fight for a more racially unified church that no longer compromises what the Bible teaches about human dignity and equality. A call that challenges black and white Christians alike to standup now and begin implementing the concrete ways Tisby

outlines, all for a more equitable and inclusive environment among God's people. Starting today.
