


Choir:

Were Christ not arisen, Then death were still our prison. Now, with Him to life restored, We praise the Father of our Lord. Alleluia!



Now I would remind you, brothers, of the


- gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain.

Epistle Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:1–11 that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me.

Epistle Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:1–11 For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. 




for trembling and astonishment had seized them, and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.
